### The DREER Nurseries

at Riverton, New Jersey

New visitors to the Dreer Nurseries, Riverton, New Jersey, invariably express surprise as to their size, diversity, and completeness. Nowhere in this country can be found a commercial horticultural establishment where such a great variety of different plants are brought together to serve the needs of the florist as well as those of the home gardener.

The Dreer establishment at Riverton is much more than just a nursery in the sense that this word is usually applied. Established in 1868, it has grown until today 13 acres are under glass including special houses for Palms, Ferns, Tropical Plants, Aquatics and many others.

For the convenience of those who have only a limited amount of time to spend, a large house has been set apart as a display house. Here a limited number of specimen plants of all the seasonable leaders are attractively grouped for inspection. This obviates the necessity of many miles of walking through the complete range of houses. Close by to the original site are the Dreer Greenhouses and Nurseries at Riverview which, though a distinct unit, are a part of the Riverton organization. The third unit is Locust Grove Farm, located less than two miles from the Riverton head office. Locust Grove Farm is noted for the production of extra fine Azaleas, Phlox, Roses, Shrubs, Climbers, and many other Dreer specialties.

An outstanding new feature of the Dreer Nursery at Riverton is the completely remade Rose Garden which has been acclaimed the finest test garden in the East. There will be another splendid display of Roses late in September, when many of the newest varieties will bloom for the first time in this section of the country.

Anyone interested in plants, but our florist friends in particular, are most cordially invited to visit the Dreer Nurseries at Riverton. No matter what time of the year, there always are many interesting things to be seen there.

May we have the pleasure of your visit? Riverton is about 9 miles from the central Philadelphia business district. It may be reached over a good highway by crossing over the Delaware River Bridge to Camden. Those who approach from Easton and westward may travel through Trenton or use the Tacony-Palmyra Bridge, which is less than three miles from the Nurseries.


Single Late or Cottage Garden Tulips

### Early White French Roman Hyacinth

The Early White French Roman Hyacinths are particularly suited to growing in bowls and pans for winter blooming. They are somewhat tender and are not recommended for outdoor planting in the North unless they are well protected. Their loosely formed, graceful, delicately perfumed flower spikes have great charm and appeal. They may be grown to flower in succession from November until April. For this purpose succession plantings should be made a week or 10 days apart. They are adapted to be grown in soil and also do exceptionally well if planted in special bulb fiber.






### Double Flowering Narcissus

The Double Narcissus have shown a decided increase in popularity during recent years. This is entirely due to their splendid qualities which make them valuable for garden display and for cutting. With the exception of Van Sion the blooms are double by the addition of a liberal number of perianth petals. In Van Sion, however, we have a trumpet variety with a single set of perianth petals and a double trumpet in the center. All are easy to grow, though Alba plena odorata demands more exacting conditions in order to unfold its blooms.


