AGERATUM Blue Cap Reselected. The flowers are much larger than those of Little Blue Star and of a deeper and richer color. It also surpasses Blue Ball in dwarfness and compactness of habit and the regular form of its inflorescence. The foliage is small and the plants have the appearance of miniature domes, quite ideal for edgings to flower borders. Trade pkt., 35c; 1/4 oz., \$1.00; oz., \$3.00.

ANTIRRHINUM

Majus Nanum, Semi-dwarf, Dorothy Silk. The flowers are fiery terra cotta with a white throat, one of the most vivid in this section. Trade pkt., 35c.

Majus Nanum, Semi-dwarf, Rust Proof, Antique Gold. A lovely variety in shades of old gold, copper, fawn, and orange. Trade pkt., 35c; 1/8 oz., \$1.00.

CALCEOLARIA, Hybrida Grandiflora Triumph Strain. An excellent strain. Bright shades of yellow, orange, red and rose; the flowers are large and mostly tigered or spotted. This strain produces bushy, shapely plants with clean foliage, not so woolly as is sometimes seen in Calceolaria. Trade pkt., \$1.25; 1/4 oz., \$3.50; 1/2 oz., \$6.00.

CALENDULA, Orange Fantasy Crested. New, true and distinct. A type never before seen. The first few rows of petals on the outside are long and beautifully twisted; the inner petals are short and fantastically curled and interlaced, piling up on top of each other in irregular fashion so as to form a heavy crest which surrounds a large, attractive, mahogany-bronze center. Flowers grow 3 3/4 inches across and are of an exceptionally deep but pleasing bronzy or coppery orange with petals edged deep mahogany-red. The plants grow 15 inches tall. CELOSIA, Royal Velvet. This 2-foot plant produces a large center head and numerous large, long-stemmed cockscombs of richest carmine, or crimson, color on basal branches. The combs are borne erect, and the foliage is bronzy green with reddish margins. Trade pkt., 25c.

CHRYSANTHEMUM, Golden Crown. Has the robust constitution of the Coronarium varieties, making vigorous well-branched plants 3 to 4 feet in height. The flowers are produced freely, and one plant will carry as many as 50 to 60 blooms. The foliage, an attractive silvery green, contrasts admirably with the bright butter-yellow flowers. The most outstanding feature of this novelty is, however, the formation of the flower. The petals are quilled and this quilling has a beautifying effect. Trade pkt., 25c.

CONVOLVULUS, Crimson Rambler. The Morning Glory and Ipomoea are necessary for the frame work or "back drop" of gardens so this gorgeous new variety will be welcome. The plant makes a dense mat of vines covered with lovely crimson flowers. Trade pkt., 25c; oz., \$1.00.

CYNOGLOSSUM Firmament. A new dwarf type of the Chinese Forget-Me-Not. It grows fifteen to eighteen inches tall, bushy, with flowers of rich blue. It can also be used as a cut flower. Does not grow weedy or rank. Trade pkt., 35c.

ECHIUM, Blue Bedder. Deep bright blue flowers in new compact variety. Trade pkt., 15c; 1/4 oz., 25c; oz., 80c.

ESCHOLTZIA, Monarch Art Shades. A compact strain of large-flowering Escholtzia in mixture which carries its flowers well above the foliage and is ideal for bedding. Entirely distinct from all other types, with neat feathered foliage, above which the flowers are freely produced. Semi-double, and of exquisite formation, the colors range through light rose to deep rose and carmine, and from deep golden yellow through all the varying tones to orange and scarlet. An almost metallic sheen gives an effect of exceptional brilliance in color and substance in flower. Trade pkt., 25c; 1/4 oz., 50c; oz., \$1.80.

FREESIAs Tubergenii. The singular form and delicious perfume of this flower have made it a great favorite. Yields a profusion of bloom and can be flowered in six months from sowing. GODETIA, Double Sybil Sherwood. The flowers are produced in profusion causing the Azalea-like plant to completely hide its foliage beneath a canopy of beautiful bright salmon pink, white edged flowers. Trade pkt., 25c; 1/4 oz., 50c; oz., \$1.60.

SUNFLOWER New Double Red. Double-flowering form of Red Sunflower. Flowers are just as large as chrysanthemum-flowered Sunflower with the characteristic brownish red color as found in ordinary Red Sunflower. Shows some variation in color and doubleness. Average percentage of doubleness runs about 40%. Trade pkt., 20c; oz., \$1.80.

HOLLYHOCK Indian Spring. Throws a central stem from the base of the plant, which finally attains to six feet or more in height. Flowering branches are produced freely from about a foot from the soil. Both stem and branches produce a continuous display of flowers. The fig-leaved foliage is light and attractive. Indian Spring, however, produces a compact pyramidal plant, with a wealth of flowers set attractively in the axils of the leaf stems. Trade pkt., 50c; 1/4 oz., \$2.25; oz., \$8.00.

IPOMOEA, New Giant Cornell. The flowers, as large as Heavenly Blue, are an intense carnelian red with pure white border, reproducing the colors of Cornell University. Growth is rapid and flowers come early, when vine is two feet tall, increasing in number until killing frosts arrive. Trade pkt., 25c; 1/4 oz., 50c; oz., \$1.60.

IPOMOEA, Scarlett O'Hara. Gold medal award of "All-America Awards." Blooms early, flowers a carnelian red sometimes called carmine, self color about 3 1/2 in. across, stays open longer than other sorts. Foliage is quite distinct, each leaf having one large and two small side lobes. Growth starts a bit slowly and it is better to help it start twining. Trade pkt., 50c; 1/4 oz., \$1.00; oz., \$3.00.

LOBELIA Compacta Duplex. Semi-double gentian blue flower. Trade pkt., 50c.

MARIGOLD

Burpee Gold. Flowers are large, 3 1/2 inches across, rich deep orange in color and Carnation-like in form; they are fully double with no singles. Plants are of an attractive habit, uniform in growth and above all the foliage is absolutely free from the usual Marigold odor. Trade pkt., 35c; 1/4 oz., 65c; oz., \$2.35.

Burpee's Red and Gold Hybrids. They grow 2 1/2 to 3 in. across. Some are solid red with a brilliance never before seen in Marigolds; others are delightful combinations of red and gold. The flowers vary in color according to season and even in different flowers on the same plant at the same time. At times they are almost pure golden-yellow and at other times bright rich mahogany-scarlet. In vividness and richness, the coloring is unsurpassed. Trade pkt., 50c.

Golden Glow. On account of this most striking resemblance, this new Marigold has been named "Golden Glow." The color is a bright, sharp golden-yellow. The flower heads are almost globular in form and measure 2 1/2 inches across. They are fully double and consist of hundreds of long tapering petals. The plants grow 26 inches high and 30 inches wide, forming very symmetrical cone-shaped mounds completely covered with flowers over the entire plant. The odorless foliage and the long branches with their clusters of flowers make this a fine Marigold for cutting, and the symmetrical free-flowering plants are splendid for beds or borders. NASTURTIUM Double Tall Indian Chief. Has the dark foliage and vivid scarlet flowers of the Single Fireball. Blooms are sweetly scented and freely produced. 1/4 oz., 40c; oz., \$1.40.

NEMESIA, Brightness. A dwarf growing variety for bedding. The color is brilliant cherry red and a mass of these plants is a very vivid display. Trade pkt., 35c.

NIEREMBERGIA Hippomanica. Grows not more than 4 to 6 inches high, forms a cushion of elegant light green foliage from which emerge corymbs of salver shaped flowers of a delicate lavender hue, 1 to 1 1/4 inches across, adorned with a clear yellow eye. Trade pkt., 50c; 1/6 oz., \$2.00.

NIGELLA, Hispanica Dragon Fly. This is quite distinct from the Miss Jekyll type. The flower is single with thick fleshy petals and strong sturdy stem. It grows from 15 to 18 inches in height—branches well. The flowers are rich dark blue with a delightful sheen on the flowers which adds to its attraction. Trade pkt., 20c; oz., \$1.00.

NOLANA Lanceolata "Blue Ensign". This is a form of the Chilean Bellflower which was brought from South America several years ago, and has since been converted by careful cultivation into a much superior plant. It can be effectively grown either under glass or in the open ground. In pots it will grow 12 to 15 inches high, or when put outdoors it spreads a little and throws up its lovely large ultramarine-blue flowers on stems 5 or 6 inches high. In shape these strongly resemble an Ipomoea and their beauty is much enhanced by the large pure white centre, which has a charming effect. Seed should be sown in spring and the plants put out about the end of April, or it may be sown outdoors in May where the plants are to bloom. Not the least of the attractions of this beautiful flower is its very agreeable odor. Trade pkt., 50c.

PANSY

Don's Winter Flowering Reselected Cutflower Mixed. Fine winter flowering strain producing long stems, making it excellent for cutting. Although the color range is not complete, it is in our opinion the best blend yet developed. 1/2 Trade pkt., \$1.00; trade pkt. (about 1,000 seeds), \$2.00.

Orchid Flowering Eldorado (Art Shades). PETUNIA

Hybrida, Hollywood Star. This is a distinct novelty with five pointed star shaped flowers of rose pink with creamy yellow throats. Leaves are narrow and elongated. Plants are at first bushy and erect, growing rather rankly toward the end of the season. Early blooming and prolific all season until killing frost. Trade pkt., 50c.

Single Small-Flowered Dwarf-Admiral. Re-selected. This is by far the best of the dwarf blue petunias. The flowers are of good size, have wavy edges and are of clear blue. Trade pkt., 75c; 1/32 oz., \$1.75.

Nana Compacta Dwarf Flaming Velvet (King Henry). Compact, globular habit, large blooms of a velvety blood red color on short stems—a Dwarf Flaming Velvet. Trade pkt., 50c; 1/32 oz., \$1.20.

Single Small Flowering Dwarf "Ladybird." This fine, compact Petunia of extraordinary brilliance was produced a few years ago by crossing the carmine variety "Queen of the Market" with a single flowering plant of the favourite Lilliput variety "Rosa Bonheur." The first is responsible for the outstanding colour, the bright carmine overlaid with scarlet. On the other hand, the Lilliput strain gave this novelty its dwarf, bushy, growth with the small, round flowers. Petunia "Ladybird" is a charming pot plant. Trade pkt., 75c.

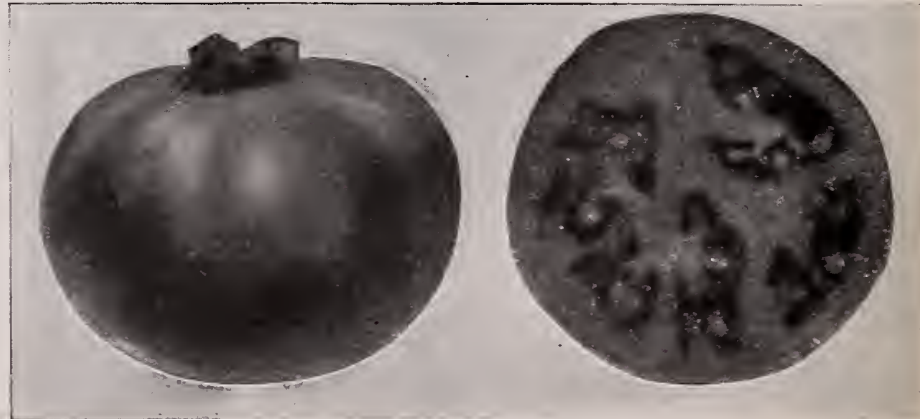

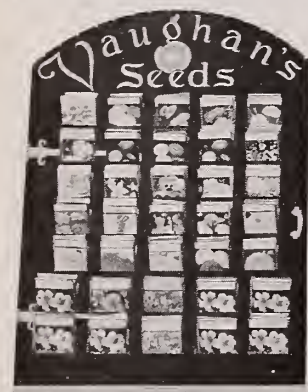
