
3 November 2014: Pacific Ocean - Tropical Cyclone NURI





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SITUATION

- Tropical Cyclone **NURI** (named PAENG in the Philippines) formed in the north-west Pacific Ocean on 31 October and has been moving over open waters since.
- On 3 November, 6.00 UTC, it was a very intense Typhoon with maximum sustained wind speed of 286 km/h. Its centre was located within the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR), approximately 1 120 km east of the northernmost tip of Luzon island.
- Over the next 48h, NURI is forecast to move north-east over open waters, exiting the PAR and remaining a very intense Typhoon. As of 3 November, there are no watches or warnings in effect, either by Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) or by Japan Meteorological Agency (JMA).
