Before you go home...

- Wash your hands.

- Clean and disinfect car and truck tires.

When you get home...

- Change clothes immediately.
- Wash the clothes you were wearing in HOT water.
- Isolate birds you bring home for at least 3 weeks.



PRACTICE GOOD BIOSECURITY AT HOME.

Restrict traffic onto and off your property. Disinfect shoes, clothes, and equipment. Wash your hands.

NOW THE WARNING SIGNS OF DISEASE.

Watch for signs of disease or unexpected deaths among your birds.
