ROAD VEHICLES. Heavy Motor Car.

ORDER MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903,* SECTION 12.

1923. No. 15.

To the County Councils of the several Administrative Counties in Northern Ireland;

To the Councils of the several County Boroughs in Northern Ireland;

To the Urban District Councils of the several Urban County Districts in Northern Ireland;

And to all others whom it may concern:

WHEREAS by the Heavy Motor Car (Ireland) (Amendment) Order, 1919, made by the Local Government Board for Ireland in pursuance of the provisions of section 12 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it was ordered amongst other matters that every heavy motor car used on any highway should be fitted with a device so constructed and fixed and of such a character as would prevent mud or water being thrown by such heavy motor car upon any person or property or upon any other vehicles:

AND WHEREAS in Northern Ireland the Irish Services in connection with roads, and road transport (excluding railways) are now vested in the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland:

AND WHEREAS it is expedient that the operation of the aforesaid should be suspended:

NOW THEREFORE the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland in exercise of all powers in that behalf enabling it hereby orders and directs, that as from the date of this Order, the Heavy Motor Car (Ireland) (Amendment) Order, 1919, shall unless and until the said Ministry otherwise orders and directs cease to have effect.

Given under the Seal of the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland this fifteenth day of March, in the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-three.
