Instead of simply passing through wickets, as in Croquet, the player has stakes, swinging balls and joker, to play for, and by a skilful stroke may carom from the stakes to the swinging balls, from the swinging balls to the joker, and from the joker to a playing ball, etc., thereby making two counts with one stroke.

This Game is less difficult to learn than Croquet, but there is opportunity for more skilful and accurate play.

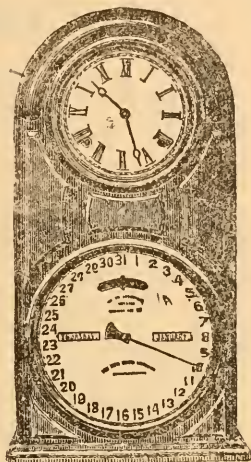

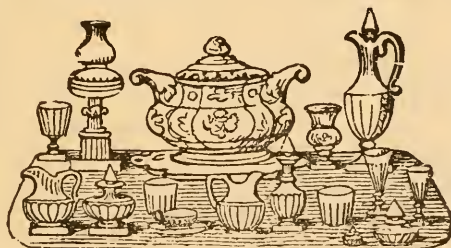

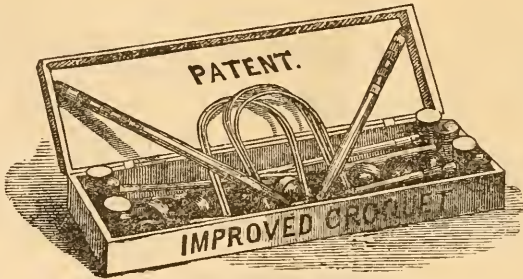
