1. Pursuant to paragraph 6 of Memorandum for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 334 (3 Apr 46) ESS/IE, (SCAPIN 854), dated 3 April 1946, subject: Board of Trade (Boeki Cho), the Board of Trade or its duly authorized agent shall take delivery or cause delivery to be taken for its account, of the shipment of 2,965 standard bales of Abaca fiber scheduled to arrive on the S/S China Mail at Kobe on or about 10 November 1947.

2. Quantitative receipts in triplicate (3 copies) in the prescribed form, showing the total quantity of Abaca fiber, by grades, delivered on this shipment, shall be signed and sealed by the Board of Trade or its authorized agent. These receipts shall be forwarded to the local Military Government Unit.

3. Upon receipt of the Abaca fiber, the Board of Trade shall hold title to it until such time as a utilization plan, prepared by the Textile Bureau, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, is submitted to and approved by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Economic and Scientific Section, Textile Division. Upon approval of a utilization plan, the 2,965 bales of Abaca shall be transferred by sale to such agencies, firms or individuals as may be designated by the Textile Bureau. The products manufactured from this Abaca fiber shall be disposed of in accordance with regulations of the Textile Bureau.

4. Separate weekly reports covering the allocation and delivery of imported Abaca fiber shall be submitted in duplicate (2 copies) to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Economic and Scientific Section, Attention: Textile Division. The report shall contain information as to quantities allocated and delivered each week, by grades, to each mill.

SUBJECT: Abaca Fiber from the Philippines

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Board of Trade, File No. 423 (2 Oct 47) ESS/FT, (BT-47-861), subject: Abaca Fiber from the Philippines.

2. Paragraph 3 of reference memorandum is further revised as follows:

"Upon receipt of the Abaca Fiber, the Board of Trade shall hold title to it until such time as a production plan covering products for domestic use and export, prepared by the Textile Bureau, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, is submitted to and approved by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Upon approval of the production plan, the 4,698 bales, of which 2,500 bales are for the manufacture of export products, shall be transferred by sale to such agencies, firms or individuals as may be designated by the Textile Bureau. Forms IE-100 "Application to Prepare for Export" shall be prepared and submitted to the Foreign Trade Division with the least practicable delay and shall cover the utilization of 2,500 bales. All products manufactured from these 2,500 bales shall be safely stored in such form as may be convenient and held pending export shipment. Products manufactured for domestic use from the remaining 2,198 bales shall be disposed of in accordance with the regulations of the Textile Bureau."

3. Paragraph 4 of reference memorandum is revised as follows:

"Separate weekly reports covering the allocation, delivery and consumption of imported Abaca fiber for (1) domestic use and for (2) export, shall be submitted in duplicate (2 copies) to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Economic and Scientific Section, Attention: Textile Division. The report shall contain information as to the quantities of fiber allocated and delivered each week by grades to each mill and the quantities of abaca products manufactured.

4. All other provisions of the reference memorandum remain in force and effect.
