Latest U. S. Postal Regulations.

There are four classes of mail matter, as follows:-

32 I I E E a FIRST CLASS .- This class includes letters, postal eards, sealed packages, all matter wholly or partly in writing (whether manuscript or preduced by typewriter copying press) drawings and paintings produced by hand, manuscript for publication not aceompanied by proof sheets, and all personal correspondence, whether in writing or in print. The rate is 2°, for each ownee or fraction thereof, excepting postal eards and letters for local delivery posted at an office where no letter-carriers are employed, which are 1e. per onnee or fraction thereof.

SECOND CLASS .- This class includes newspapers and unbound periodical publications regularly issued not less than four times a year. Rate, 1c. per pound when mailed by its publisher or a news agent, but if mailed by others 1c. for 4 ounces or fraction thereof.

THIRD CLASS .- This class includes books, photographs, blauk checks, drafts, deeds, policies and similar blank forms, proof-sheets etc. Rate 1e, for 2 oz.

FOURTH CLASS .- This class includes all articles not embraced in preceding classes, not liable by their form or nature to injure other articles in the mail or harm the persons employed in the mail service. Rate 1e, per oz. Limit of weight 4 pounds. alialis[igi:alia[iaiiaiiaiiaiiaiigiiaii






