This effort, persisted in for a period of almost one hundred years, is showing remarkable results. A unique method of mission work which presents a vastly different outlook from that used by other cultural religions is surely worthy of careful study. The people of today cannot and should not ignore this new movement in the religious life of the world, which has been making such rapid strides since its birth.
