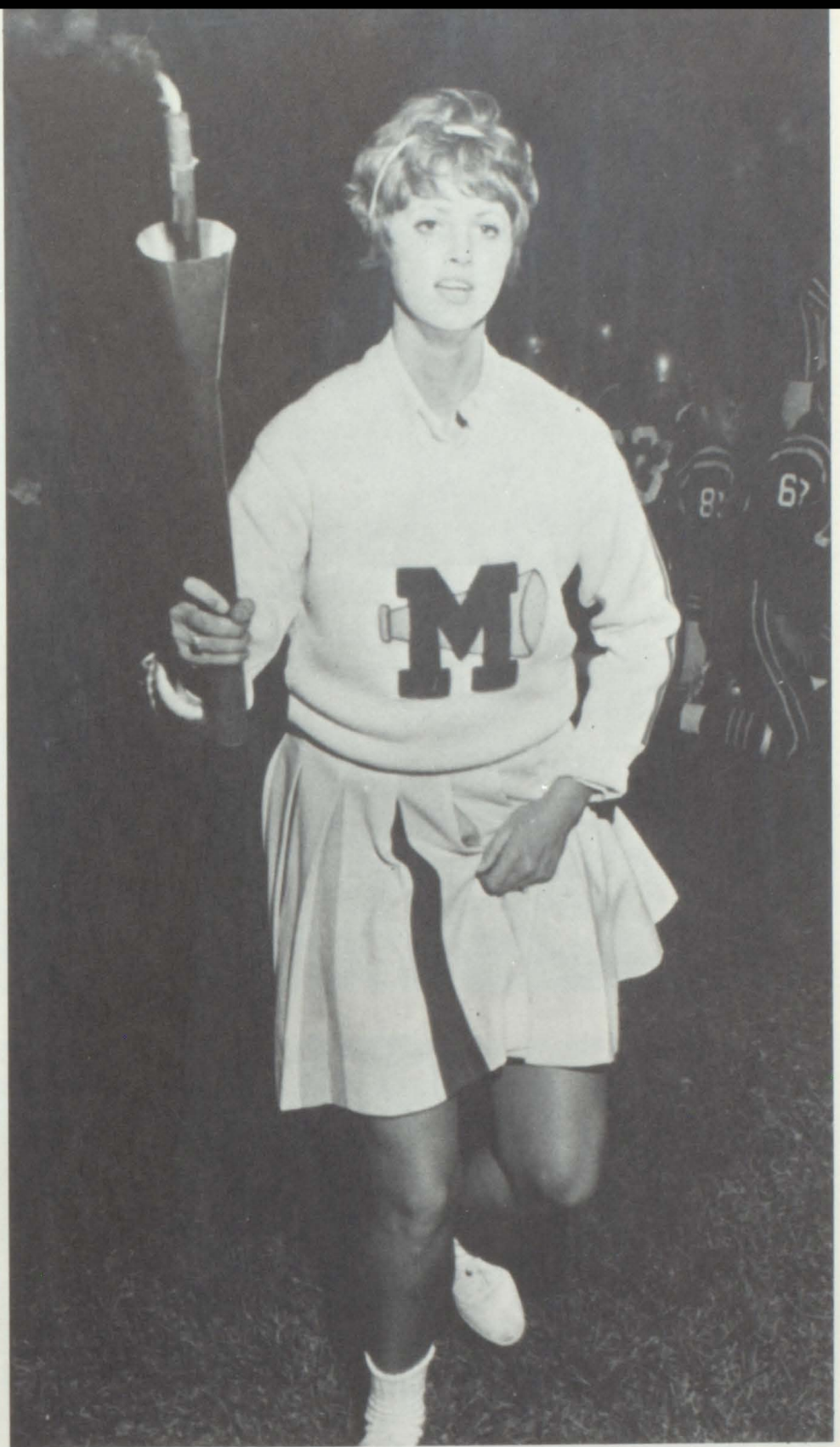
HOMECOMING '69

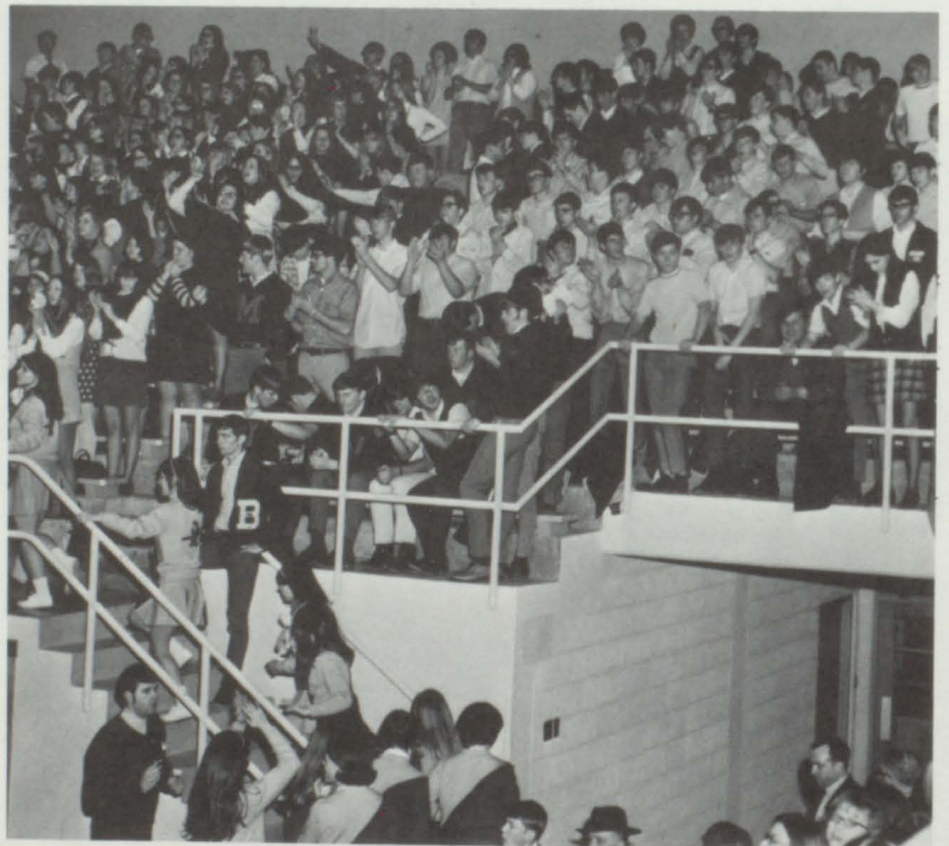

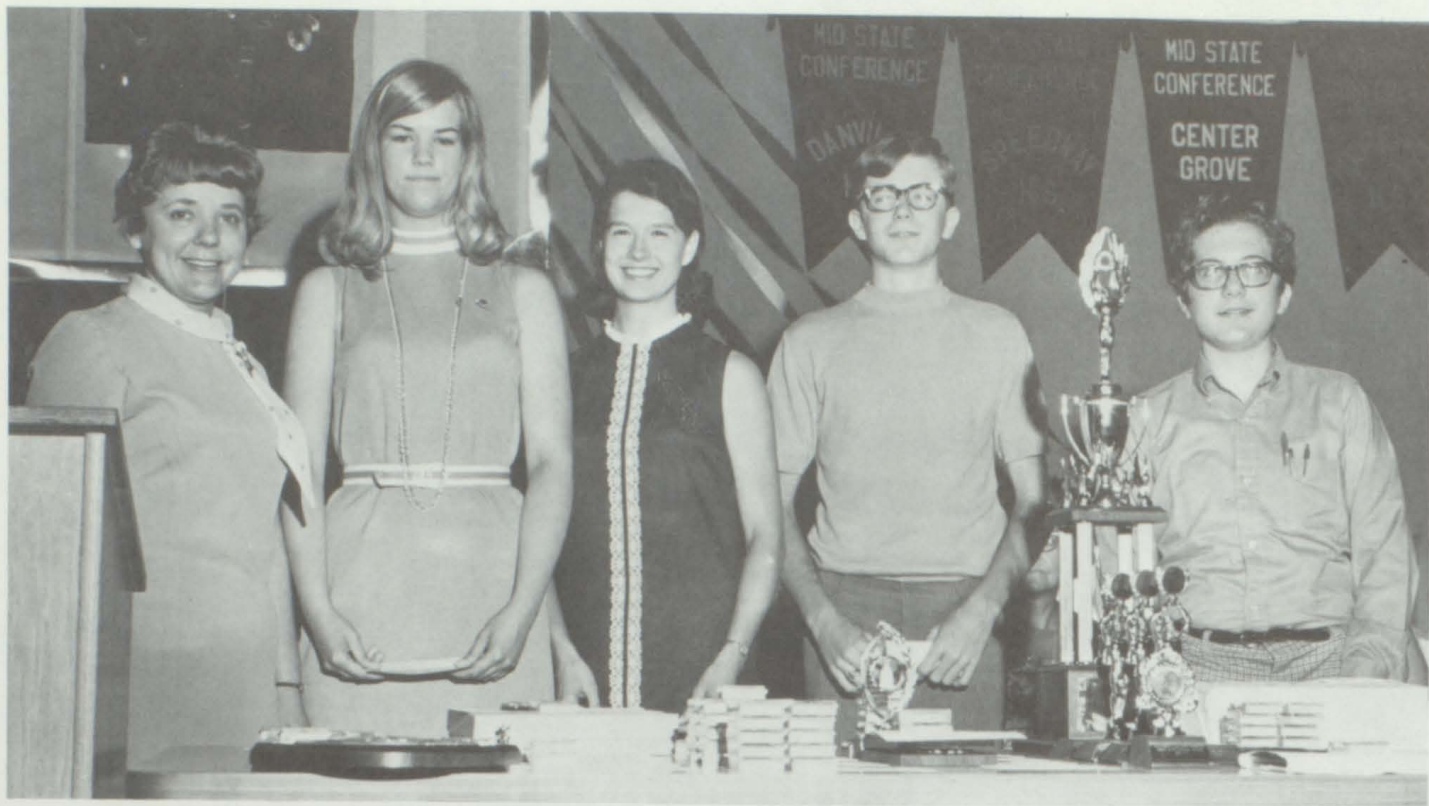

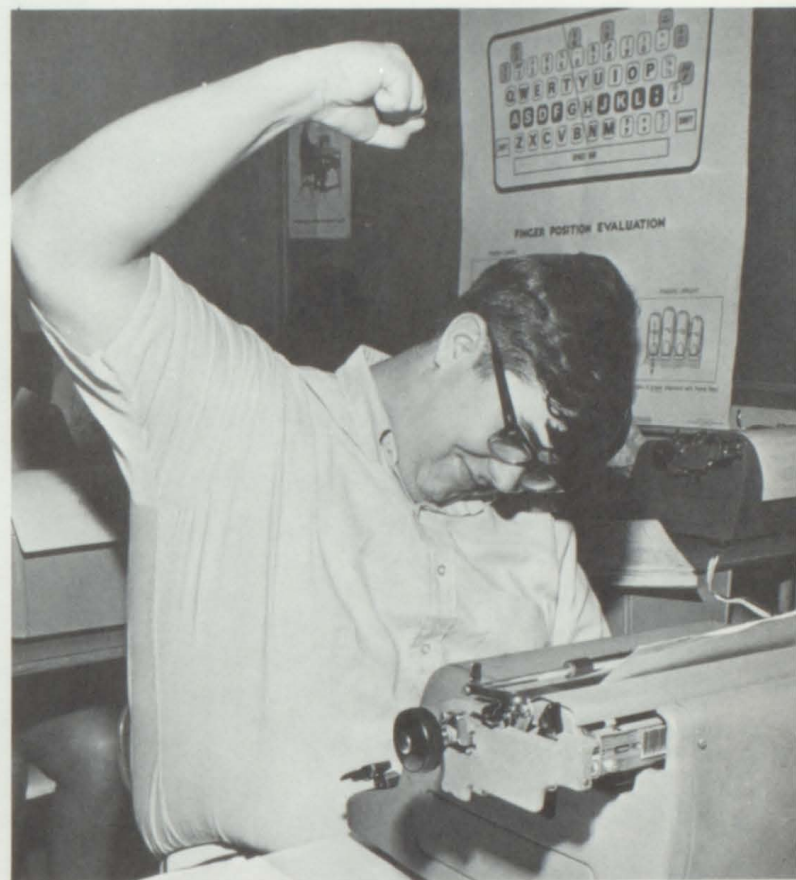

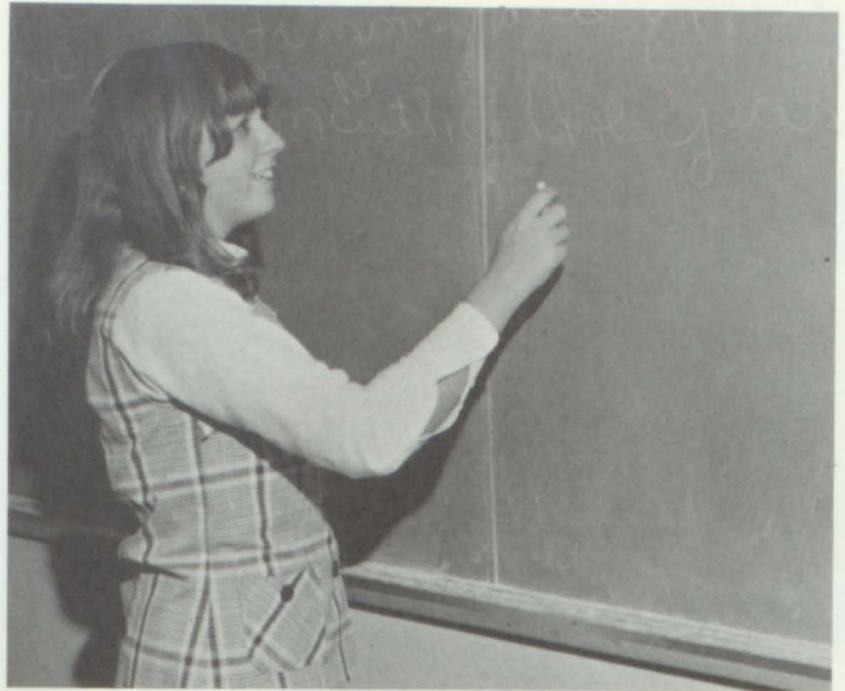

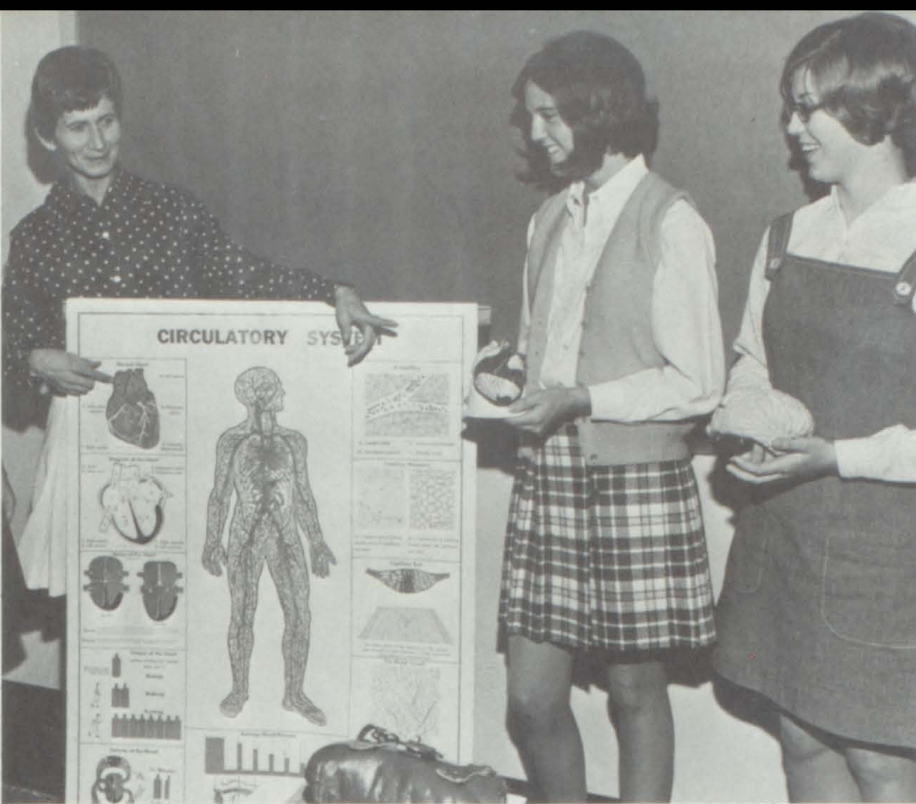

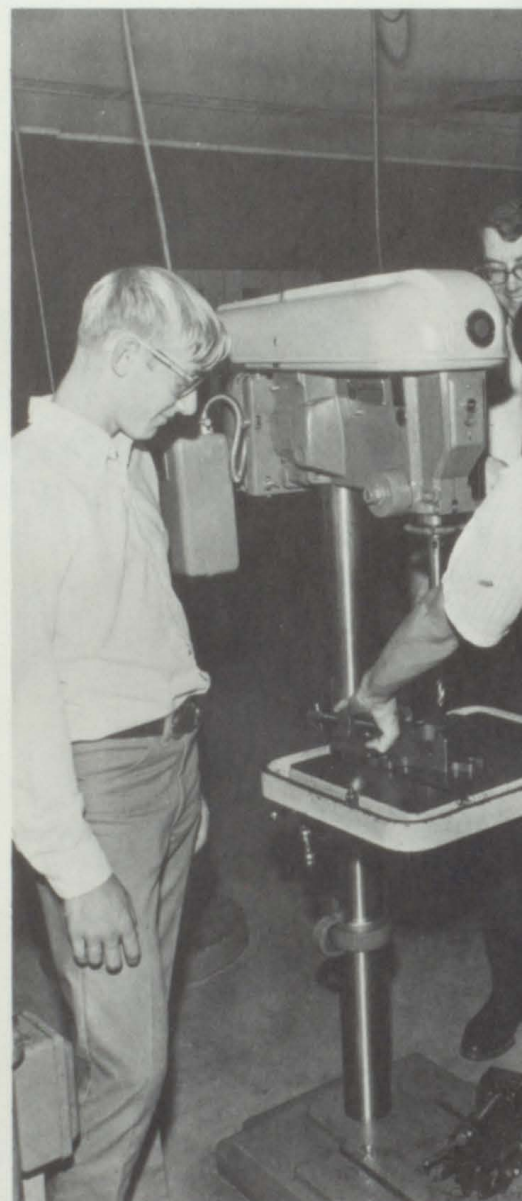

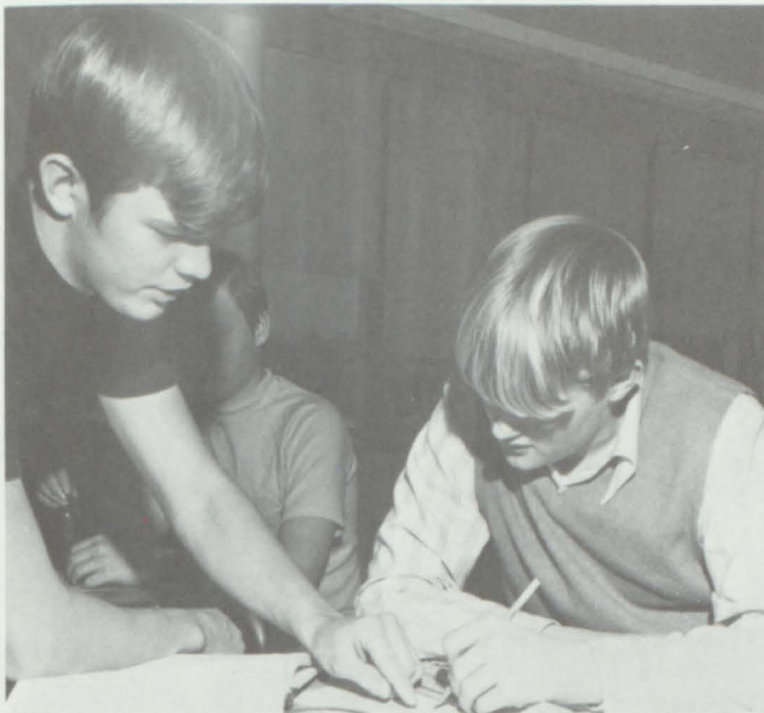

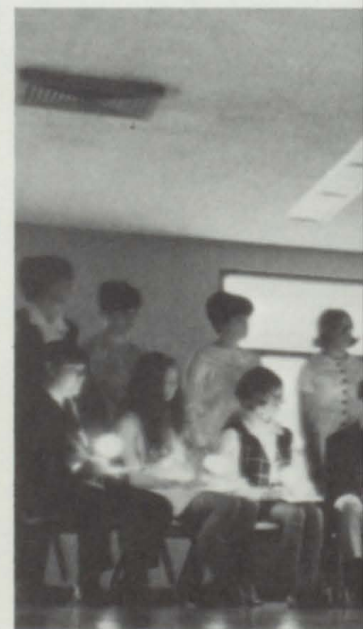

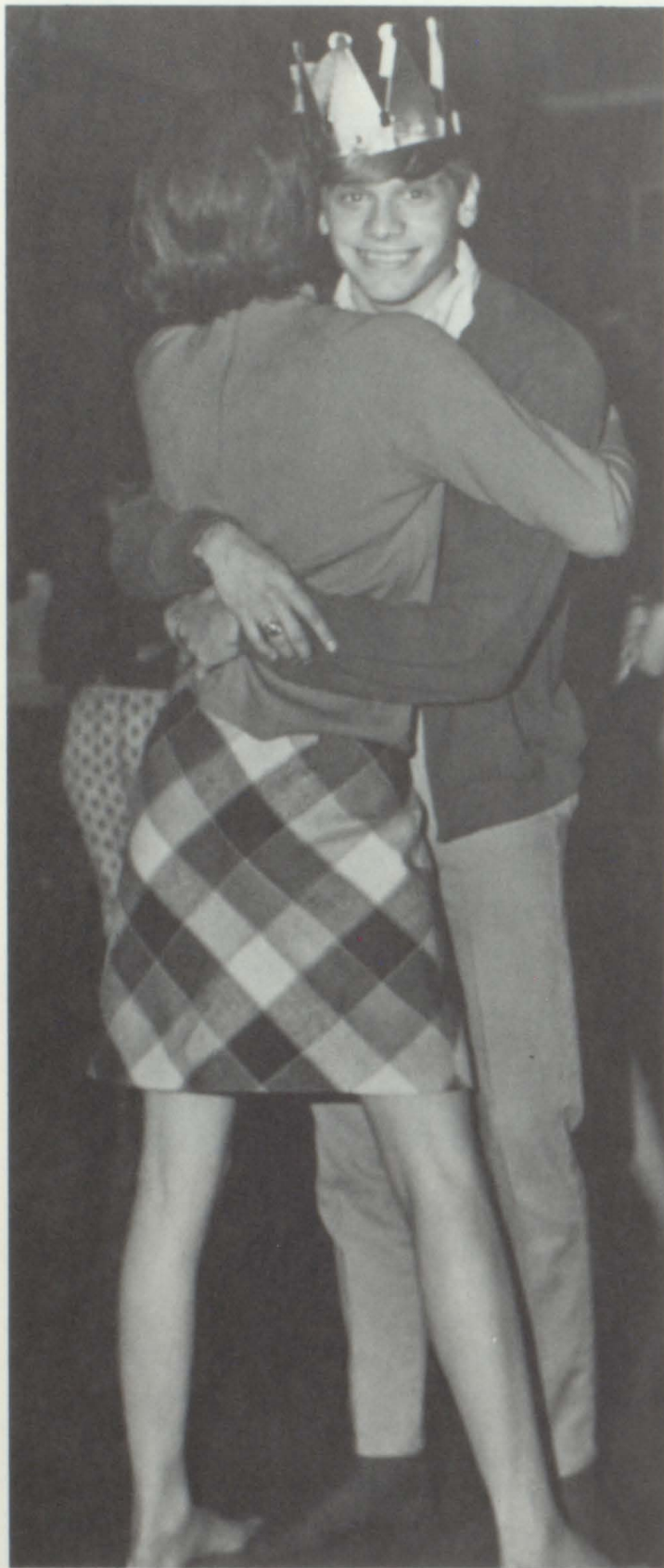

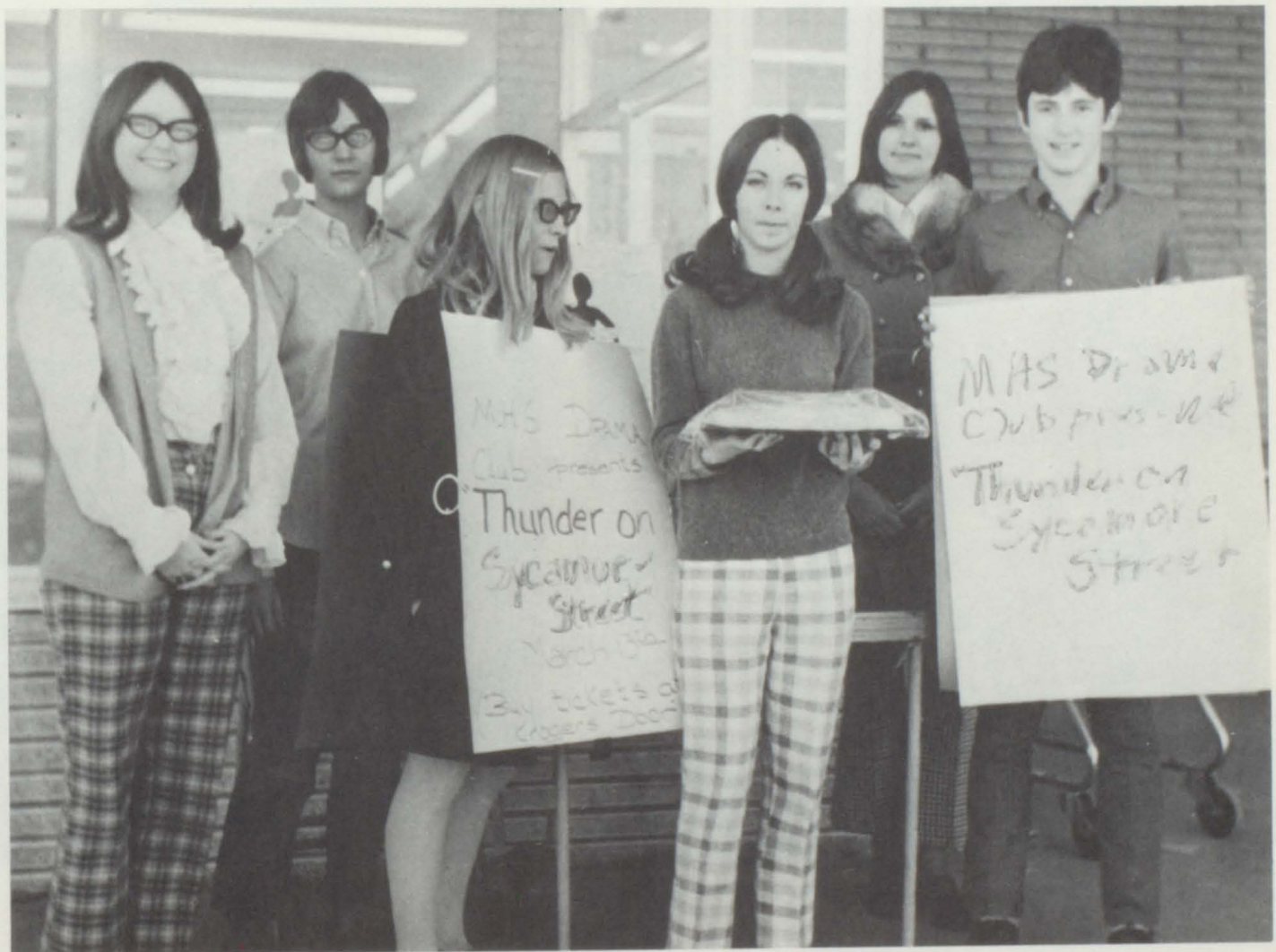

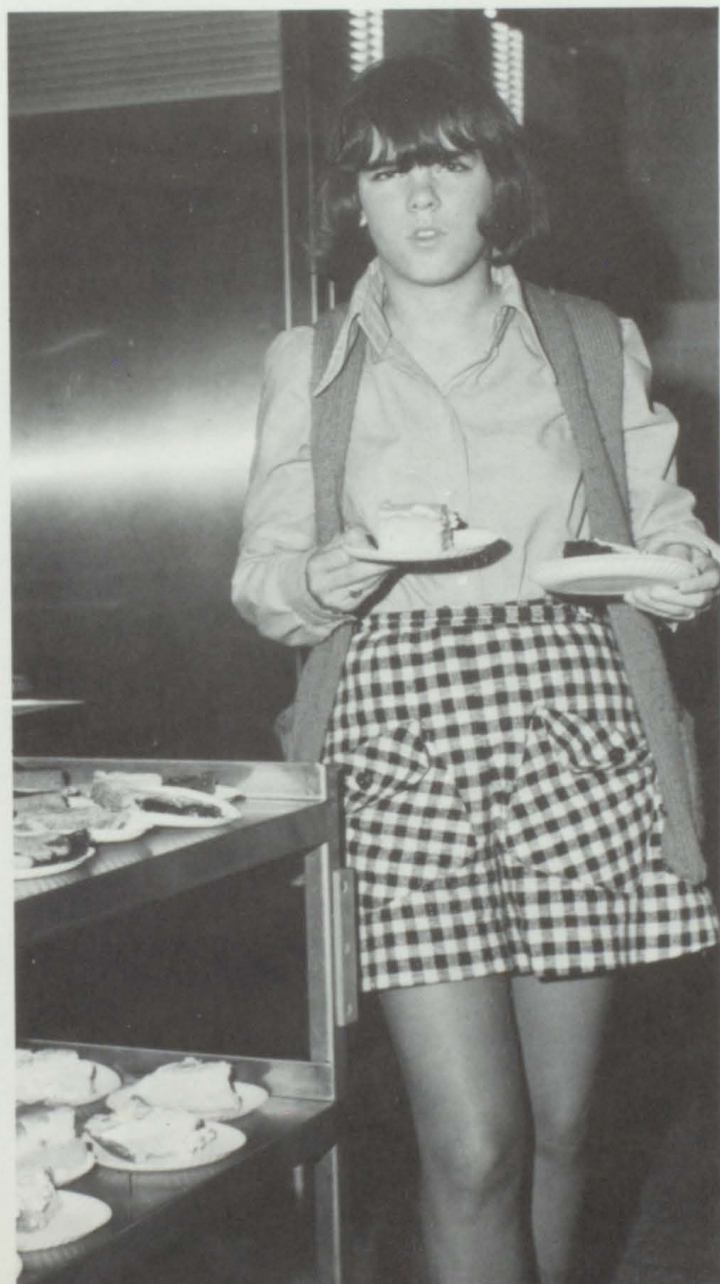

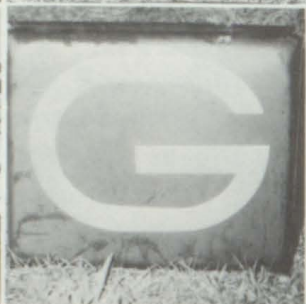

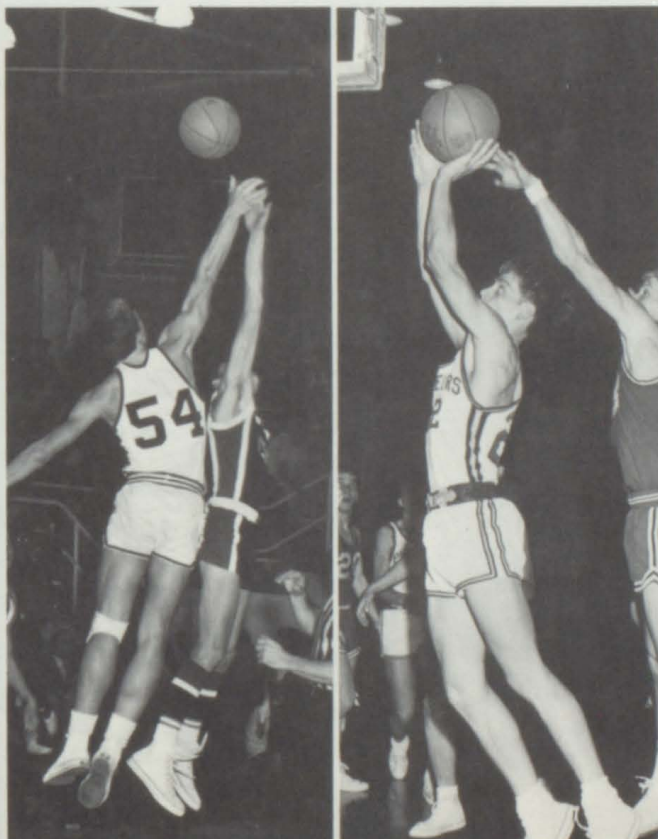

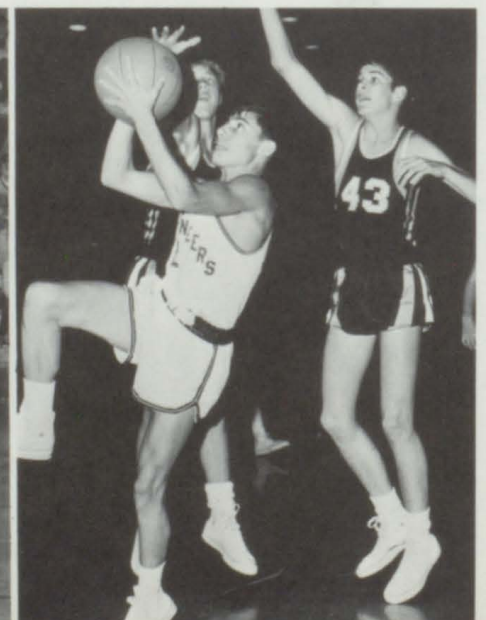

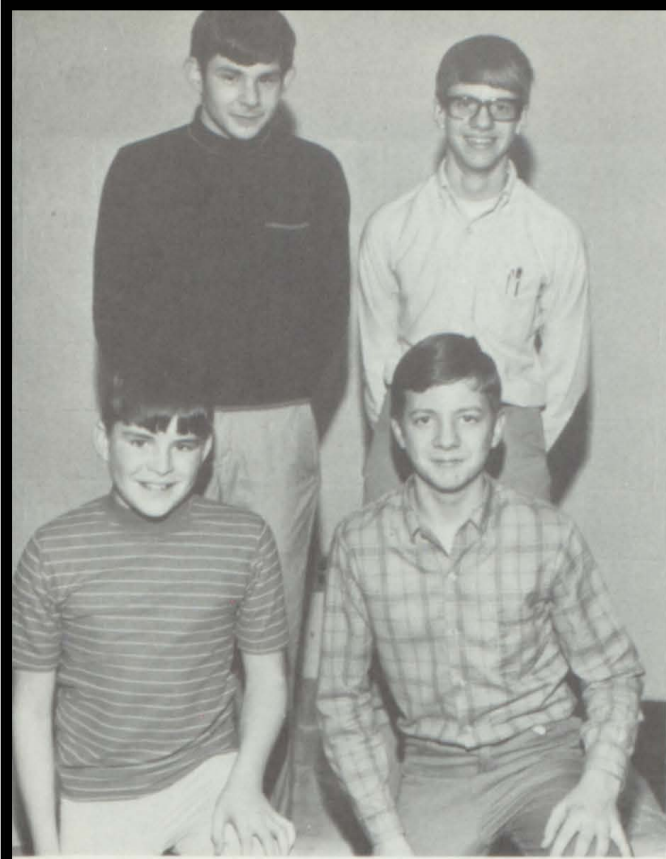

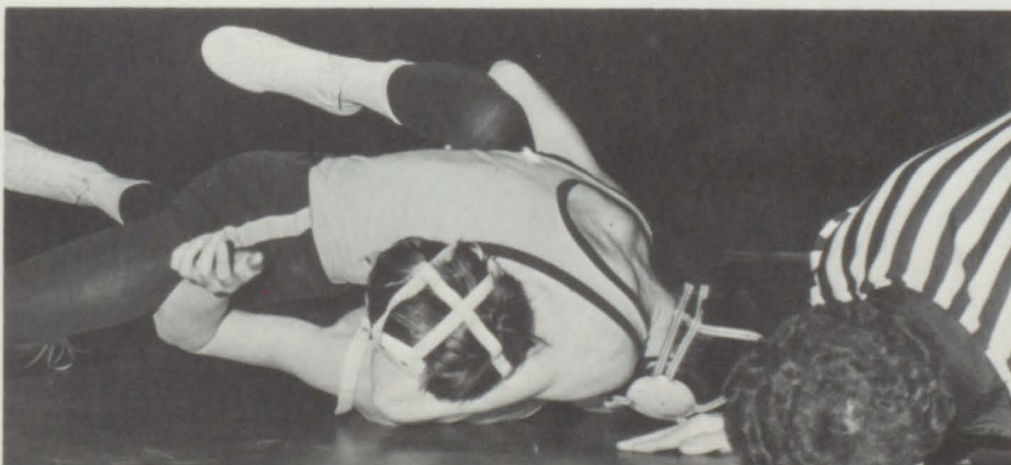

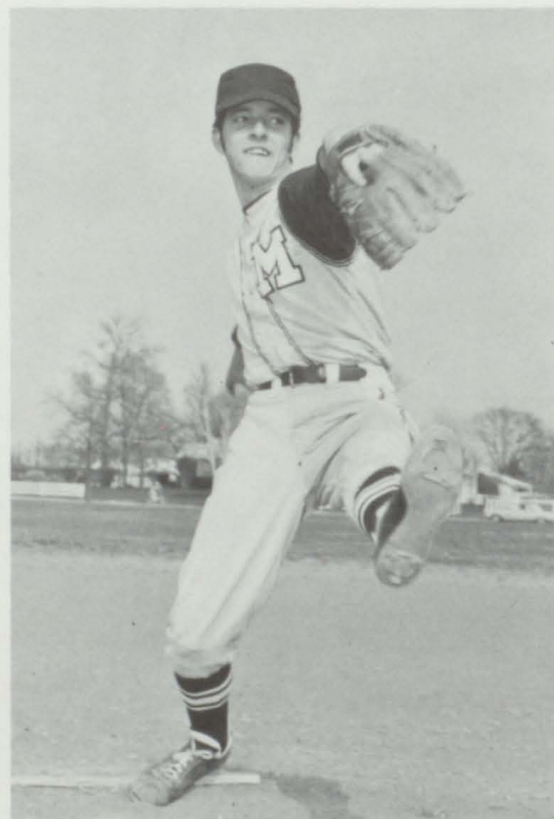

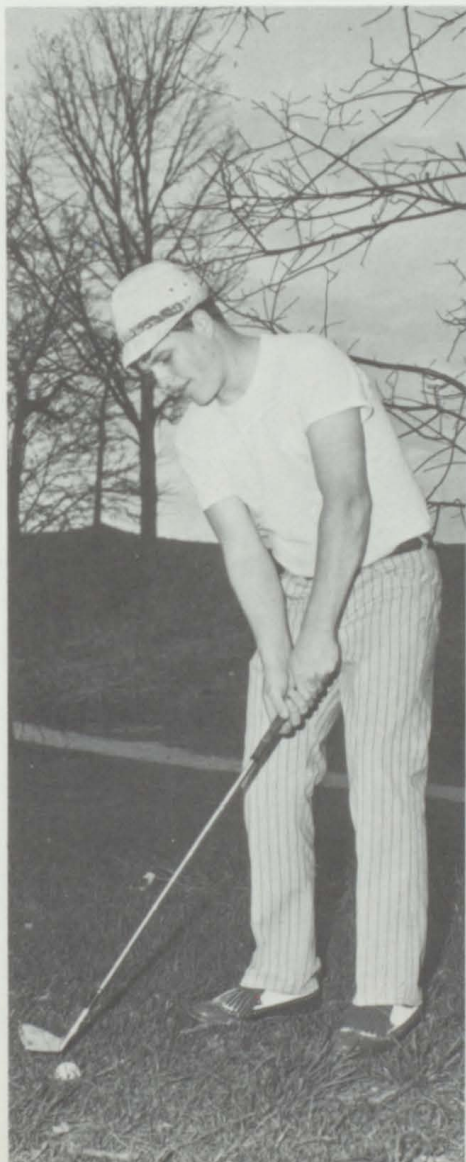
