W.E.B. DuBois was a sociologist who emerged as a scholar-activist that made significant contributions to the black community.



Interesting facts

- W.E.B. Dubois opposed capitalism, in favor of a socialist approach (Lewis, 487)
- He performed a detailed analysis in a sociological study of African-American people in Philadelphia (Lange, 135-146)
- Dubois was antagonistic towards both Booker T. Washington and Marcus Garvey (Gomez, 203-204)
- He was a pan-Africanist, and he often displayed these ideals as an editor for the NAACP (Gomez, 204)
- He moved to Ghana in 1961 and renounced his American citizenship (Gomez, 204)
