3. 1. Attention invited to the inclosed application from the Mayor of Hirakata City, requesting release from reparations custody of certain equipment belonging to the Hirakata Arsenal, plant 32-31.

2. The application is favorably considered. The applied for items are required for use in connection with the Hirakata City public water supply and fire fighting systems. The City of Hirakata has been using the equipment on a temporary basis since October 1948 by authorization from this headquarters. As cited in the application, 60% of the water currently supplied to the municipality is dependent upon the requested pumps and accessory equipment. Due to financial stringencies, public funds are not available to procure similar equipment from commercial sources, nor can availability of funds be foreseen in the predictable future.

3. None of the applied for items are included in outstanding allocation notices regarding the Hirakata Arsenal.

4. It is recommended that the equipment listed in subject application be released to the Construction Board for the uses proposed by the City of Hirakata.

Reference is memorandum for the Japanese Government, AG 387.6 (22 Jul 47)REP, (SCAPIN 1751 as amended), 22 July 1947, subject, "Responsibility of the Japanese Government for the Packaging, Transfer and Delivery of Equipment and Records Allocated to Claimant Nations under the Reparations Program," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, relative to the Japanese Government's responsibility in the supplying of dunnage, loading and stowage of equipment aboard the recipient nations' ships.



Forwarded herewith for your information is a quotation from a letter from GHQ on funds for payment of custody and maintenance of reparations facilities.

"1. The Japanese Government, under strict supervision of Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, has recently revised its standards of payment for maintenance and custody of reparations plants; these standards have been effective since 1 April 1949. Reduction of personnel will be accomplished under the new point system because the number of personnel per set number of points has been reduced. The point system is not based on a minimum number of employees per point integral but on a maximum allowable number of employees per allotted index points. Variations in plants due to minimum or optimum conditions of maintenance are expected. In formulating standards for payment the external deviations from the norm cannot be taken into account. The policy for payment is set up for the greatest number of plants approaching a statistical mean. The deviations from the mean must be adjusted by local military government and Japanese Government prefectural authorities as local conditions warrant.

2. Funds for the payment of reparations facilities are paid on the basis of total index points; however, in approving standards for disbursement of reparations payments the Japanese Government is now required to audit expenses periodically at each reparations plant and also to audit the funds paid to the Prefectural Government for reparations expenses. Any funds in excess of the amount actually used for salaries and other approved expenses must be returned to the Central Reparations Account.

3. The Japanese Government has been directed to submit copies of the new set of standards to local military government team commanders; these standards should be reviewed and adjustments made for plants that are not specifically embodied in them."
