- 1. To establish a Museum District from Allen Parkway to
 Hermann Park using Montrose Blvd. as an axis which
 proposes, encourages, and manages fiscal
 improvements within the district.
- To promote cultural and civic activities within the district and surrounding areas.
- 3. To seek funds by public and private contributions and grants.
- 4. To sponsor the coordination of activities of the area institutions.
- 5. To establish a broad based support for the association through its Board of Directors, Ex-Officio Board members, Advisory Board members and general membership.

Charles Post led a discussion concerning the budget which focused upon a \$25,000 working budget. The following activities were discussed as regards the \$25,000 budget:

- 1. Marketing Effort Printing of brochures.
- 2. Membership Drive.
- Fund Raising Activities Lunchs, publicity of Security Conference, grant activities.
