THE PREVIOUS POLICY EVIDENTLY CAME FROM THE PROVISIONS OF THE LEND-LEASE AGREEMENT. THE CABLE WAS SLIGHTLY BARBLED AND IT IS NOT CLEAR IF THE MEMO FROM THE SWNCC TECHNICAL INFORMATION SUB-COMMITTEE SET FORTH A POLICY THAT TECHNICAL INFORMATION OF CLASSIFICATIONS REFERRED TO ABOVE WOULD NOT BE DISCLOSED IF SUCH INFORMATION WAS NOT NECESSARY FOR THE PROSECUTION OF THE WAR AGAINST JAPAN OF IF THE RESULTS OF SUCH INFORMATION COULD NOT BE UTILIZED BEFORE 1 JANUARY 1947. DO YOU KNOW OF ANY MEMO APPROVED BY SWNCC OR THE T. I. SUBCOMMITTEE WHICH WAS SENT FROM THE STATE DEPARTMENT TO THE JOINT AIR COMMITTEE?

THIS PAPER CONCLUDED THAT SWNCC SHOULD BE REQUESTED TO FORMULATE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES FOR DISCLOSING TECHNICAL INFORMATION TO FOREIGN GOVERNMENTS IN THE POST-WAR PERIOD AND RECOMMENDED THAT THE WAR AND NAVY DEPARTMENTS AND THE JOINT CHIEFS OF STAFF PROVIDE SWNCC WITH A BASIC MILITARY POLICY STATEMENT REGARDING SUCH DISCLOSURES. THIS STATEMENT, WHICH APPARENTLY APPEARS IN JCS 927/8, INCLUDED THE SUBSTANCE OF JCS POLICY NO 5 AND INCLUDED ALSO GENERAL PROVISIONS FOR THE DISCLOSURE OF INFORMATION BEYOND THAT REQUIRED FOR THE PRESENT WAR EFFORT. JCS 927/8 WAS APPROVED BY THE CHIEF OF STAFF AND CG AAF BUT ADM. KING RECOMMENDED THAT IT BE RETURNED TO THE JOINT INTELLIGENCE COMMITTEE FOR A MORE DEFINITIVE POLICY TO BE AGREED BY THE WAR AND NAVY DEPARTMENTS AND THE JOINT CHIEFS OF STAFF BEFORE SUBMISSION TO ANY OTHER GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES. 

Reference is made to your letter of Recember 12, 1944 in response to the joint letter of Revember 23, 1946 from the Secretary of the Havy and sysolf with regard to the problem of obtaining pricing information and supporting data for the United Hingdom reciprocal aid account.

held in London by representatives of the Foreign Rossomic Administration, the Clearing House for Foreign Transactions and Reports and our own representatives, from which we have concluded that although the British Government has now agreed to furnish more pricing data than in the past, they have not agreed to furnish complete pricing information or supporting data.

The position of the War Repartment, accordingly, remains as stated in the joint letter of November 22, 1944 referred to above. The War Repartment believes that the manpower and accounting proklems mentioned in your letter of Recember 12, 1944 can now be met in view of the victory in Europe. The War Repartment believes the British Government should provide the U.S. Government with the same detailed information with respect to reciprocal aid as the U.S. Government provides the British Government with respect to lend-lease aid. The State Repartment is therefore requested to ask the British Government to provide the information desired by the War Repartment now that hostilities have ended in Surope.

If the State Department is not willing to press the British for the objectives deemed essential by the War Department, as stated in the joint letters to you of October 4 and November 22, 1946 from the Secretary of the Navy and myself, the War Department.
