## HEADQUARTERS 337TH INFANTRY

REPORT OF OPERATIONS - APRIL 1944.

Period: 8 April - 30 April

On 8 April 1344, the regiment was in a bivouec area in the vicinity of the Mondragone, Italy, conducting training preparatory to going into the front line. Colonel Oliver W. Hughes was in command of the regiment. The following care the Battalion Commanders at the beginning of this period:

1st Battalion - Lt. Colonel August R. Schmidt 2nd Battalion - Lt. Colonel Frank H. Worgan 3rd Battalion - Lt. Colonel Earl A. Madsen

At 2500 on 8 April 1944, Field Order No. 1 was received from Headquarters 85th Infantry Division. The Regimental Commander and his staff began plans to relieve the 351st Infantry of the 88th Division on 11 April 1944. Advance detachments cleared into the 351st Infantry sector at 112323. 2nd Battalion, Company "D", Company "M, Antitank Company, Cannon Company, Antiank Platoons of the 1st Battalion, and advance detachments from 1st and 3rd Battalions and Regimental Headquarters Company departed for front line to start relief of 351st Infantry at 121940. Regiment (-) completed move from bivouac vicinity of Mondragone, Italy and accupied positions of 351st Infantry. Relief was completed 14 April 2400. Tank Battalion relieved Company "B" (-) 760th Tank Battalion as of 14 April 2400 and was attached to 337th Infantry.

Our troop activity from 14 April to 30 April inclusive consisted of active defense of assigned sector between Minturno - Santa Maria Road and Ausente River on high ground north of road from Minturno to Ausente River. This high ground overlooked the Reali Creek.

Normal patrolling consisting of one to three ambush and reconnaissance patrols from 1st, 2nd and 3rd Batteliess was conducted each night within their sector to vicinity of Santa Maria, Pulcherini, Mt. Cerri and Mt. Bracchi. Cannon Company and 328th Field Artillery supported patrols by fires on call, harrassing fires and observed fires on enemy personnel, self-propelled guns and vehicles.

Enemy activity was confined to slight artillery fire along entire front and rear installations, self propelled gun fire, defensive fires using small arms, machine guns and mortars. Enemy small arms fire covered Reali Creek with sporadic fires during darkness. Self-propelled guns were continually moved along entire front. Enemy information during this period was received from civilians coming through our lines.

Administration during this period consisted primarily in establishing a system handle strength reports, decorations and awards, the Units Journal and replacements of both officers and enlisted men. A Casual Company was formed in the rear area to process enlisted replacements and give them training prior to sending them

to the front line. A plan was initiated to handle these replacements to facilitate the battalions in receiving officers and enlisted men in the shortest possible time. Casualties were light during this period therefore no difficult problem was involved.

An S-1 Work-Sheet was innovated compiling strength reports, battle casualties, awards, replacements and other pertinent information giving the Regimental Commander a detailed account of matters pertaining to the Command.

A Graves Registration plan was started incorporating Graves Registration Teams, collecting points and methods for the quick evacuation of the dead.

During this period the regiment received 362 enlisted men and 14 officer replacements.

Supply during this period was handled in a manner as to give troops two hot meels daily except for troops in isolated outpost positions; in which case 10 in 1, C and K rations were issued. A shower unit was established and troops were given a chance to bathe. A plan was used to give troops new clothing in direct exchange and proved successful. A close check was kept on requirements of ammunition and troops were supplied with ample ammunition for all weapons.

The most difficult problem was transporting supplies, troops, rations and ammunition over the traffic congested supply route from the rear areas in Mondragone and the front line. All motor movements were made at night because of enemy observation of the Minturno Bridge over the Garigliano River during day—ight hours. This problem was greatly reduced due to the efforts of the Regimental otor Officer. Plans devised by S-4 during this period aleviated many of the supply problems confronting the battalions during this first contact with the enemy.
