

Schraper, Edward. A German Gestapo agent; came to Sweden in the fall of 1943; since then been held as a political refugee in Harnosund, Sweden; fled from the camp recently; is being hunted by the Swedish police; through the Swedish magazine Kyrkor Under Korset he was able to collect funds for the German soldiers at the eastern front. Before 1939 he was a Gestapo agent in Denmark; later appeared in Esthonia, where he remained until the Russians came, when he escaped to Finland. GHS 12 D 44 6-6.

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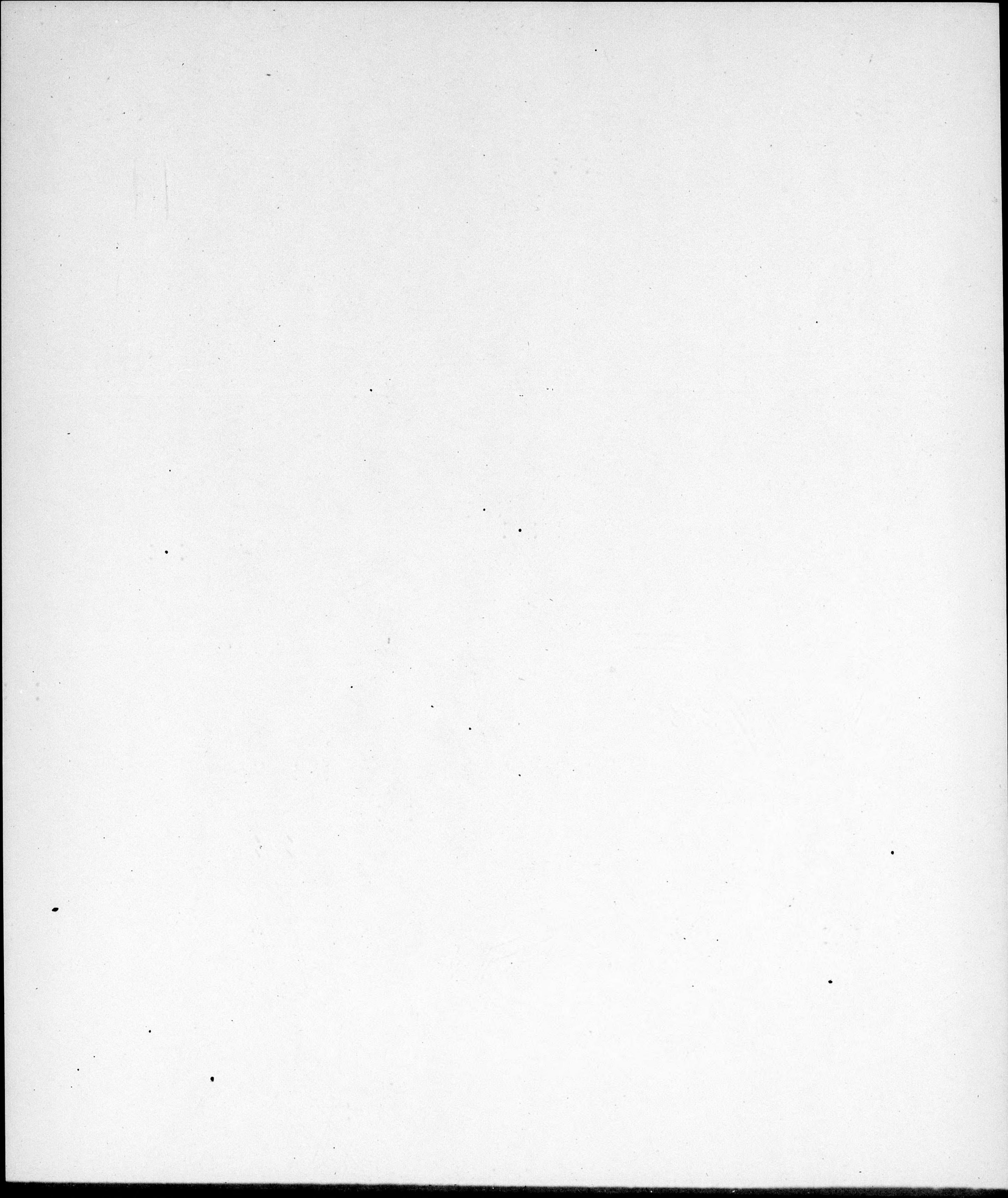
