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PART I

INTRODUCTION

Current Annual Report

This report presents statistics on patients in private hospitals for mental disease and in general hospitals which admit for in-patient care persons with actual or suspected primary diagnoses of mental disease. As a generic term such hospitals are described here as "general hospitals with psychiatric facilities." This term does not imply the existence of a separate ward or a department of psychiatry in the hospital.

The data are based on schedules received for the 27th annual census of patients in mental institutions, the sixth such census to be conducted by the National Institute of Mental Health.

The tabulations made are comparable to those in earlier publications. They consist of a bookkeeping account of the flow of mental patients into and out of the hospital, statistics on the characteristics of first admissions to private mental hospitals and on all admissions to general hospitals.

The generous cooperation of the various superintendents and directors and their staff is gratefully acknowledged. Without their assistance this report could not be made.

Previous Reports

A detailed historical account of the development of the Annual Census of Mental Patients can be found in Patients In Mental Institutions: 1947 pp. 1-4, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C.

The first census in essentially its present form was conducted in 1923 and covered all types of hospitals. The next year in which private hospitals were surveyed was 1931 and they have been included in the annual survey from then on. General hospitals were not included after 1923 until 1933 and not again until 1939 since which year they have been covered annually.

Parts I and II of the Public Health Service Publication No. 483, dealing with public institutions for mental defectives and epileptics and public hospitals for mental disease respectively, have been published. This is Part III. One more part, dealing with private institutions for mental defectives and epileptics, will be published shortly. The issuance of separate volumes was started to expedite publication and to permit greater flexibility in tabulation, collection and processing of data on these hospitals.

PART II

SCOPE OF THE DATA

Purpose

The survey is designed to provide information as to the extent of use of these hospital facilities for the mentally ill in each State and to furnish basic data on a national level on the characteristics of first admissions to private mental hospitals and of all admissions to general hospitals.

Coverage

The period covered in this report is for the calendar or fiscal year 1952. Certain hospitals report for fiscal years ending June 30 or March 31, but the majority of the hospitals report for the year ending December 31.

Reporting of movement of population data was completed for 193 of the 277 known private to spitals included in the survey in 1952. However, only 171 of these reporting hospitals supplied data on first admissions by age, sex and diagnosis. Comparable figures for the general hospitals showthat 299 of the 533 hos-

pitals in the survey reported data on movement of patient population and 283 of these reported data on all admissions by diagnosis and sex. It should be pointed out that 1952 was the first year in which a large number of these general hospitals were requested to report. It has long been known that coverage of general hospitals in the survey was inadequate. Therefore, in 1952 the National Institute of Mental Health conducted a survey of all general hospitals in the United States to ascertain which of these hospitals admitted as in-patients those persons with known or suspected diagnosis of mental illness for either diagnosis or treatment or both. As a result of this survey the number of general hospitals to be included in the annual census increased from 163 in 1951 to 533 in 1952. The number of general hospitals reporting in 1952 was 299 as compared to 149 in 1951. Subsequent years will show a larger number of general hospitals included in the census as the balance of the results of the special study of general hospitals is incorporated. It can also be expected that the number



of hospitals reporting will increase since many of these hospitals were surveyed for the first time in 1952 and had difficulty in preparing usable reports. Improvement in the number

of usable reports is expected as record librarians become more aware of the reporting requirements.

PART III

DEFINITIONS

Type of Hospital Included

Private hospitals

These hospitals are, in general, hospitals operated by private individuals, corporations or non-profit associations for the care and treatment of persons with mental illness. Hospitals or sanatoria for the exclusive care of the alcoholic, or the aged or places classified as rest homes are included only where it is known that such facilities offer psychiatric care.

The group of private hospitals includes several hospitals which are technically classified as belonging in other types of control. These are as follows:

The DeJarnette State Sanitarium, Staunton, Virginia.

This State hospital while publicly operated is treated as a private hospital. Its funds do not come from tax sources and in all aspects it is operated as a private mental hospital.

The Yale Psychiatric Institute, New Haven, Connecticut; Henry Phipps Psychiatric Clinic, Baltimore, Maryland; Eastern Pennsylvania Psychiatric Hospital (formerly the Institute of the Pennsylvania Hospital) Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; and the Pennsylvania Hospital, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

All of these hospitals are large units of general hospitals, or are in a medical center group or due to other special circumstances contain psychiatric units which are more closely associated with private hospitals rather than general hospital operation. In all cases the usual length of stay, independent operation and type of services offered are comparable to those in private hospitals. Therefore these hospitals were so classified.

General Hospitals with Psychiatric Facilities

These hospitals include all known general hospitals which routinely admit as in-patients persons with primary diagnosis of known or suspected mental illness for diagnosis or for

diagnosis and treatment. General hospital which provide holding facilities only or whic admit such patients on an emergency basis ar excluded where known. Specialized hospital such as orthopedic, childrens, etc., are als excluded. Some of these hospitals have psy chiatric facilities but by definition these hospitals would not admit patients with primar diagnosis of known or suspected mental illness General hospitals include both public and pri vate hospitals and no attempt is made to sep arate these groups. However, Federal general hospitals and territorial hospitals ar excluded from the report.

Data on Movement of Patient Population

Statistics on the movement of population present a formal accounting of the flow of mental patients into and out of hospitals during the year. The classification employed covers patients on the books at the beginning of the year admissions, separations and patients on the books at the end of the year. The reade should be aware that data pertaining to admissions and separations count transactions are not individual patients so that duplication catexist. Each of the categories used, with subclasses where necessary, is listed and define below:

- 1. Patients on the books at beginning ar end of the year. All patients on the books the hospital at the time stated, classified lactual location as follows:
- (a) In hospital: Patients physically prese or accounted present under the rules governing such matters in hospitals (that is "res dent patients)."
- (b) In extramural care: Patients on the books of the hospital but not in actual resident (that is, subject to hospital jurisdiction be residing in a location other than the hospit proper). This movement item applies to provate hospitals but not to general hospital
- 2. Admissions other than transfers. A patients who enter the hospital or the psych atric facility during the course of a year a designated as admissions. Admissions, oth than transfers, are further classified as fir admissions and readmissions.
- (a) First admissions: Includes all patien admitted to a private mental hospital without



a record of previous care (that is, a record of an admission and a formal discharge) in such a public or private hospital anywhere. The term is usually applied exclusively within a given type of hospital, that is -- a patient going from a hospital for mental disease to an institution for mental defectives and epileptics, or vice versa, is considered a discharge from the first institution and a first admission to the second, not a transfer or a readmission. In general hospitals a first admission is defined as a patient without a record of a previous admission and discharge from the psychiatric facilities of the hospital to which he is being admitted. It is obvious that such definition is not comparable to the one used by most public and private hospitals for mental disease.

(b) Readmissions: This category comprises patients admitted with a record of previous treatment as indicated above.

3. Separations Other Than Transfers. All patients who are removed from the custody of the hospital are designated as separations. Separations, other than transfers, are the result of discharge or death.

(a) Discharges: These represent patients who are formally removed from the custody of the hospital. Such patients are discharged directly from the hospital or in private hospitals may be discharged from either the hospital or from extramural care.

(b) Deaths: These represent patients who die while in the hospital and, in the case of private hospitals, who die while either in the hospital or in extramural care.

4. Transfers. Transfers as a classification do not exist in general hospitals and all patients leave the hospital either by discharge or death. However, certaintypes of discharges are similar to transfers in that the purpose of discharge is the removal of a patient to a mental hospital for further treatment. These patients are classified as "discharge to State

or other mental hospitals during the year." In private hospitals transfers are defined as patients shifted within the same State from the supervision of one mental hospital to another, without a formal discharge.

Nomenclature

The diagnostic categories used in the collection of data on mental disorders for this report are based on the classifications adopted by the American Psychiatric Association in 1934 and published in the "Standard Nomenclature of Disease" pp. 100-107 in 1942 by the American Medical Association.

This is the last annual census publication which will have data so collected. In 1952 the American Psychiatric Association adopted and American Medical Association approved a revision of the nomenclature. All subsequent reports will be in terms of the revised nomenclature as it appears in the Section on Diseases of the Psychobiologic Unit of the "Standard Nomenclature of Diseases and Operations", American Medical Association, 1952. The nomenclature also appears in the "Diagnostic and Statistical Manual - Mental Disorders", American Psychiatric Association, 1952.

Characteristics of First Admissions

First admissions by age, sex, and diagnosis are tabulated for private mental hospitals. Age is computed as of the last birthday prior to admission.

Characteristics of All Admissions

These data include all admissions to the psychiatric facilities of general hospitals and are tabulated by diagnosis, and sex.

PART IV

LIMITATIONS OF THE DATA

In theory, rates computed for resident paients and first admissions to private hospitals combined with public hospitals provide a basis or inference as to the variations in the previence and incidence of serious mental disease mong the several States. However, there are inumber of reasons why such inferences canot be made. A full discussion of these points made in Part II of this volume. In addition the above reasons there are certain probems peculiar to the private and general hospitals which are indicated below:

Private Hospitals

Persons admitted to private hospitals are usually not subject to any admitting procedures which require the patient to have legal residence in the State of location of the hospital as is the case with public mental hospitals. Therefore, not all persons hospitalized in private hospitals in a State can be assumed to be residents of that State. Rates computed assuming this will not be valid. They will be understated if more residents of the State are

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hospitalized out of the State than non-residents in the State and overstated when the reverse is true.

The location of private hospitals by State is based on the suitability of the location in terms of economic factors and the desires of the owners. Therefore, distribution of such hospital beds is not equal among States or necessarily based on the use of such facilities by citizens of the State in which the hospital is located.

Finally, the entrance of a patient into a private hospital is based on his own needs or desires or upon those of his family or guardian as an alternative to other types of hospitalization. For this reason the number of such persons hospitalized or entering a hospital can be treated only as a measure of the private hospital service utilized and not as measures of prevalence or incidence. In similar fashion the discharge of a patient from a private hospital may be based on the needs or desires of the patient or his family or their financial ability to pay the charges involved and not

necessarily on the achievement of maximum hospital benefit.

General Hospitals

The considerations described above for pri vate hospitals apply in varying degrees to gen eral hospitals as well. In addition to these th general hospital offers a distinctive type o service. It may perform diagnostic work-u only, or do treatment. Due to the nature c the general hospital operation, most patient are given either diagnosis or diagnosis an treatment and then discharged to their own o family custody or to another hospital. On th average, residence in the general hospitals i less than two weeks. Patients requiring mor extended hospitalization are usually discharge to mental hospitals. These discharges woul be counted again as first or readmissions b the admitting hospital. To this extent there i duplication in the counting of admissions, whe data for all hospitals are combined.
