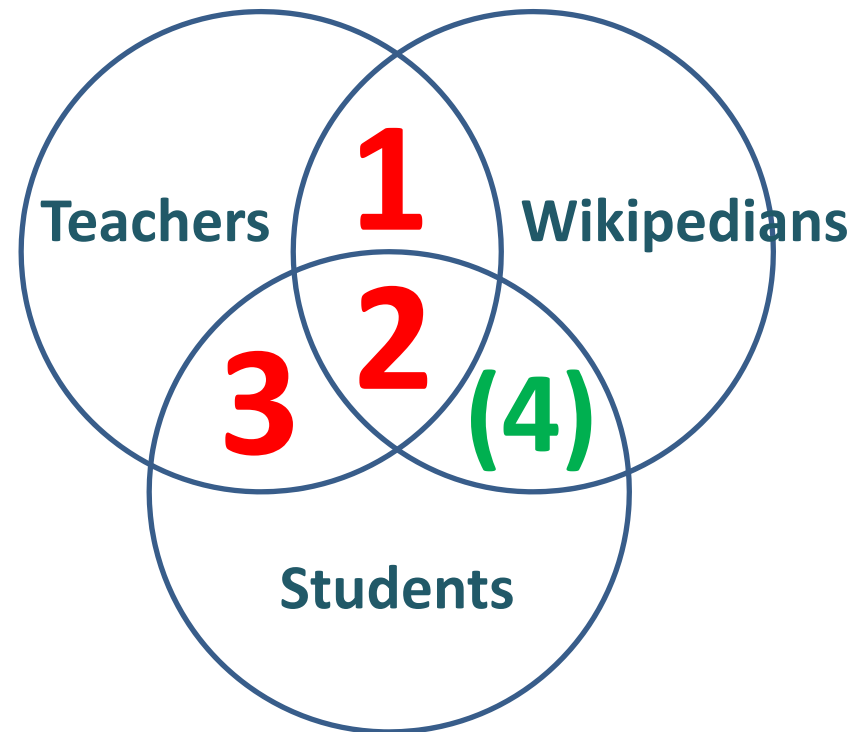
Step into my shoes

- Relatively small wiki community
- No more than 5 Wikipedians interested in WEP



Phases of a project

- 1** Design and preparation – setting up the rules, incentives and schedule
- 2** Accomplishing the assignment + Feedback
- 3** Evaluation and scoring
- (4)** Recruitment as long-term wikipedians



Institution parameters

- Profile of the institution
 - Humanities, Technical sciences, Natural sciences
- Private / Public institution
- Obligatory / Optional attendance of classes
- Autonomy given to the educators to adopt novel teaching approaches
- ...

Course parameters

- Bachelor / Master programme
- Regular / distant education
- Number of students per course
- Number of classes per course
- Additional workload to students
- ...

Motivation to establish a WEP

- The wiki community's motivation
 - More content?
 - More editors?
 - More institutional collaborations?...
- The educators' motivation
 - Be innovative?
 - Diversify / Update their educational practices?
 - Outsource workload in reviewing and scoring students?...

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The questions

- Compulsory vs. Optional assignment?
- The assignment gives:
 - Full mark vs. Partial mark vs. No mark
- How many assignments?
- How long time shall be given for an assignment?
- What should be the criteria of success?
- Free choice of topics or selecting from a list prepared by the educator and the wiki mentor?

Not so obvious questions

- How are roles distributed between educator and wiki mentors?
- How is the communication between educator – wiki mentors – students be organized?
- Would students be able to generate same/similar teamworking /writing skills, if they weren't in the wiki education project?
- Would students be able to get the same knowledge of the studied discipline, if they weren't in the wiki education project?

Problems faced

- Infrastructural problems (access to good internet connection, etc.)
- Difficulties with wiki markup, wiki navigation, etc.
- Difficulties, related to access to sources of information
- Difficulties, related to communicating content from the sources
- Difficulties in formulating a definition
- No or scarce access to illustrative content

Problems generated

- Accidental deletion of content
- Machine translations
- Copyright violations
- Non-notable subjects
- Conflict of interest
- Misbehaviour, strong language to other editors
- Procrastination (delivering the assignment after the end of the deadline)
