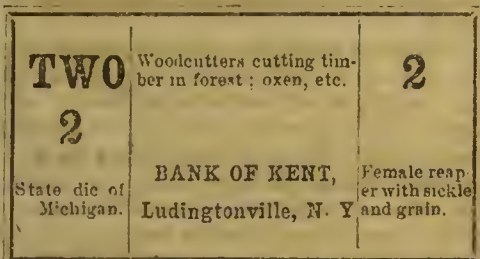

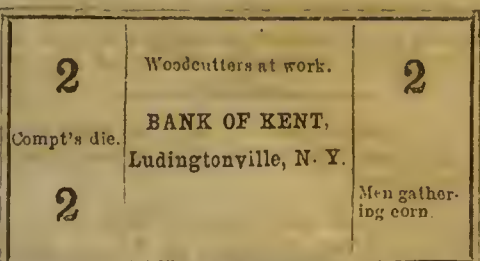

are, every one of them, prostrated, for the want of credit, confidence having been entirely withdrawn from them in justice, rebuke and retribution, for their past conduct. There are signs, however, of vitality and life in some of them that may be again brought into a channel of utility for public good, by the only power possible henceforth to operate such franchises in Pennsylvania, under her present laws, and that is money, credit, character and talent. Hereafter, bankers in Pennsylvania must be money lenders, not money borrowers. The Buffalo shyster wild cat; the Wisconsin wild cat Bank of Crawford County; the Wall-st. and Warren County operations; the huge Cleveland speculators in beef, pork and railroad operations, in connection with the Bank of Lawrence Co.; the Monongahela Valley forgeries; the Dick-Thomsonian arrangements in the Bank of Crawford County; the Thomsonian Tioga co-partnership; the Central Bank of Pa., bogus Georgia complicity, and all of the above kind of operations, are no longer to be tolerated by the people and banks of Pa., as the authorities and community have resolved to crush out all institutions that do not confine themselves to a legitimate banking business; so shysters and professional bogus bankers might as well let alone any Pennsylvania bank charter, as they will only burn their fingers if they touch them in future.

Peninsular Bank, Mich.

The following extract we copy from the New York Express of the 11th inst.:

"Daniel Ball Esq., a banker at Grand Rapids, Mich., has bought the controlling interest in the Peninsular Bank (\$157,000) at Detroit. It is estimated by his neighbors that he is worth from \$300,000 to \$500,000, and it is said that about 14 years since his stock in trade amounted to a jackknife, a clay pipe and a plug of tobacco at the time he entered the Grand River Valley, in Michigan, where he superintended a gang of hands in opening up the plaster-beds at Grand Rapids, leading off with the spade himself."

Evidently this may be considered as a puff to Mr. BALL and the PENINSULAR BANK, as that institution is likely to be henceforth controlled and conducted by him. Our knowledge of Mr. BALL's financial operations and complicity with the LITCHFIELD BANK of Conn., which failed so disastrously last year, as also his connection with the TIOGA COUNTY BANK of Pa., together with his antecedents in the Shinplaster business in Michigan and other Western States is conclusive to our mind that the public have gained nothing in safety in the late change of ownership or management of this Peninsular Bank, but on the contrary. Of all the various owners of this Bank since its dangerous charter was obtained from the Legislature of Michigan, it never was in the hands of any parties, whereby the public are more likely to suffer if this concern is permitted to issue their bills *ad libitum*.

We advise our subscribers to refuse these bills for the present under all circumstances.

PENNSYLVANIA BANKS CAN BEAT THE
WORLD FOR SUBTERFUGES.

THE CHAMELEON BANK AT NEWCASTLE, PA.

There was a Bank in 1856-7, at Newcastle, Pa., started and owned by a set of non-resident desperate speculators and bogus money gamblers from Wallstreet, Cleveland and Pittsburgh, with one WAGONSELLER, as Cashier. This Wagonseller, of course, was a suppliant tool of his employers and owners; hence Mr. Wagonseller had no more interest in the character of the Bank of Newcastle, or the State of Pa., than a nigger on a Southern plantation, nor half so much. The result was, as we repeatedly predicted—but at that time had not the power to prevent—the Bank of Newcastle, Pa., failed disastrously. Upon investigation and examination of the vaults of the Bank of Newcastle, by the poor victimized billholders, creditors, local merchants, traders, &c., to get the huge piles of gold and silver purporting to be in the Bank, it was found that a *Wagon and seller* had departed lately in a two horse wagon between two days, and had left the Bank minus all available assets of anything accessible to keep the babies warm, but plenty of the notes of La Crosse Wisconsin notoriety Railroad operators of Cleveland, and pork and beef speculators of the same place, and other traps too numerous to mention.

Thus endeth the first failure of the Bank of Newcastle, Pa., carrying as it did misery, disappointment and sorrow to thousands of poor people in all parts of the country, from Minnesota to New York.

The first failure of the Bank of Newcastle proving so disastrous to the citizens of Pennsylvania and other States, caused the managers Chamberlain, Whitman, Standard & Co., of Cleveland and some brokers of Pittsburgh to apply to the Legislature for a change of a name in order to deceive the community; also took great pains to convince the public that the new Bank of Lawrence Co., was owned and controlled by numerous local parties, and catalogues were made out with several hundreds of names, most of them women and children, who were represented as *bona fide* owners of stock, in order to produce the impression that the Bank was controlled by local parties and was a home institution, but a second disastrous failure in 1859, showed that the whole concern was controlled by Whitman, Standard & Co., of Cleveland, who failed simultaneously with the Bank, and that Chamberlain, a great Railroad contractor of Cleveland, and brokers in Pittsburgh held a controlling interest, and hence the pretended local stockholders were a myth.

Now we are called upon a third time to recognize this Bank as a local institution, after they have twice bought up the bills for 25 to 50 cents on the dollar of the poor people, who received them from these speculators for one hundred cents on the dollar, thus robbing those who are least prepared to bear this cruel loss of 50 per cent. If the managers of this concern expect that the JOURNAL will countenance the robbery of the people of the Western part of Pennsylvania, or any other State of this Union for the third time and by the same parties, they are greatly mistaken, notwithstanding all the Bank Reporters and many of the newspapers countenance (for a consideration) this barefaced third attempt to impose upon the credulity of the public.

NEW-ENGLAND BANKS VINDICATING THEMSELVES.

The most Infamous Attempt to Discredit by Wholesale, all the Good and Solvent Banks in the old State of Vermont, (save two) that has ever been perpetrated in this country, and of course in the world!!

What a spectacle of bold, brazen impudence do we behold to contemplate? Let us ask—

WHO ARE THE MEN that have thus wantonly, or venally attempted to blast, for the time being, if not forever, the good name and reputation of some of the oldest and staunchest Banks in Vermont, which have heretofore and now stand as firm and pure, and we hope and trust as permanent, as her own beautiful mountains, which are so much admired, and against whose base the old broken-down, old foggy superannuated brokers, editors, and bogus bankers friends of Wall street, may mine and pick in vain to get the black mineral (not mail) vein they seek. Yes, we fear they must pick in vain among the mountains to find much of the desired mineral substance they have deliberately attempted to get the handling of, or mutilate and destroy by slander and misrepresentation, the legitimate circulation of the sound currency of Vermont.

It seems by the acts and developements of the last few weeks that the huge financial *Metropolitan* ogre—the hydra-headed monster—has become dissatisfied, uneasy, and to all appearances to men of common sense, justice, and fair dealing, unmanageable. Indeed, in this case, it is clear to the unprejudiced and intelligent minds that the old proverb "that those whom the Gods wish to destroy, they first make mad," is exemplified strikingly in the recent and still persisted in attempt of a high pretending METROPOLITAN institution to cooperate with old broken down disgraceful parties, and use their own semi-official MONGREL ORGAN sheets, like the METROPOLITAN REPORTER, and Thompson's old foggy Detector, and other filthy sheets which have been so mixed up, complicated, and connected with bogus Banks. How an institution, claiming any standing, could so boldly and wantonly attempt to coerce independent banks, such as those of Vermont, into keeping their funds and paying indirect or direct tribute to New York Banks instead of the old Suffolk Bank in Boston, which is no mushroom institution, and is not managed by shysters, or adventurers from the everglades of Florida, but are reliable men and can always be depended upon.

This movement in this city to discredit New England money seems to be prompted by a want of employment, and a diminution of business on the part of the parties concerned. One of the parties has been very actively and energetically employed for several years in coercing, and to use their own term, "whipping in" all the banks in the State of New York whom they thought proper to attack; and having succeeded in their night to annoy, intimidate and tire out nearly the whole of the banks in the State of New York to pay tribute without compensation, but on the contrary, humiliation, disgrace and submission on account of policy, which is too often the ruling principle of bankers, hence this concern having finished its labors in this State and accomplished its objects for the time being, seeks other fields to conquer, as is shown in the recent attempt to discredit some of the best banks in the New England States.

We publish below the vindications of the Banks that have been discredited by these interested parties, but whose notes have been taken by all legitimate bankers throughout the country, which shows the futility of all attempts like these, to call into

question, permanently, the solvency of Banks when there are other influences which counteract all such puerile efforts emanating from motives of personal aggrandizement. The day is past in this country when a legitimate Bank is dependent upon the quotation of a time-serving Reporter, or its reception of its notes on deposit in any banking institution. We have now a higher standard to judge currency by, than the whims of speculators, or the freaks of brokers and bank presidents:—

Dear Sir:—I see that this Bank is reported as failed or doubtful.

Permit me to state that in consequence of the embarrassment of the Bank near the close of 1857, a new board of Directors were elected in January, 1858, since which time the Bank has done, not a large, but a safe business. In February following, it resumed the redemption of its bills in Boston, which had been for a short time suspended, and at all times since they have been promptly redeemed there and at our counter. The Bank had some doubtful paper due to it, but the amount has been reduced below that reported by the Bank Commissioner by payments made since his examination, the 2d of August last.

By an Act of the Legislature of this State passed at its last session, the capital of the Bank was reduced from one hundred to fifty thousand dollars, whereby it now has reliable resources exceeding all its liabilities, and it also now has funds to its credit in Boston and specie in its vault sufficient to take up at once more than two-thirds its entire circulation. There are no bank bills in New England safer to the holder, or more certain of prompt redemption at par, than those issued by this Bank.

As I trust your object is, not to injure unnecessarily any institution, but to give reliable information to the public, I shall hope to see this Bank quoted accordingly in your Journal.

In regard to the FARMERS' BANK of Orwell, Vt., the Cashier says:—"There was no occasion for the throwing out of our notes in New York. We have not failed to redeem in Boston, since the panic of 1857. Thirty thousand dollars and over, which the Bank Commissioner calls bad, is good, and has always been so considered by our Board, and we obtained judgment for it last week. We shall continue to redeem and do business. The bonds and sureties of our Directors are good for ten times our circulation."

I hereby certify, that on the 26th day of December, 1859, I made such an examination of the Franklin County Bank, and on the second day of January, 1860, of the Union Bank and Commercial Bank, in this State, that I am able to say: that the Franklin County Bank has an available surplus exceeding six thousand dollars, after making provision for all its liabilities, and after deducting from its resources all doubtful debts; that the Union Bank has a like surplus of eight thousand dollars; and the Commercial Bank a like surplus of four thousand five hundred dollars, after providing for a semi-annual dividend of six thousand dollars. That since my appointment as Bank Commissioner, in October, 1857, I have been acquainted personally with the managers of said Banks; and I regard them as cautious men and safe bankers, and so far as my ex-

aminations have shown, these Banks have been well managed for the security of the public and the interests of the stockholders. That I believe these Banks are regarded as among the safest Banks in the State, and I consider them perfectly sound, and their billholders secured beyond any contingency.

Who cares what Banks the Metropolitan Bank pretends to have confidence in? The Eagle Bank, Bristol, R. I., never suspended, or refused to redeem her bills in gold ever since she was chartered—some forty or fifty years ago—to the present day.
