

Mr. Yriart, Uruguayan Embassy, called on 'phone having been referred to DS by RPA, and stated that a Uruguayan business man was in San Francisco, having purchased a ticket at Montevideo from PANAM for Tokyo, and he appears to be without documentation to enter Japan. Mr. Yriart said the telegram seems to be furnishing additional information but the Embassy has had nothing previous on the case. He wondered if PANAM would sell a ticket to Tokyo to a person who was not documented to enter.

I informed him (on the first call) that Uruguay had a diplomatic representative at Tokyo named Mr. Fleurquin and that the Consul at San Francisco should telegraph the Uruguayan representative giving him the necessary information to enable SCAP to issue a MP. He called again and said the Uruguayan representative was withdrawn about four months ago. He thought Sweden had represented Uruguay previous to that but not at present. I informed him that the Department had never heard of the withdrawal of the Uruguayan representative.

(PMPB-Army Dept.)

Mrs. Flickinger suggested that the State Department send a cable to SCAP to find out if the Uruguayan representative has been withdrawn and if so who is its Protecting Power. It has been drafted.

4/6/49 Mr. Yriart authorized that the cable be charged to the Uruguayan Embassy.

My dear Captain Hendricks:

Reference is made to memoranda from your office of January 24 and March 11, 1949 regarding intransit clearance for Japan for Mrs. Anna N. Slenkina. In the memorandum of January 24, 1949 it stated the several conditions which would have to be complied with before the Theater could consider the granting of an intransit clearance to Mrs. Slenkina. All of the conditions stipulated in the memorandum referred to have been complied with except the issuance of a visa to Mrs. Slenkina.

In this connection there is enclosed a copy of a telegram from the American Consulate at Dairen which was sent to the Acting United States Political Adviser at Tokyo on April 11, 1949 as number 7 and repeated to the Department as number 103. For the reason stated in the Consulate's telegram under reference it would appear desirable to inquire of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers at Tokyo whether intransit clearance is now given for any or all of the cases mentioned in the enclosed telegram and, if so, whether or not the American Consulate at Dairen is to be notified direct by the Acting Political Adviser at Tokyo.

The Division of Protective Services would appreciate being informed of any decision reached by the Supreme Commander.






