PRIOR to the time our country went into the world struggle to help make the world a safe place for free peoples, the ruling passion of his life had always been baseball. For years he thought and dreamed baseball, but, like every other good American citizen, when he realized that America was going to fight even baseball had to take second place, as his foremost thought was how he, in spite of his years, could "do his bit" for his country.

Birth of "Ball and Bat Fund"

Naturally, as he puzzled over his personal problem, patriotism and baseball were jumbled up in his thoughts, but gradually he began to realize that baseball, owing so much to the army, now had a chance to pay. From its very start baseball has been indebted to the army, from our earliest wars on down. Wherever our army has gone baseball has gone and taken root and grown. The only question was how best to pay.

Thus was the "Ball and Bat Fund" conceived, for out of this problem came the idea, the plan to furnish all of "our boys" over there, here in camp, or wherever they were, with baseball outfits, realizing full well that the fans of America would respond willingly and eagerly and make the success of the plan certain.

First in the Field

At this time, early in April, just after the United States entered the war, there were no agencies to provide entertainment and recreation for the soldiers and sailors. None of the training camp activities nor other agencies which later did such good work among the soldiers were in existence and there was a crying need for speedy action.

The "Ball and Bat Fund" was the pioneer among all the war agencies originated to provide our fighting men with opportunity for recreation. Believing that there is nothing so good as baseball for wholesome recreation, promoting as it does a mental stimulus with its demand for quick thinking and immediate decisions, as well as providing ideal muscular exercise, I feel that we who created and operated the fund have had a small part in helping to make our armies the fittest and best the world has ever known.

With our army in a few months expanding from a few thousand to several million, the work of supplying "all comers" with outfits proved a stupendous task, but it is our proud record that no authorized request from any unit of the army or navy was turned down.

In addition to that feeling of duty well done, neither Mr. Griffith nor Mr. Genslinger wanted any recognition of the work done except the appreciation of the recipients. This we had, as is attested by the thousands of letters of thanks, which showed the keen appreciation and the dependence the men put upon our pledge to supply them with outfits.

But above all in my mind is a feeling of gratitude to the thousands of baseball fans in every corner of the globe who so readily responded to our appeal and made possible the complete success of the "Ball and Bat Fund." Every appeal met with generous response, and one incident of the drive illustrates vividly the spirit of accomplishment that inspires the American people.

Early in the history of the fund a huge shipment—our first—went to the bottom of the ocean on the ill-fated "Kansan." Hardly had the news become noised around, and before we could make another appeal, letters began pouring in, the writers offering to contribute again and urging us to give them all a chance. This was the spirit that enabled America to surmount all difficulties and prove the deciding factor in the world war.

When Mr. Clark C. Griffith brought his idea of a Ball and Bat Fund to the attention of Mr. Genslinger, with the request that he assume the burden of managing and directing this great benevolent and philanthropic purpose, he gladly accepted the work as a patriotic duty and a service of love.

Mr. Genslinger is well known as the "Father of the Southern League" and an executive of marked ability in baseball and other athletic and commercial enterprises. His dominant spirit and genius for organization foreshadowed the subsequent success of the enterprise. His control of men and affairs is always complete and masterful, yet with all he possesses the very rare faculty of welding all interests with harmony and concord so that all identified with him become as loyal to the common cause as himself.

Manufacturers of baseball could not have purchased with millions of dollars and years of time such a vast demand for the goods with which this great game shall be perpetuated and at the same time spread abroad a mighty influence of self-reliance, initiative, quick decision and acceptance of arbitration according to rules of fair play if not righteousness as exemplified among our own people to so marked a degree to become a general comment and accepted fact.

Baseball is wholesome, clean and physically, mentally and spiritually helpful. This is Mr. Genslinger's thought and tribute to baseball and the Clark C. Griffith Ball and Bat Fund.

In accordance with your instructions, we have audited the books of the "Clark C. Griffith Ball and Bat Fund," containing the records of receipts and disbursements from the commencement on April 20, 1917, to March 1, 1919. As requested, we submit the results in two periods, viz., April 20, 1917, to July 15, 1918, and July 16, 1918, to March 1, 1919.

During the first period the cash received records of the Fund were not complete and in attempting to balance these with the amount deposited in the bank we found that the latter exceeded the amount entered on the records by the sum of \$3,787.32. During the second period donations as received were daily listed on the books and balanced with the amount of the deposit.

In addition to the cash received, the records of the second period show that baseball material, valued at \$541.50 was donated and distributed. For the first period, however, no record was kept of any such donations.

Base Ball Equipment, \$95,104.41. This represents the cost of base ball outfits purchased by the Ball and Bat Fund and shipped to various concentration camps throughout the United States, and includes base ball outfits sent to the American Expeditionary Force in France. Each outfit consists of the following:

- 1 Catcher's Mask
- 1 Catcher's Protector
- 1 Catcher's Mitt
- 1 First Baseman's Mitt
- 12 Balls
- 3 Bats
- 3 Bases

We have examined the invoices of reputable sporting goods concerns for each outfit purchased by the Fund. Upon this invoice has been stated the company or branch of the service to which the shipment is made and in many instances the letter from the soldier or sailor making the request.

Foot Ball, Boxing Gloves, "Sporting News" and "Base Ball Magazine," \$2,068.49. The following is the distribution of this account:

The items of "Sporting News" and "Baseball Magazine" represent the distribution of these athletic journals to the boys in the American Expeditionary Forces.

Stationery, Printing and Advertising Matter, \$22,503.55. We have seen invoices from publishing companies totalling this amount for letter circulars, coin envelopes, subscription blanks, posters, "Proclamation," Barber booklets, Honor cards, Miner circulars, etc.

Postage, \$10,632.99. The checks given in payment for the Stamp Account have the endorsement of the Postmaster at Washington, D. C.

Office Furniture and Fixtures, \$705.80. This represents the actual cost of equipment purchased for the office.

Office Clerical Salaries, \$10,029.94. This amount has been expended for clerical assistants and does not include any administrative expense. The services of **Mr. Clark C. Griffith** and **Mr. Charles H. Genslinger** are given gratuitously in promoting the interests of the Fund.

Rent, \$401.00; Telephone and Telegraph, \$337.73. We are informed these expenses had been paid by the "Washington Athletic Club" until such time as the promoters of the "Ball and Bat Fund" were in a financial position to assume the obligations.

Office Supplies and Expenses, \$1,937.51. Included in this figure is an allowance of \$50.00 per week for the period January 1 to July 15, 1918, made to the Executive Secretary on the authorization of Mr. Griffith for entertaining and sundry office expenses. Beginning with the period July 16, 1918, all sundry office expenses were paid by the Executive Secretary, and a check issued in payment from time to time upon submission of an itemized statement of expenditures.

Traveling Expense, \$2,187.30. This amount has been paid to the promoters for traveling throughout the country to attend benefit games for the Fund.

Freight and Express, \$730.17. This represents the expense incurred by the sporting goods concerns in sending the base ball outfits to the various concentration camps.

Cash in Bank, \$1,059.02. We have obtained a certificate from the Union Savings Bank, Washington, D. C., in connection with the balance on hand, which we have reconciled with the foregoing amount.

Materials and Supplies, \$3,418.07. In addition to the cash on hand there was a balance of equipment, etc., postage and receivables, at March 1, 1919, as follows:

The receiver's certificate for \$1,215.00 included above, was issued by the receiver of the Northern State Bank of Gary, Indiana, and represents 90% of the amount of a check drawn on that Bank in payment of contributions made by the citizens of Gary, Indiana, amounting to \$1,350.00. The Bank failed previous to the collection of the check. The International Trust & Savings Bank of Gary, Indiana, has taken over the assets and liabilities of the Northern State Bank and has called for payment all outstanding receivers' certificates.

GENERAL

We have received a certificate from the Executive Secretary that all known liabilities, both direct and contingent, of the Fund have been disclosed to us. In addition, we have obtained letters from the various sporting goods concerns to the effect that the account of the Ball and Bat Fund is in balance.



Dear Mr. Genslinger:

Hope you have not thought that I have forgotten to acknowledge such a wonderful gift as the ball and bat outfit you so kindly sent my squadron. Due to an incorrect address (71st, instead of 471st), the goods have just arrived here. The outfit has come at just the right time, however, as we had been able to secure enough supplies from the Red Cross for us to "carry on." Have just received notice that they were unable to secure any more baseball equipment, so the Clark Griffith Fund has again made the boys happy.

I have explained to the squadron that the barbers of the United States furnished the money, and I feel sure that each man will write to his barber in appreciation.

I cannot adequately express my feelings upon the receipt of your gift. It is a wonderfully patriotic movement and tremendously appreciated by the men of the A. E. F.

Personally I shall look forward with great pleasure to making your acquaintance on my return to the States. As my father was President of the Phillies at one time, I feel intimately associated with our national game.

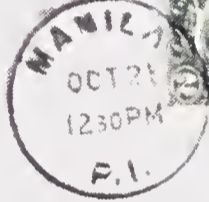

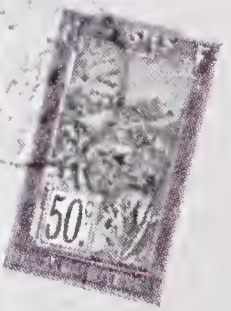
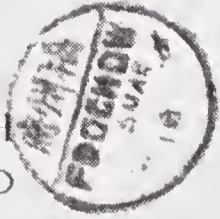
