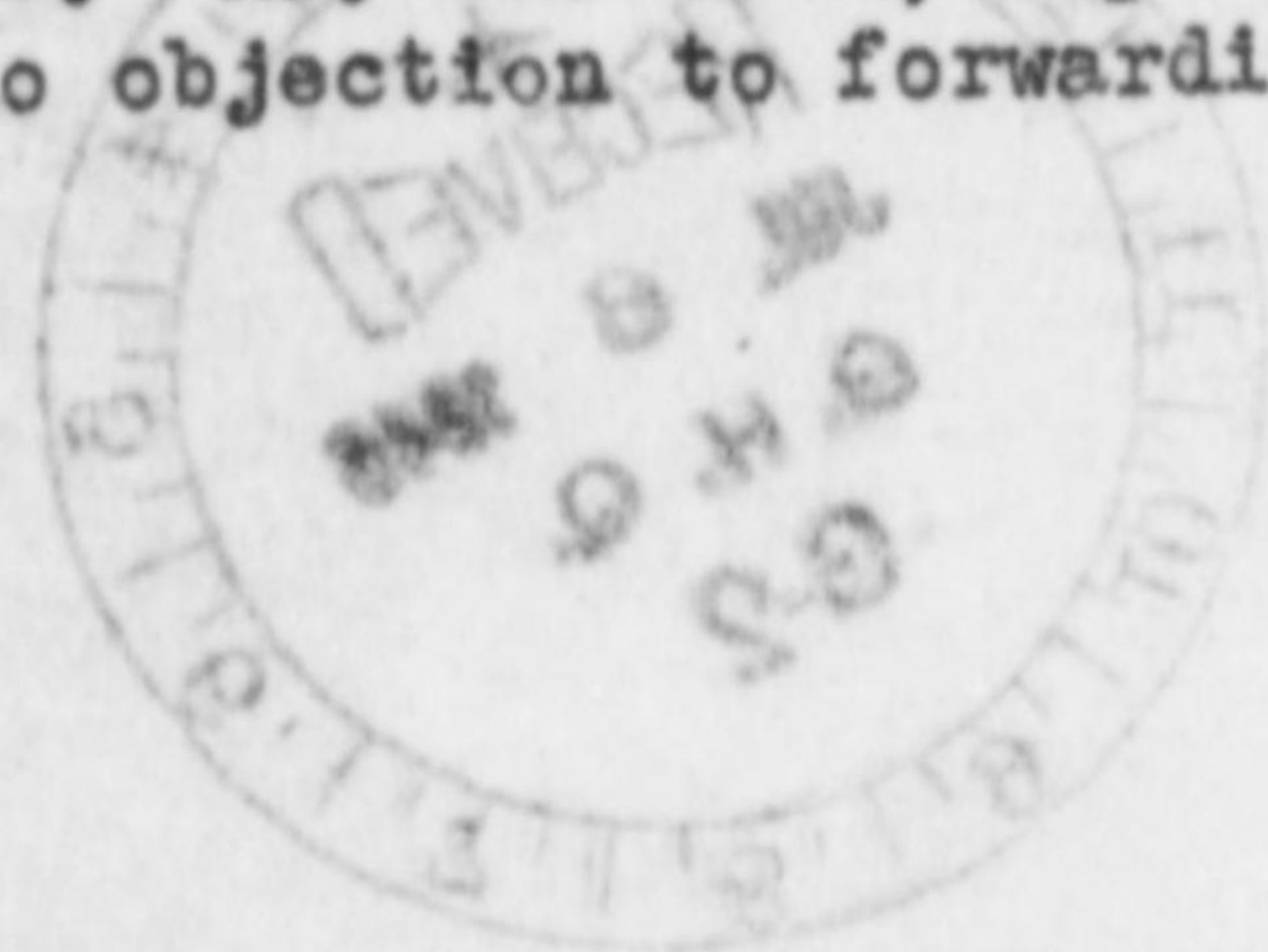
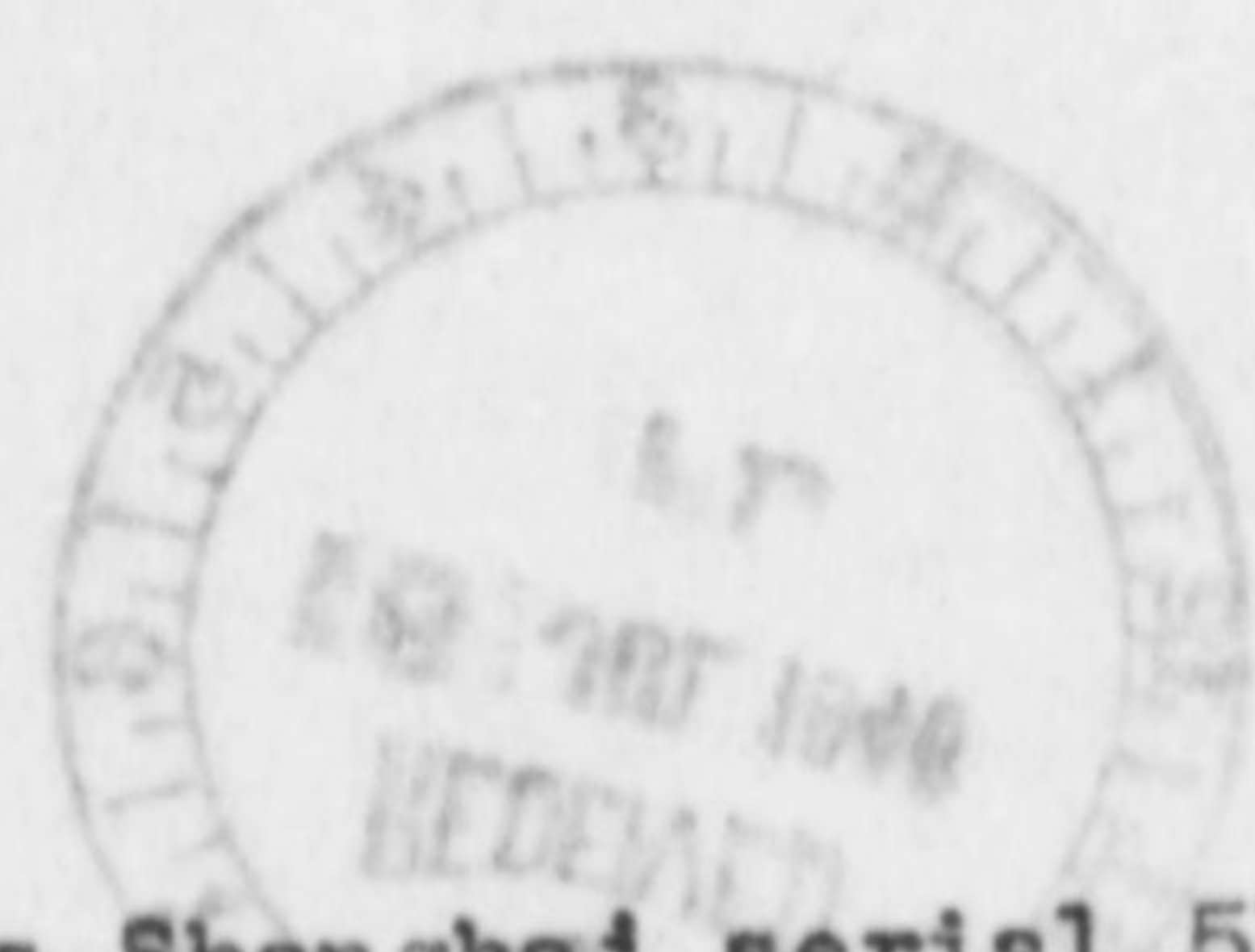

The Diplomatic Section of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, presents its compliments to the Chinese Mission in Japan and has the honor to refer to the Mission's communication of June 6, 1946 requesting that transportation be arranged from Rabaul, New Britain, to Hongkong for approximately 2,500 Chinese prisoners of war and internees.

It is regretted that General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, is not in position to be of direct assistance in this matter as the question of the assignment of shipping for this purpose is one which lies without its purview to determine. If neither China nor Australia possesses the necessary shipping and if it is desired to obtain shipping from the United States, the problem might be taken up with the United States Government through diplomatic channels.

A copy of this note is being sent to the Australian Political Liaison Officer for his information.
