

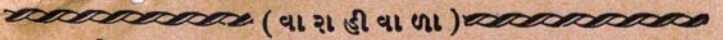

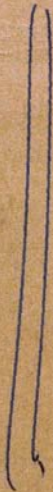

Respected Sir, Please accept my respects and regards to you. My letter dated 2.6.65 was received by your P.A on 5.6.65. I learnt that some days after you left for foreign countries an official visit. I see that you are preoccupied with matters of interest to the State and so you could not possibly direct your attention to my above said letter.

My letter, though a manuscript, will yet be legible for a reading. For obvious reasons I do not go to a typist. I am reluctant to believe that my letter would fail to draw your kind attention in giving some weight to the matters dealt with in regard to Netaji.

I have been over the years bestowing my thoughts and canvassing opinions from eminent jurists and lawyers with regard to the line of approach to solve the mystery.

The legal bar upheld by me and the plausible suggestion given by me, will I fervently believe attract your kind attention to probe in the matter.

Once we have information which is dependable and actable, that Netaji moves incognito, we will be failing in our duty to have the way safe for his return home in his true Colours.

Should we not have the benefit of his presence in his true Colours in our midst? The appointment of a Commission as expressed by Netaji and as promised by you should not be further delayed.

If the Commission could be convinced that the Lama at the death bed of Netaji is Netaji then it could get convinced that

The Sanyasi at the death bed of Mahatmaji was Netaji.

I once again appeal and beg of you to kindly consult eminent lawyer friends to appoint a fresh Commission for fresh fact finding and thus do service to Netaji and the Country.

It will be the greatest honour to you if Netaji is made to come during your period and you will usher the Country into the Golden age.

Dear Shri Venkateswaran,

The Hindustan Standard of Calcutta has published a series of articles by one Dr. Satyanarayan Sinha, about the life and activities of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. The author has expressed, in these articles, the opinion that the alleged death of Netaji in a plane crash on 18th August, 1945 is a myth that Netaji escaped into Dairen in Manchuria in August, 1945, that he was taken prisoner by the Chinese Communist forces in 1949 and ultimately taken to Soviet Russia where he has been lodged in a prison cell at Yakutsk in Siberia.

2. We have received a number of representations from various Organizations and individuals to ascertain the facts from the Soviet Government about the authenticity of the report. As you know, the reports appearing in press from time to time about survival of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose have sentimental appeal to the people of India, though there may not be any substance in such reports. The articles of Dr. Sinha have again revived the sentiments of people here. We shall be grateful if you would kindly check up the authenticity of Dr. Sinha's conclusions from the Soviet authorities and inform us about the same at an early date. It is likely that there may be some questions in the Parliament on the subject when it sits in Session from 16th of August, 1965.

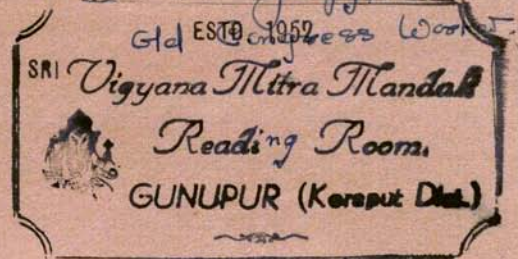



NOTE FOR SUPPLEMENTARIES

(On Rajya Sabha Starred Question No. 51 for 17.8.1965)

.....

Dr. Satyanarain Sinha, a former member of the Lok Sabha is reported to have made a statement in Calcutta in a public meeting that Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose is at present kept in Cell No.46 of Yakutusk prison in Siberia. Earlier the Hindustan Standard of Calcutta published a series of articles by Dr. Satyanarain Sinha about life and whereabouts of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. The author, in these articles, expressed the opinion that the alleged death of Netaji in a plane crash on 18th August, 1945 is a myth, that Netaji escaped into Darien in Manchuria in August, 1945, that he was taken prisoner by the Chinese Communist forces in 1949 and ultimately taken to Siberia, where he has been lodged in cell No. 46 in Yakutusk city.

An Enquiry Committee was appointed by the Government of India in the Ministry of External Affairs in April, 1956. The Committee consisted of Shri Shah Nawaz, Shri Suresh Chandra Bose(elder brother of Netaji) and Shri S.N. Maitra, Chief Commissioner, Andaman and Nicobar Islands. The report of this Committee which was signed by Shri Shah Nawaz and Shri S.N. Maitra was released for publication in September, 1956. The Government of India accepted the report. The third member, namely, Shri Suresh Chandra Bose neither signed the report nor submitted a minute of dissent. After laying a copy of this report on the Table of the House on 11.9.1956, the late Prime Minister made a statement in the Lok Sabha in which he said inter alia that Government felt that the evidence adduced in the report was practically overwhelming and should be accepted. The conclusion reached by the Enquiry Committee was that Netaji met his death as a result of an air crash at Taihoku air-field in Formosa on August 18, 1945 and his ashes are now at Renkcji Temple in Tokyo.

especially some members of the Netaji's family, have been maintaining that Netaji is alive. The Government's position has already been made clear in the Parliament on a few occasions in answers to question and supplementaries. In answer to the Unstarred Lok Sabha Question No. 743 on 7th May, 1962, the late Prime Minister and Minister for External Affairs had stated: "The Netaji Enquiry Committee after examining all the evidence, had presented a majority report which established that Netaji had died in an air-accident. The basic conclusions reached by the Committee have never been seriously questioned. Government are satisfied that there is no justification on the basis of available facts for the holding of a further enquiry into the question".

Again on March 29, 1965 while answering supplementaries on the Lok Sabha Starred Question No.623, regarding the suspicion of some people that the Shalmari Ashram Sanyasi was Netaji, the Prime Minister stated:"I am very sorry this matter is repeated again and again and these questions are put in this House".

Regarding the specific point whether Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose is a prisoner in the Yakutusk Jail, Siberia in Russia, it may be stated that the Government have no information on this, nor do the Government propose to hold an enquiry in the matter. Moreover, the information is also available in published documents viz. Netaji Enquiry Committee Report and Parliamentary debates, etc.

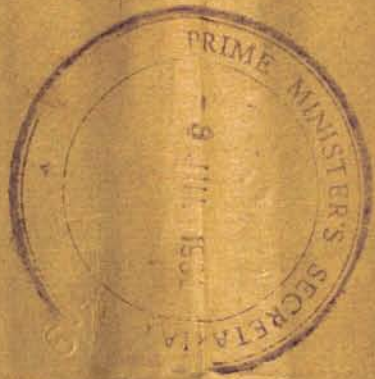



Extract of the Resolution passed at an Extraordinary
General Meeting of the Bar Association, Jalpaiguri held
on 31.7.65 at 2 P.M.

* * * * *

The members of the Bar Association, Jalpaiguri have read with great concern the series of articles published in the Press by Dr. Satyanarain Sinha an eminent scholar about the life and activities of our beloved leader Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, even after the alleged plane crash in August 1945 and about his present whereabouts (Vide Hindusthan Standard Sunday Magazine dated 7th February, 1965 onward) Shah Nawaz Committee Report on the subject with particular reference to the alleged plane crash on August 18th, 1945 and death of Netaji in consequence being inconclusive and unconvincing there were lurking doubts in the minds of the people both about the incident of the said alleged plane crash as well as about the genuineness of the said report. The facts and circumstances as -- disclosed in the said Articles of Dr. Satyanarain Sinha, describing the said plane crash as a myth and that Netaji was found living and ultimately was taken to Soviet -- Russia where he has been lodged in a prison cell at Yatusk in Soviet Territory of Siberia, reasonably has intensified the said lurking doubt. This Association therefore demands that the Government of India should immediately approach the Government of Soviet Russia for a report about the correctness of such ~~reports~~ statements and place the reply obtained from the Soviet Government before the public and in the context it is and be -- resolved that the Government of India should immediately constitute ~~a Committee~~ a Commission of Enquiry -- consisting of eminent jurist to enquire into the matters

afresh in the light of disclosures made by Dr. Satyanarain Sinha recently through his writing published in the press and also other facts and date that have in the meantime come out.
