The Regulations of the Army Ordnance Administration  
Headquarters (Oct. 9, 17th Year of Showa (1942)  
Imperial Ordinance No. 674)

We hereby sanction, after its reference to the  
Privy Council for deliberation, the Regulations of the  
Army Ordnance Administration Headquarters and  
order their promulgation,

The Regulations of the Army Ordnance Administration  
Headquarters.

Article 1. The Army Ordnance Administration  
Headquarters administer the following affairs: -

1. Standardization, supply, exchange, acquisition, maintenance, examination, sale of ordnance (excluding air ordnance all through the present Regulations), and their materials (excluding those related to the air ordnance all through the present Regulations) and motor transport fuel and all sorts of intendants thereof (excluding the affairs pertaining to acquisition of motor transport fuel).

2. Examination, investigation and inspection of ordnance and their materials (excluding those administered by the Army Mechanized Headquarters),

and affairs relating to the examination of motor-transport fuel.

3. Affairs relating to the storage equipments of ordnance and motor-transport fuel (excluding the construction and management thereof).

4. Affairs relating to instruction, assistance and inspection of ordnance and motor-transport industry.

5. Affairs relating to requisition and inspection of motor-transport.

6. Affairs relating to installation work of



fortress ordnance and establishment or repairs of fixed radio station (excluding those related to aerial navigation).

7. Affairs relating to examination and research of army technique (excluding air technique all through the present Regulations) and science.

8. Affairs relating to electric power, machine tools, raw materials and materials and labor, all needed for munition mobilization.

9. Operations and managements of works to be executed with the special accounts of the Army arsenals and affairs relating to equipments of the Army

arsenals.

10. Affairs relating to the services and instructions of officers and men attached to the Army Technical department (excluding those connected with aerial navigation all through the present Regulations) and affairs relating to the special instructions of officers and men on duties in the works of technique and ordnance (excluding those connected with aerial navigation all through the present Regulations) in their specialized spheres.

11. Affairs relating to patents and utility models for munitions.

12. Affairs relating to the war time regulations with respect to ordnance.

Article 2. The Army Ordnance Administration Headquarters consists of the general affairs department, the technical department, the arms manufacturing department, the supply department, the training department, the examining department, the intendance department, <sup>and</sup> the medical department. Each department (excepting the departments of training, examining and medical affairs) consists of a number of sections.

The War Minister assigns the work to each Department.

The War Minister may establish a laboratory in the Army Ordnance Administration Headquarters for the purpose of pursuing special researches in case of necessity.

Article 3. Besides those establishments designated in the previous Articles, the Army Ordnance Administration Headquarters is provided with "Elite Squad," which, under the direction of the War Minister, shall administer the general affairs of the Army Technical Research Laboratory.

Article 4. The War Minister, if necessary, may establish branch offices of the Army

Ordnance Administration Headquarters and allot the work to them.

Article 5. The Army Ordnance Administration Headquarters is provided with the following staff:-

Superintendent-general of the Headquarters.

Chiefs of the Departments.

Chiefs of the Sections.

Chief of the "Duty Squad."

Department members.

Attachés.

Warrant-officers, non-commissioned officers and junior-rank civil officials.

In case branch offices are established, the chiefs shall be appointed from among the Department members.

Article 6. Besides the officials designated in the previous Article, the Army Ordnance Administration Headquarters may be provided with counsellors to let them participate in the designing of ordnance and materials, and the examination and research of army technique and science.

The War Minister may commission men of excellent scholarship and skill to the counsellorship.

Article 7. The Superintendent-general of

the Headquarters, being subordinate to the War Minister, shall superintend the business of the Army Ordnance Administration Headquarters, shall administer the Army Technical Research Laboratory, Army Arsenals, Army Ordnance Supply depots and Army Ordnance Schools, and shall manage the lands and buildings of the Army Arsenals.

Article 8. The Superintendent-general of the Headquarters, under the direction of the War Minister, shall coordinate researches of fundamental techniques within the Army.

Article 9. The Superintendent-general of

the Headquarters, under the order of the War Minister, shall conduct investigation of ordnance in army forces, government offices and schools, give guidances in regard to their handlings and preservations, and report the results to the Minister and also notify the same to the Chiefs of the investigated institutions.

The aforementioned investigations and guidances may be entrusted to the department Chiefs under his command.

Article 10. The Superintendent-general of the Headquarters shall superintend the special



instructions of the officers and men attached to the Army Technical Department and the officers and men on duties in the works of technique and ordnance in their specialized spheres respectively.

Article 11. The Superintendent-General of the Headquarters shall administer the purchase and examination of necessary ordnance, munition materials and motor-transport fuel.

Article 12. The Superintendent-General of the Headquarters, when entrusted by the Superintendent-General of the Army Air Headquarters, shall order the Army arsenals to manufacture air ordnance

and ammunition.

Article 13. The Superintendent-General of the Headquarters, with respect to the transportation ordnance, and the preservation of the ordnance and their materials which are entrusted to the Army Ordnance Department, <sup>shall</sup> ~~sent~~ the Chief of the Army Ordnance Department under the delegated command of himself.

Article 14. The Department Chiefs under the command of the Superintendent-general of Headquarters, shall administer their respective Department Business.

The Chief of the General Affairs Department,

Besides the assigned normal duties, shall generally assist the Superintendent-general in the co-ordination and adjustment of the whole business of the Army Ordnance Administration Headquarters.

Article 15. The Chief of Intendance Department, besides his normal duties, shall supervise the accounts of the forces under the command of the Superintendent-general, and also shall administer the affairs related to the special instructions and services of the intendance officers and men of the forces in their specialized duties.

The Chief of the Intendance Department is placed

under the direct command of the War Minister in respect to the supervision of the accounts prescribed in the preceding section and is also placed under the delegated command of the Director of the Intendance Bureau of the War Ministry with respect to the above-mentioned special instructions of the officers and men.

In cases of the first paragraph of the preceding section, if the matter has any connection directly with the commanding officers of the forces concerned, the Chief of the Intendance Department shall report it to the commanding officers.

Article 16. In respect to the duties of the Chief of the Intendance Department, the Articles from 8 to 11 of the Army Intendance Department Regulations shall be correspondingly applied.

Article 17. The Chief of the Medical Affairs Department shall administer, besides the prescribed duty in Article 14, the affairs related to sanitation, medical affairs of the forces under the command of the Superintendent-General and the services, labor and special instructions and trainings of the officers and men of the Sanitary Department in <sup>the</sup> specialized duties.

In respect to the labor, sanitation and special instructions of the officers and men of the Sanitary Department, as mentioned in the preceding section, the chief of the Medical Affairs Department is placed under the delegated command of the Director of the Medical Affairs Bureau of the War Ministry.

Article 18. In respect to the duties of the Medical Affairs Department, Article 6 of the Army Medical Department Regulations is correspondingly applied.

Article 19. The Section Chiefs shall administer, under the direction of their superior officials, the

sectional affairs.

Article 20. The Chief of the Duty Squad shall administer, under the direction of the Superintendent-general of the Headquarters, the affairs of the Squad.

Article 21. The Departmental members and attaches shall discharge, under the direction of their superior officials, their allotted duties.

Article 22. The warrant-officers and non-commissioned officers and junior-rank civil officials shall engage, under the direction of their superior officials, in technical or other business.

Article 23. The Superintendent-General of the Headquarters, when requested by other government offices and civilians, may order the Army Arsenal, with the approval of the War Minister, for the manufacture, purchase, examination or guidance of manufacture of ordnance (including air ordnance and ammunitions) and other articles, or training of operatives to be engaged in the technical task of their manufacture.

Article 24. The Superintendent-General of the Headquarters, when necessary for research or examination, under consultation with the Chief



of the Army General Staff, Inspector-general of the Military Education, the Army Inspector-general of Air, Commander-in-Chiefs of Army Corps, Commander-in-Chiefs of the Air Army, Divisional Commanders, and Air Corps Commanders, may make schools, and armed forces under their command, practice experimentations, or supply personnel, horses, ordnance and other materials necessary for the said purposes.

#### Supplementary Rules

The present Regulations are enforced on and from

Oct. 15, 1942.

The Army Technical Headquarters Regulations and  
the Army Arsenal Regulations are abolished.
