LIGHT HOUSES.

On the Coast of Nova Scotia; The Coast of New Brunswick and the United States in the Bay of Fundy; and at Cape Race, Newfoundland.

Hon. PETER MITCHELL, Minister of Marine and Fisheries, Ottawa.

MEAGHER'S BEACH—East side Halifax harbour. *A fixed white light*, elevated 58 ft. above sea level, and visible 10 miles.

DEVIL'S ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. W. point of Devil's Island, Eastern Passage entrance to Halifax harbour. *A fixed red light*, to distinguish it from Sambro and Meagher's Beach lights, elevated 45 ft.; visible 8 miles. Octagonal dark brown tower, with a white belt between the balcony and lantern, to distinguish it in day time.

SAMBRO ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. W. side of the entrance to Halifax harbour. *A fixed white light*, elevated 115 ft. above the sea, visible in clear weather from 20 to 25 miles. White Octagonal Building, Lat. $44^{\circ} 26'$ N. Long. $63^{\circ} 35'$ W. A fog trumpet has been placed on Sambro Island, in operation during thick or foggy weather. Each blast of five seconds duration, with intervals of 20 seconds, audible 6 to 10 miles in calm weather. In case of accident to the trumpet, signal guns from ships will be answered by the discharge of two 24 pounders in succession.

West from Halifax.

PEGGY'S POINT LIGHT—East point of entrance to St. Margaret's Bay. *A fixed red light*, about 65 ft. above high water. Square White Building standing about 40 yards from the shore. Lat. $44^{\circ} 29'$ N. Long. $63^{\circ} 57'$ W.

CHESTER LIGHT, ON IRON BOUND ISLAND—Entrance to Mahone Bay. Two *fixed white lights*, apart from each other 25 feet horizontally, visible from sea from W. S. W. to N. E., elevated 50 feet above high water. Lat. $44^{\circ} 26' 15''$ N. Long. $64^{\circ} 4' 10''$ W.

CROSS ISLAND LIGHT—Upon the S. E. point of the island. *Two lights placed vertically, 44 feet apart, the lower light is fixed; the upper one flashing at intervals of a minute*, visible 14 miles. Building red, Lantern painted black. Lat. $44^{\circ} 19'$ N. Long. $64^{\circ} 9'$ W.

BATTERY POINT LIGHT—At the entrance to Lunenburg harbour. *A fixed white light*, visible 12 miles. White square building. This harbour is easy of access, spar buoys are placed in the bay and entrance to the harbour on the Sculpin Rock, Haddock Shoal, Battery Point Shoal, and Head Shoal. In approaching the harbour from seaward the buoy on Sculpin Rock, painted red and black in horizontal stripes, may be left on either hand, giving it a berth of two cable's length. The other buoys are painted black and must be left on the port hand going in.

IRON-BOUND ISLAND LIGHT—Entrance to LaHave River. *A bright flash light*, of 20 seconds duration, followed by eclipses of 30 seconds. The lantern is on a square white tower, on the southern side of the island. 70 ft. above sea level, visible from all points of approach.

MOSER'S ISLAND LIGHT—West side of the entrance to LaHave River. *A fixed red light*, on the S. E. point of the island. Square white building, 58 ft. above sea level, standing 100 ft. from the cliff. Lat. $44^{\circ} 12'$ N. Long. $63^{\circ} 18'$ W.

PORT MEDWAY HARBOUR LIGHT—On Admiralty Head, West side of the entrance to the port. Square white building, with a black square

in the centre of the seaward sides. *A fixed white light*, 44 ft. above sea level, visible 10 miles. Spar buoys are placed in the channel to Port Medway harbour, on the breaking ledges, Nautilus Rock, corner ground, and edge of flats off Bangs' Point. In passing in from seaward the red buoys must be left on the starboard, and black buoys on the port hand.

LIVERPOOL LIGHT—South end of Coffin's Island. *A revolving light*, appearing full at intervals, of two minutes, 80 ft. above sea level. Building octagonal, in red and white horizontal stripes, visible 16 miles.

FORT POINT LIGHT—Entrance to the inner harbour of Liverpool. *A white fixed light*, visible from all points of approach, and must be left on the larboard hand when entering the harbour.

LITTLE HOPE ISLAND LIGHT—Off Liverpool. *A revolving red light*, 40 ft. above high water, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute. Situated nearly in the centre of the island. Lat. $43^{\circ} 48' 31''$ N. Long. $64^{\circ} 47' 15''$ W. The lantern is placed on the top of the keeper's dwelling, which is painted white.

GULL ROCK LIGHT—Off the entrance to Ragged Island harbour. *A white fixed light*, 51 ft. above sea level. Square white building. Lat. $43^{\circ} 39'$ N. Long. $64^{\circ} 66'$ W.

SHELBOURNE LIGHT—On the S. E. point of McNutt's Island, at the entrance of the harbour. *Two white lights vertical*—the upper light 100 ft. above sea level, and visible 18 miles; the lower light 38 ft. below the lantern at the top of the building, and visible 10 miles. Building painted black and white in vertical stripes.

BARRINGTON LIGHT—On Baccaro Point, E. side of the entrance to the harbour. *A revolving light*, bright 15 seconds and dark 25 seconds, elevated 49 ft., visible 12 miles. Square white building, with a black ball on the seaward side.

CAPE SABLE ISLAND LIGHT—*A red fixed light*. Octagonal white building. Lat. $43^{\circ} 27'$ N. Long. $65^{\circ} 36'$ W. High water at Cape Sable, full and change, at $7\frac{1}{2}$ o'clock. Spring tides rise 12 ft., neaps 6 ft.

SEAL ISLAND LIGHT—The first light on approaching the Bay of Fundy is on the S. point of Seal Island. *A fixed white light*, 80 feet above high water, and may be seen, when approaching, from any point of the compass, at the distance of 18 or 20 miles. Octagonal white building. *The Blonde Rock* lies about $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles S. by W. from the light house. Between this rock and the island there are some dangers; the ground is rocky throughout, and large vessels ought not to attempt passing between them.

PUBNICO HARBOUR LIGHT—On the S. E. side of the entrance to the harbour, about 18 miles northerly of Cape Sable. *A fixed white light*, 28 ft. above high water, (rise and fall 12 feet.) Square white building, standing 50 fathoms from low water mark.

FISH ISLAND LIGHT—On Big Fish Island, E. side of the entrance to Tusket River. *Two fixed horizontal white lights*, visible 12 miles.

YARMOUTH LIGHT—On the island of Cape Forchu, West side of the entrance to the harbour. *A bright revolving light*, 145 ft. above sea level, visible quarter minute and invisible half a minute. Seen in clear weather 18 or 20 miles. Building red and white in vertical stripes. Lat. $43^{\circ} 48'$ N. Long. $66^{\circ} 09'$ W.

CAPE ST. MARY'S LIGHT—East side of entrance to St. Mary's Bay, Digby Co. *A revolving light*, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute, and showing alternately red and white faces, 100 ft. above high water. White octagonal building. Lat. $44^{\circ} 04'$ N. Long. $66^{\circ} 08'$ W.

BRIER ISLAND LIGHT—Situated on the western side. *A fixed white light*, 92 ft. above sea level, visible 15 miles. Octagonal white building.

WESTPORT LIGHTS—On Peter's Island, at the S. entrance of the E. side of the Bay of Fundy. *Two white fixed lights*, placed horizontally, to distinguish it from Brier Island Light, 40 feet above high water mark, visible 10 miles, and is intended to lead vessels into Westport, or through Grand Passage. Square white building.

BOAR'S HEAD LIGHT—N. entrance Petite Passage, Bay of Fundy. *Alternate flashes, red and white*, at intervals of 60 seconds. Square white building.

DIGBY GUT LIGHT—On Point Prim, at the entrance of the Gut. *A fixed white light*, 76 ft. above high water, and visible 13 miles. Building square, painted red and white vertically.

PORT WILLIAMS LIGHT—*Two fixed white lights*, 20 ft. apart, perpendicularly, visible from all points of approach. Square white building. Port Williams is distant from Digby Gut Light E. 25 miles; and from Black Rock W. 28 miles.

MARGARETVILLE LIGHT—*A red fixed light*, visible 10 miles from all points of approach. Building square, painted in white and black horizontal stripes. Margaretville is distant E. 37 miles from Digby Gut Light, and W. 15 miles from Black Rock Light.

BLACK ROCK LIGHT—*A white fixed light*, 55 ft. above the level of high water, and visible 12 miles. Square white building.

SPENCER'S POINT—*A white fixed light* is placed on the top of a building at this point, on the northern shore of Cobiquid Bay, near the head of Minas Basin.

PARRSBORO' LIGHT—On the W. side of the entrance to Parrsboro' River. *A fixed white light*, 30 ft. above high water, visible 9 miles. Octagonal white tower, standing close to high water mark on the beach.

HORTON BLUFF LIGHT—*A white fixed light*, 95 ft. above high water level (rise and fall 40 to 45 ft.), visible in clear weather over the greater part of the Basin of Minas (after passing Cape Blomedon) and above the Five Islands and up Windsor River, until intercepted by the continuation of the Bluff to the southward of it. Square white building, standing 66 feet from the Bluff.

LUANT COAT HEAD LIGHT—The lantern is erected on a square tower attached to the main building. *A white fixed light*, 75 ft. above high water level, and visible from all points of approach.

GANNET ROCK LIGHT—The Gannet Rock is 66 ft. above high water, and has a light-house upon it, painted black and white, in vertical stripes. *A fixed white light* (visible 12 miles) lies S. W. by S., distant $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the southern point of *Three Islands*, and S. S. E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., 7 miles from the S. W. head of the *Grand Manan*. A gun is fired to answer signals during a fog. There are a number of small ledges and sunken rocks about it, which are always breaking. The light stands conspicuously in the immediate vicinity of all the sunken rocks and dangers, extending from the old Proprietor to the Seal Islands off Machias, a distance of about 20 miles. Between the northernmost and southernmost of the *Murr Ledges* there is a range of *dangerous rocks and shoals*, many of them above water, and which extend westward from the lighthouse about 4 miles. From this range, farther westerly, about 6 miles, lies a *dangerous breaker*, called the Bull. This may be avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands, near the S. W. end of Grand Manan, open.

MACHIAS SEAL ISLAND LIGHTS—S. W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. from Grand Manan, lie the Machias Islands. On the eastern island *two lighthouses* are erected, *showing fixed lights*, distant from each other about 200 feet in the direction of E. S. E. and W. N. W., by which they are easily distinguished from all other lights on the coast. Elevated about 54 and 58 ft. above high water, visible 15 miles. A gun is fired every 4 hours during a fog. Both buildings white.

GRAND MANAN ISLAND LIGHT—On Swallow Tail Point, N. E. side of the island. *A white fixed light*, 148 ft. above high water, visible 17 miles. Building white, Lat. $44^{\circ} 45' 22''$ N. Long. $66^{\circ} 44' 4''$ W. This is a conspicuous mark in the S. Channel between Brier Island and Grand Manan.

LITTLE RIVER LIGHT—On an island at the entrance to the River. *A white fixed light*, varied by flashes every 90 seconds, 40 feet above high water, visible 11 miles.

QUODDY HEAD LIGHT—On the S. E. side of Quoddy Head. *A fixed white light*, 138 ft. above sea level, visible in clear weather 17 miles. It bears from the Southern point of Grand Manan N. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., 13 miles, and from the Northern point of said island W. N. W. $7\frac{1}{4}$ miles. Has a fog trumpet.

CAMPO BELLO LIGHT—On the N. E. extremity of the island. *A white fixed light*, 64 ft. above the sea. Visible 15 miles. Building white with a red cross. This light enables vessels to enter Head Harbor at all times. It is also a guide to vessels entering the main channel, to West Isles, Moose Island, and the inner Bay to Passamaquoddy.

POINT LE PREAUX LIGHT—Upon this projecting headland, *two fixed white lights*, one above the other, distant 28 feet. The lower lantern is fixed to the outside of the building, and throws its light quite inshore, both to the eastward and westward into Mace's Bay. The highest light is 81 feet, visible 15 miles. Building red and white in horizontal stripes, 5 feet broad, and bears from the easternmost Wolves E. by N., 11 miles.

ST. JOHN, N. B., HARBOUR LIGHT—On Partridge Island, at the entrance of the River and Harbour. *A white fixed light*, 120 ft. above high water, and visible 20 miles. Building red and white in vertical stripes. A Steam Whistle is sounded 10 seconds in every minute during fog and snow storms, audible 4 to 6 miles. There is also a *Bell Buoy* at the extremity of the ledge at the eastern end of the island, which is very useful to vessels in thick or rough weather. The bell can be heard 3 miles.

QUACO HEAD LIGHT—On a small rock lying off Quaco Head. *A revolving white light*, 58 feet above high water, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute, visible 15 miles. Building red and white in horizontal stripes.

CAPE ENRAGE LIGHT—On the point of that name in Westmorland, nearly opposite Apple River light in Cumberland. *A plain white light*, 151 ft. above the sea, visible 15 miles. Square white building.

GRINDSTONE ISLAND LIGHT—On Grindstone Island, Chignecto Bay. Lat. $45^{\circ} 43' 18''$ N. Long. $64^{\circ} 87' 25''$ W., 60 ft. above high water. Octagonal white tower.

APPLE RIVER LIGHT—On Hetty Point, N. side of the entrance to the River, and three leagues to the eastward of Cape Chignecto. *Two fixed horizontal lights*, 40 feet above high water, visible 10 miles. Square white building.

EGG ISLAND LIGHT—Off Jeddore. *A revolving light*, 85 feet above high water, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute, showing alternately red and white faces. Building octagonal, painted black and white in vertical stripes. Lat. $44^{\circ} 39' 51''$ N. Long. $62^{\circ} 51' 32''$ W.

OUTER BEAVER, OR WILLIAMS'S ISLAND LIGHT—*A revolving white flash light*, 70 feet above sea level, visible 12 miles. Square white building with two black balls on its seaward side. A reef extends eastward from Beaver Island some distance. Lat. $44^{\circ} 49'$ N. Long. $62^{\circ} 21'$ W.

WHITE HEAD ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. W. point of the Island. *A bright flash light* of 10 seconds duration followed by eclipses of 10 seconds, displaying alternately 3 flashes and 3 eclipses in a minute. Square white tower, standing 75 fathoms from the water's edge, with an octagonal iron lantern, 60 feet above the sea level.

CANBERRY ISLAND LIGHT—(Cape Canso.) *Two white fixed lights*, placed vertically 12 yards apart; the upper 75 ft., the lower 45 ft., above high water, visible 15 and 9 miles respectively. Tower striped white and red horizontally. Lat. $45^{\circ} 19' 49''$ N. Long. $60^{\circ} 55' 29''$ W. A fog trumpet has been placed on Cranberry Island, in operation during thick or foggy weather. Each blast of five seconds duration, with intervals of 20 seconds, audible 6 to 10 miles.

GUYSBOROUGH HARBOUR LIGHT—On the W. side of the entrance to the harbour, head of Chebucto Bay. *A fixed white light*, 30 feet above high water, visible 8 miles. Lat. $45^{\circ} 22' 47''$ N. Long. $61^{\circ} 29' 11''$ W.

EDDY, OR SAND POINT LIGHT—(Gut of Canso.) On the W. side of the S. entrance to the Strait of Canso. *Two horizontal fixed white lights*, 24 ft. apart, elevated 25 ft. each, visible 8 miles. Square white building, with a black diamond on the seaward side.

WEST SIDE GUT OF CANSO, NORTHERN ENTRANCE—*A white fixed light*, 110 ft. above high water, visible 18 miles, or between Cape George and Port Hood. White tower standing 120 yards from the shore. Lat. $45^{\circ} 41' 42''$ N.

POMKET ISLAND LIGHT—St. George's Bay, Antigonish Co. Standing on the N. side, 50 yards from the E. end of the island. *A fixed red light*. Square white building, 50 ft. above high water. Lat. $45^{\circ} 38'$ N. Long. $61^{\circ} 49'$ W.

CAPE ST. GEORGE LIGHT—On the N. side of the cape. *A revolving white light* every half minute, visible 25 miles. 350 ft. above high water. Square white tower. Lat. $45^{\circ} 52' 35''$ N. Long. $61^{\circ} 55'$ W.

BIG CARIBOU ISLAND LIGHT—On the N. E. end of the island. *A white revolving light*, showing its greatest brilliancy every minute. Square white building, standing 130 ft. from the point, and about 35 ft. above high water. Lat. $45^{\circ} 44'$ N. Long. $62^{\circ} 46'$ W.

PICTOU ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. E. point of the Island. *A white fixed light*, 52 ft. above sea level, visible 12 miles. Square white building.

AMET ISLAND LIGHT—Off Tatamagouche harbour. *A fixed white light*. The lantern is placed on the top of the keeper's dwelling, which is painted white. Lat. $45^{\circ} 49' 39''$ N. Long. $63^{\circ} 9'$ W.

PICTOU HARBOUR LIGHT—On the S. point of the entrance to the harbour. *A white fixed light*, 65 feet above sea level, visible 12 miles. *A small red light* is shown below the lantern. Building octagonal, in red and white vertical stripes.

ARICHAH LIGHT—On Marache Point, S. side of the entrance to the harbour. *A white fixed light*, 34 feet above high water, visible 8 miles. Square white building.

GREEN ISLAND LIGHT—Near the S. E. end of Madame Island, off the town of Arichat. *A fixed red light*, elevated 70 feet above high water. Lat. $45^{\circ} 28' 51''$ N. Long. $60^{\circ} 53' 40''$ W. The lantern is placed on the top of the keeper's dwelling, which is painted white.

LOUISBURGH LIGHT—On Lighthouse Point, N. side of the entrance to the harbour. *A white fixed light*, 85 ft. above high water, visible 16 miles. Square white building, with vertical black stripes.

SCATTARI ISLAND LIGHT—On the N. E. point of the island. *A revolving light*, visible 60 seconds and invisible 30 seconds, elevated 99 feet, visible 15 miles. Building white, Lat. $40^{\circ} 2' 13''$ N. Long. $59^{\circ} 40' 18''$ W. The light should never be brought to bear to the eastward of N. N. E. or to the southward of S. S. W., nor approached nearer than $\frac{1}{2}$ miles. Gun fired as signal, and a boat for assistance.

FLINT ISLAND LIGHT—On Flint Island, E. coast of Cape Breton, between Cape Granby and Point Gage, entrance to Cow Bay. Lat. $46^{\circ} 11' 5''$ N., Long. $59^{\circ} 47'$ W. *A revolving light*, attaining its greatest brilliancy every 15 seconds, 65 feet above high water. Octagonal white building.

LOW POINT LIGHT—On the eastern side of the entrance to Sydney, C. B. harbour. *A white fixed light*, elevated 70 feet, visible 14 miles. Building red and white vertically.

OUTER BIRD ISLAND LIGHT—Between the entrance of the Great Bras d'Or, and St. Ann's (E. coast of Cape Breton). *Alternate flashes of red and white at intervals of 60 seconds*, elevated 77 ft., visible 14 miles. Octagonal white building. Lat. $46^{\circ} 25'$ N., Long. $60^{\circ} 25' 30''$ W.

BLACK ROCK POINT LIGHT—S. side of entrance to Big Bras d'Or, C. B. *A fixed white light*. Square white building, about 45 feet above high water, standing 100 feet from the point. Lat. $46^{\circ} 19'$ N., Long. $60^{\circ} 24'$ W.

ST. PAUL'S ISLAND LIGHTS—On the S. point of the island, Lat. $47^{\circ} 11' 20''$, Long. $60^{\circ} 9' 36''$, is an octagonal lighthouse, exhibiting *a revolving white light every minute*, elevated 140 ft., visible 20 miles on all bearings, except between S. S. E. southward to W. On a rock, 26 feet from the end of the island, in Lat. $47^{\circ} 13' 50''$, Long. $60^{\circ} 8' 20''$, is another similar building of the same height, showing *a white fixed light*, visible 20 miles, between N. by E. & E. northward to E.N.E. A bell is sounded during a fog, and a gun fired every $\frac{1}{2}$ hours.

MARGARIE, OR SEA WOLF ISLAND LIGHT—On the N. W. side of Cape Breton, nearly midway between Mabou and Cheticamp harbours, and distant $\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the main land. *A white fixed light*, near the centre and summit of the island, elevated 298 feet, visible 21 miles from all points of approach. Square white building.

PORT HOOD LIGHT—*A fixed light*, shows red on the N. side, and white to the southward, elevated 54 feet, and visible 10 miles. Square white tower. Lat. 46° N., Long. $61^{\circ} 31' 40''$ W.

CAPE RACE LIGHT—(S. E. Point of Newfoundland.)—*A revolving white light*, attaining its greatest brilliancy every half minute, elevated 189 feet, visible 17 miles. The S. E. face of the building is striped red and white vertically. Lat. $46^{\circ} 31' 44''$ N., Long. $58^{\circ} 7' 00''$ W.

The year 5630 of the Jewish Era commences September 6, 1869.

The year 1286 of the Mahomedan Era commences April 13, 1869.

THE SEASONS.—The annual revolution of the earth is accomplished in 365 days, 5 hours, 48 minutes, and 51 seconds. This is the proper or natural year, because it always keeps the same seasons to the same months. The sidereal year is the space of time the sun takes in passing from any fixed star, till it returns to the same star again; it consists of 365 days, 6 hours, 9 minutes, and 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ seconds, being 20 minutes and 20 $\frac{1}{2}$ seconds longer than the true or tropical year. The earth moves in an elliptical orbit, whose eccentricity or distance of its foci from the centre is 1,618,000 miles; that is the ellipse or oval in which it moves. is double the eccentricity, or 3,236,000 miles longer in one direction than it is in another. In January the sun moves at the rate of 69,600 miles an hour, but in July its rate of motion every hour is only about 66,400 miles. In the course of the earth's revolution, the inhabitants of every clime experience, though at different times, a variety of seasons. Spring, summer, autumn, winter, follow each other in constant succession.

There is farm-work for winter as well as summer. Labour if then accomplished leaves greater time and room for the necessary operations of seed-time and harvest. Many farmers fail to find this work—fail, perhaps, because they look in the wrong place for it, or have very little mind to engage in anything beyond the necessary chores of foddering and firewood—giving these no very systematic or economical attention. The thorough systematic farmer thinks no duty or chore beneath his attention. He finds no lack of employment for every day in winter. Attention to the comfort and regular feeding of his cattle is repaid by their thrift and growth; the dairy does not cease to be productive; the young stock increase in weight and size; his sheep are gaining in flesh and wool, and promise a healthy increase the coming season.

METEORS, OR SHOOTING STARS.—No account of the solar system can well be considered complete without some mention of a class of bodies that have for years past arrested the attention of the multitude as well as of astronomers—*meteors, or shooting stars*—of which, dense showers have been annually noticed about the 13th of November. The observed parallax of several shooting stars proves them to exist at a height far exceeding that of the sensible limits of our atmosphere, thus destroying the theory that has hitherto regarded them as produced by the incandescence of gases in the air. Comparative observations made in 1828 at Breslau, Dresden, Leyden, Brieg, &c., assigned to certain of these so-called meteors, an elevation of no less than 500 English miles. The apparent velocity of some has amounted to 36 miles per second, almost



Every good farmer keeps his tools housed, but many during the busy period of summer, have left out some that should have been sheltered. The horse-rake has perhaps been placed on the fence in the corner of the field: the plough still lies at the side of the wheatfield, where it was left when the harrow was brought in; the ox cart stands behind the barn, exposed to all weather; the roller has not seen shelter since last spring; two hoes and a spade lean against the side of the waggon house, and other implements lay about in various directions. The aggregate value of all may be \$300; five years' exposure would totally ruin them for any value, and if so, then they are losing a fifth this year, or \$60. Yet 50 cents worth of labour would place every one in good shelter. So much for the want of a little thinking; and doubtless not a few who are thus wasting so rapidly their property, would spend half a day in making a sharp bargain, in order to get an additional dollar from a neighbour—saving at the top and wasting at the bunghole! A coat of paint applied to tools just after the summer seasoning, will penetrate the cracks and be of great service in keeping out water.

double that of the earth's motion in the ecliptic. Now, should half this be supposed an illusion, arising from the opposite motion of the earth, there would still remain a velocity of 18 miles per second, which exceeds that of all the superior planets, except the earth. The usual direction of these stars makes it manifest, independently of other proof, that though they may pass into our atmosphere and take fire there, at least they have not their origin in it. The more usual course of shooting stars appears diametrically opposed to the earth's motion in her orbit. Arago thinks that every thing tends to confirm the existence of a zone consisting of millions of small bodies, whose orbits meet the plane of the ecliptic near the point occupied by the earth in November—a new planetary world, in fact, which has just begun to be revealed to us. It appears highly probable that these "November meteors" derive their origin from a nebulous body which revolves round the sun, and which, in certain parts of its course, comes very near the orbit of the earth, so as to be

Many farmers suffer a great deal of anxiety; some of them pass sleepless nights in thinking how they shall obtain the highest market price for their products. Should they happen to sell before the highest figure is reached, or delay selling till prices have gone down again, disappointment and chagrin prove a lasting source of discomfort to them. Between the anxiety beforehand and the fretting afterwards, they are in a great measure unfitted for a close attention to their business, and it may be questioned whether they do not lose ten times as much in other ways than in failing to hit the market exactly. The best rule is when prices are low, not to spend one's whole time in endeavouring to get a little more, but to raise better crops, and make larger profits on home management. Every man who gives diligent attention to his business, should be allowed to make fair profits. The produce dealer must be one of these, or his business would cease; and he must, sometimes, obtain heavy gains to compensate for his frequent losses. Farmers should bear this in mind, and not be too eager to obtain the last cent.

within its attractive power; and if such a body be the source whence these meteors proceed, it may also account for the phenomenon of the zodiacal light.

There were unusual displays of meteors about November 13, in the years 1792, 1822, 1821, 1832, 1833, 1834, 1837, and 1838—the number seen in some of these years being very great; in others less. Professor Newton, of the United States, who has investigated the phenomena of the "November meteors," found, by comparing together 13 historic star showers, occurring between the years 1602 and 1833, that a common shower existed on November 13, which returned with especial intensity about every 33 years. In 1823 the stars were so numerous, and appeared in so many parts of the heavens at once, that their num-

The importance of good fences is well understood by those who have observed the difference between crops safe from all intruders, and those occasionally trodden down and ruined; between moving on with the work without interruption, and the frequent annoyance of stopping important operations, to run after intruding cattle, colts and pigs. Repairing fences in spring is one of the earliest tasks that claim the farmers' attention. Board fences should be annually examined throughout their whole length, and loose boards nailed tight. New board fences should never be battened on the face or joints over the posts, as the practice tends to cause decay; but when the ends begin to rot and become loosened, battens will secure and make them strong for several years longer. Many old farms are irregularly fenced; but whether old or new, they should as soon as practicable be regularly divided in the best manner. The old fences should be removed when necessary, and new ones erected in the right place.

bers could only be roughly approximated to. They were compared to half the number of flakes of snow seen in the air during a common fall of snow. When their number was greatly diminished, 650 were counted in 15 minutes in a zone less than the tenth of the visible horizon. This number was but two-thirds of the real amount, which would thus be 975, and for the whole visible horizon 9,750. This would give 30,000 stars per hour. The phenomenon lasted more than seven hours, therefore the number of stars passing in sight was more than 273,000; for it must be recollect, that this calculation is founded on observations which were not made till the phenomenon was considerably on the decline. It is worthy of remark that, with few exceptions, these showers all appeared to proceed from a common centre, the position of which has been uniformly in nearly the same point of the heavens, viz., in some part of the constellation Leo. As soon as the meadows are dry enough to bear feet without injury to the turf, they should be carefully picked of all loose and projecting stones, which might injure a mowing machine, and then well rolled so as to make the surface as smooth and perfect as possible. Stumps should be dug or pulled out, brush and other rubbish removed, and small hillocks levelled down. Meadows which were top dressed with coarse manure in autumn or winter, which was more or less spread in lumps, should be harrowed as early as possible, so as to break those lumps and spread the whole uniformly. Cattle droppings, on meadows or pastures, should be finely beaten to pieces and well scattered over the surface, as soon as the frost will admit, and before the frost has all disappeared from the soil. It is perhaps scarcely necessary to mention that no good farmer ever allows either his meadows or pastures to be touched by a hoof early in spring while the ground is soft. Much is lost by thin and uneven seeding of meadows.

and in all places, occurred between midnight and sunrise, and reached its maximum between 3 and 4 o'clock. Professor Newton's prediction having aroused the attention of astronomers, great preparations were made for observing those predicted for November 13, 1866. The display was perhaps not quite so fine as expected, but still sufficiently so to any one who saw such a sight for the first time. About 9 in the evening, a few solitary meteors began to be observed; between 11 and 12 they became more numerous, appearing in the east, and passing off by the north and south as expected, the radient region (in the constellation Leo) being as yet scarcely above the horizon. The absence of the Moon allowed the display to be seen in all its magnificence; and as the constellation Leo ascended above the horizon, it became evident that the radient

region of the November shower was still the same (near to the star Gamma Leonis). The meteors continued to come between midnight and 2 A.M. thicker and faster, and could be counted by hundreds. Many were seen at the same time. First, one would start towards Ursa Major, followed instantly by another emulous of the first; then one would rush off southwards across Orion; then one would sail majestically over the Zenith; others would ascend vertically from Leo for a short distance, others would shoot directly downwards. The trains left by some were beautiful to behold—some green, some yellow, some red, but more of a bluish cast. In some cases the trains were visible for several minutes. Great numbers near Leo were short, probably from foreshortening of their real path. Nothing like explosions were heard; indeed the stillness accompanying the activity overhead forced itself on one's notice.

Timothy and clover are in a large degree our cultivated grasses, though some attention is given to June or blue grass, red-top, fowl-meadow, orchard grass, &c.; yet most farmers sow only the two first. The most successful will be found with barley, using about double the usual quantity of timothy and clover. Sow before the last light harrowing, or afterward following with the roller; which in most cases covers the seed sufficiently and leaves the soil in a good state for the growth of the grass crop. The product of land so seeded is usually large—the clover giving considerable fall feed, and a good crop of hay the next year, and if desired, a fair product of clover seed. The timothy does not appear largely until the second year, and in case the clover suffers from the winter, takes its place—by the third year the crop will be mostly timothy, and if it is desired to remain in grass for some time, should receive a top-dressing. Summer seedling is but little practised—the object of summer seedling is to get a grass crop as soon as possible; but, unless the summer is cool and moist, disappointment results.

After 2 A. M. the number rapidly declined, though they continued to be seen throughout the night. Above eight thousand are said to have been counted at the observatory, Greenwich, far exceeding any previous record at that place, and approaching, though by no means equaling, the American display of 1833.

That such evanescent and apparently erratic bodies as meteors should yield to any investigation, seems surprising. But persevering study of their complex appearances, a true spirit of induction applied to collect facts, has done the work, and now order is seen to reign in that which was comparative disorder; shewing that Nature every where works on one uniform plan. The subject is worthy of particular attention, and

THE birds are labourers. How much travel, what a circuit of country, has to be gone over; what a sharp look out for the little sticks and a hair to carry at one time for the nests! And so we might speak in detail of the skill, industry and labour necessary to make into a nest this great amount of building material. It is the declaration of God that birds are not to sow, or to reap, or to gather into barns; where then is the provision made for feeding this army of little labourers? Where? Why in the worm that is gnawing at the root of vegetation; in the grub that is making naught the labour of the planter; in the millions of insects that are destroying, in the bud and the flower, the promise of the fruit tree; in the larva or egg deposited in the bark of the tree. Now, see you not that he who destroys the birds of the air; that he who breaks in upon and breaks up their industrial or domestic arrangements, does what he can to prevent the husbandman from receiving the reward of his labour, lessens the product of the crop he plants, of the field he mows or harvests, and of the fruit tree he rears.

future observations may not only throw light on this particular phenomenon, but open to our view a species of celestial bodies with which we were formerly unacquainted. The recurrence of this singular phenomenon on the morning of Nov. 13, 1836, and very nearly at the same hour, the radiation of the meteors from the same point of the heavens, differing only half a degree (as did those of 1834), namely, 145° right ascension in the face of Leo, and all the attending phenomena being the same, though upon a scale less magnificent—settle the question as to its being a regular and annual phenomenon. It is a circumstance worthy of particular notice, that these meteoric showers take place chiefly on the 12th and 13th of November, and hence they are now distinguished by the name of the *November meteors*. The facts which have already

SLUGGISH farmers will not do their work well unless compelled to do so. If weeds never grew, they would be tempted to leave their fields untouched. Now in fighting weeds they give an impetus to the crop. Good farmers do not wait to be driven; they do not allow necessity to drive them; on the contrary, they themselves manufacture necessity. A great deficiency on many of our farms, is a want of smoothness; stones and brush need removal; wet spots, or the whole surface, need underdraining, that the soil may become uniformly mellow. Good farmers will not wait to be compelled; but the rest will discover in time that modern farm machinery will drive them into smooth fields. Mowers and reapers will benefit largely by the reformation, for they will soon discover that it is much cheaper to remove by five minutes' labour, a projecting stone or other obstruction, than to lose half a day in haying time, with half a dozen hands, besides a charge of five dollars for repairing the machine. Drill sowing and drill culture, which are beginning to effect an immense saving of labour, cannot be performed well among stones and stone heaps, briars and elder bushes, nor among clods of earth!

been observed afford a *sensible proof* of the attractive power of the earth over bodies at a distance in the heavens; and it is to be hoped that the future observations and investigations of scientific men, in relation to such phenomena, will throw some further light on the nature and properties of bodies which have hitherto been involved in darkness and mystery. What the destination of such bodies may be, or the ends they serve in the economy of nature, we are as yet entirely ignorant of. It appears evident that they are bodies of no great density, otherwise their effect on the earth might have been more terrific and disastrous. Had their quantity of matter been considerable, when accompanied with so prodigious a velocity as they evidently had, their momentum would have been such as to have dashed them with violence upon the earth, where the most appalling effects might have been produced, in the de-

By soiling is meant the practice of keeping cattle in the barn yard or stable during the summer months, and feeding them on green crops. By this system more cattle can be kept on a given quantity of land, and a large quantity of excellent manure is produced. It is claimed, too, that cattle will fatten more rapidly, or give more milk, than when allowed to roam the field in search of food. Indian Corn is probably, all things considered, the best green crop to raise for milch cows and working cattle. By sowing it thick, in rows, and manuring it highly, a heavy crop of succulent stalks may be obtained, containing more nutritive matter probably, than can be raised on an acre in any other way, except by irrigating grass land. One of the great advantages of soiling, or in growing any food for stock, is the means it affords of providing manure for the high-priced grain crops. It is, therefore, very important that a crop grown as food for stock, should be as slightly exhausting to the soil as possible. Red Clover is extensively used in England for soiling horses.

molation of human habitations, and the destruction of thousands of their inhabitants. But it does not appear that any of them made their way through the atmosphere to the surface of the earth, which was doubtless owing to the comparatively light materials of which they were composed. Meteoric phenomena, nearly resembling what has now been described, have occurred at several former periods. One remarkable instance of what was called "showers of fire" occurred above 80 years ago at Quito in South America. A more extensive and remarkable phenomenon of this kind occurred on the 12th November, 1779, at Cumaná. It occurred towards the morning, when thousands of meteors, colides, fire-balls, or falling stars, as they were variously denominated, succeeded each other during four hours. Their direction was from North to South. They

To carry sheep well through the winter, they should come to their food at a regular set time every day, unless the weather be very cold; then they may repose a little longer in the morning. With two feeds a day, between 8 and 9 A. M., and before 3 P. M., sheep will require one-fourth less fodder than if fed three or four times a day. In no case put off feeding until sun-down. The more exercise sheep have the more they will consume, but they rarely eat any at twilight. Healthy sheep will winter well on one bountiful feed per day given about 11 A. M. The best time to feed grain is immediately after they consume their hay, and before they lie down to ruminate and digest their food. Let the grain or potatoes be placed in their feeding troughs before the sheep have access to them. Hay should always be fed in racks or boxes. Feeding sheep should be fed no more frequently than strong ones, but with better food. A large share of the profits of Sheep husbandry arises from the increase in lambs. Sheep in good condition produce better lambs and take better care of them.

rose in the horizon at E.N.E, followed the direction of the meridian, and fell towards the South. There was little wind and this from the east. No trace of clouds was seen. There was not a space in the firmament equal in extent to three diameters of the moon, which was not filled with burning stars. They were of different sizes: they left luminous traces of from 5 to 10 degrees in length. The appearance of these traces continued 7 or 8 seconds. Many of the stars had a distinct nucleus as large as the apparent disk of Jupiter. The largest were from 1° to 1° 18' in diameter. Their light was white, and they seemed to burst as by explosion. They were seen by all the inhabitants of Cumana, the oldest of whom asserted that the great earthquake of 1766 was preceded by similar phenomena. The conclusion arrived at by Professor Olmsted

THERE is no great amount of labour to be done out of doors during this month. The most important work of the farmer now is the care of his domestic animals, to see they are well sheltered from cold and wet, and properly fed and watered. The year's profit or loss depends greatly on the manner in which they are wintered. Animals entering the winter months in high condition, are already half wintered. A fat strong animal will be warm and comfortable where a poor weak one can hardly live, and the hearty, vigorous one will digest and assimilate food which the weak one would scarcely taste. Regular hours for attending to all matters, is important, particularly in milking cows, foddering, feeding, and watering. Cattle should be fed often, and but little at a time: they thrive better when their dormitories are kept clean, and freely littered with straw or dry leaves. Cattle, horses and sheep should have salt where they can have access to it whenever they desire it. Sprinkling hay too freely with salt is injurious, as over salting diminishes the nutriment and weakens the animals.

after a due consideration of these phenomena was that the meteors of November 13 consisted of portions of the extreme parts of a nebulous body, which revolves around the sun in an orbit interior to that of the earth, but little inclined to the plane of the ecliptic, having its aphelion near to the earth's path. Arago appears to entertain an opinion on this subject not very different from that of Professor Olmsted. He supposes that there may be myriads of bodies, composed probably of *nebulous* matter similar to the tails of comets, circulating round the sun in a zone or ring that crosses the earth's orbit at that part where it is about the 12th November, and that some of them, drawn from their course by the earth's attraction, fall towards it, and taking fire when they enter the atmosphere, present the luminous phenomena of falling stars.

Mails for all places named in the foregoing table are made up at 8 P.M., except the second semi-daily mails for Windsor, Truro and Pictou, which are made up at 2 P.M. Mails from all those places are due at Halifax by the railway trains from Truro, Pictou and Windsor. The mails from Lunenburg, Liverpool, Sheet Harbor, &c., by mail coach, are due at 7 P.M.

SHIP LETTERS.—Letters, by private ship, from the United Kingdom, in *ship letter mail*, 2 cents, if addressed to the port of arrival, and to other places in the Dominion, 5 cents. Loose ship letters from the United Kingdom, British Colonies, and Foreign countries, 4 cents. From places in the Dominion, if addressed to the port of arrival, 4 cents; and to other places within the Dominion, 7 cents. The Postmaster General may make such reasonable compensation, as he may see fit, to masters of vessels, not being Post Office Packets, for each letter conveyed by such vessels between places beyond the sea and the Dominion, and may direct that at any port such vessels shall not be permitted by the officers of Customs to enter or break bulk until all letters have been delivered at the Post Office, nor until the master has made a declaration that he has delivered all.

All letters are charged by weight, irrespective of distance, and a uniform rate of 3 cents per $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. prevails throughout the Dominion. The rates of postage herein mentioned, all refer to a single letter of *half an ounce*. If it exceeds the $\frac{1}{4}$ oz., but less than 1 oz., it is charged double, and so on according to weight. All letters, newspapers, and other mailable matter by mail, *must be prepaid* by having stamps of the value affixed.

The stamps are to be affixed to letters, pamphlets, &c., on the upper right hand corner. Postmasters to stamp the name of the office and date *distinctly* on every letter.

The Postmaster General has the exclusive privilege of transmitting letters within the Dominion; and (except in the cases hereinafter mentioned) any person collecting, sending, or delivering letters, incurs a penalty, not exceeding \$20, for each and every letter so conveyed or found in his possession. Such penalty not to apply to, 1. Letters sent by a private friend, provided such letters be delivered by such friend to the party addressed; 2. Letters sent by a messenger on purpose, concerning the private affairs of the sender or receiver; 3. Commissions or returns thereof, issuing out of a court of justice; 4. Letters addressed to a place out of the Dominion, sent by sea and by a private vessel; 5. Letters lawfully brought into the Dominion, and immediately posted at the nearest Post Office; 6. Letters of merchants, owners of vessels, or of the cargo or loading therein, sent by such vessel, or by any person employed by such owners for the carriage of such letters according to their respective addresses, and delivered to the persons to whom addressed, without pay or reward for so doing; 7. Letters concerning goods or merchandise, sent by common known carriers to be delivered with the goods, without pay or reward; 8. Nothing herein contained to authorize any person to collect any such excepted letters for the purpose of sending or conveying them. No person obliged to send any newspaper, pamphlet, or printed book by post.

Made on the Ship Staff at Citadel Hill, when vessels are seen from the Citadel or reported from an outpost.

For 1 square rigged vessel, 2 balls close up, one on the outer halliard and one on the inner halliard.

" 2 Do. 1 ball hoisted on the outer halliard, and 1 close up on the inner halliard.

" 3 Do. 2 balls close up, one out and one in.

" 4 Do. 2 balls separated, and 1 close up on the inner halliard.

" 5 Do. a pendant of any colour on the outer halliard, and one ball close up inside.

" 6 Do. a pendant under a ball close up on the outer halliard, and a ball at the inner halliard close up.

" 7 Do. a pendant over a ball close up on the outer halliard, and a ball close up on the inner halliard.

" 8 Do. a pendant under two balls close up on the outer halliard, with a ball close up on the inner halliard.

" 9 Do. a pendant between two balls close up on the outer halliard, with a ball close up on the inner halliard.

" 10 Do. A flag of any colour close up on the outer halliard, with a ball close up on the inner halliard.

The above balls, &c., are hoisted on the east or west yard arm, according to the quarter the vessel first appears in.

When sailing vessels are reported from an outpost, the following signals are made on the lower yard, now used exclusively for sailing vessels, as repeats:

For a square rigged vessel, two balls of a size, one at the outer, the other at the inner halliard, close up.

A Ship, a large ball at the end of the yard, with a small one at the inner halliard.

A Barque, a large do. at the end, with a small one dropped at the inner halliard.

A Brig, a small ball at the end of the yard, and a large one at the inner halliard.

A Brigantine, a cross close up at the outer halliard. Two or more do., a cross half hoisted.

A Topsail Schooner, a cross close up at the inner halliard.

The upper yard of the Ship Staff is used solely to designate Steam Vessels, thus:—

Two large balls close up, one at the outer and the other at the inner halliard, E. or W., a Steamer reported in that quarter.

A small ball at the outer, and a large one at the inner halliard, a second class Packet or Merchant Steamer.

A large ball at the outer, and a small one at the inner halliard, a Man-of-War Steamer, or Royal Mail Steamer, or large Merchant Steamer.

Two lanterns, one *red* and the other *white*, are hoisted at night to denote a Steamer reported.

The *red* lantern is always shown at the end of the yard arm, and the *white* one at the inner halliard, E. or W., according to the quarter the Steamer is reported in.

Numbers are indicated the same as on the lower yard.

When the description of vessel is ascertained, the following descriptive colours will be hoisted at the masthead:—

A Union Jack—a Flag Ship.
