SECTION II



Kelly Field initiated its first advanced training program in January, 1918. This program produced the flying personnel who conducted the training schools for the Army Air Corps.

After four years of personnel production the advanced schools were re-organized on a "specialized group" basis with the formation of Pursuit, Observation, Attack and Bombardment Training Sections. This plan was employed for seventeen years.

In 1939, Kelly Field was again re-organized, this time into four sections, each giving approximately the same general training.

Each section was sub-divided into two echelons of ten flight each. Only two sections fly at a time and always one-third of the field is reserved for Operations and the Navigation School.

This is our present organization, and to our rapidly-expanding Air Forces, Kelly Field contributes 200 pilots every five weeks.

In 1922 Section II, a tactical Observation Squadron for specialized training of observation pilots, began training at Kelly Field. Training planes of the squadron were the Douglas O-25 and the Thomas-Morse O-19.

The personnel of the squadron was small then, with only five instructors and twenty students. Training included "puff-target" missions—observing the location of hits and relaying the information to headquarters by radio. Each class spent two week directing artillery of

Fort Sam Houston, during which time they flew to Camp Bullis at dawn to adjust the ground firing of the 37's and 75's.

The students were sent on regular reconnaissance missions with assignments to sketch important railroads, bridges and other important objectives.



At the close of the course each student photographed an assigned area and made a mosaic map from his overlapping photographs.

Of that squadron's personnel, Lt. B. A. Mason, Jr., is still with Section II as Section Operations Officer.

SECTION IV



Section Four at the Kelly Field Advanced Flying School began training bombardment pilots in 1922.

After eight months of preliminary training, which combined primary and basic, at Randolph, Brooks, or March Fields, cadets came to Kelly to complete their training on tactical ships like the D-4, DB-7, and later the A-17, B-10, B-12 and B-18.

Here cadets completed their 350 hours of training in whatever group they were assigned.

The class was composed of about 40 cadets to each section and every student was checked out and received five hours of flying time in each type of tactical aircraft on the field. With the graduation of Class 39-B the training plan was re-organized to its present scope.

That was the old Section IV, and on the pages to follow is Section IV, Class 42-A.
