



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

## OF THE MOVEABLE FEASTS.

EASTER-DAY, on which the other moveable feasts of the year depend, is always the first Sunday after the Full Moon, which happens upon, or next after the 21st day of March ; and if the Full Moon happen upon a Sunday, Easter-day is the Sunday following.

## Of the Changes of the Moon.

Many persons, understanding that the mean time between one new Moon and another is 29 days, 12 hours, 44 minutes and a fraction, imagine that, to find the full or quarters of the Moon, they have only to add a half or fourth part of that time ; and when they do not find the changes marked in the Calendar to correspond with this method, they impute it to mistake in the calculation of those changes. It is therefore, necessary to put them in mind, that the great inequality of the Moon's motions renders the above rule extremely inaccurate, so that nineteen times in twenty, it must fail in giving the true conjunction or change.

## Explanation of the Calendar.

The first Column contains the days of the Month, the second the days of the Week, the third the Holidays, &c. and the fourth rising and setting of the Sun.

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## A GEOGRAPHICAL DESCRIPTION OF THE WORLD.

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**E**UROPE extends in its greatest breadth from 9<sup>th</sup> degrees West to 61 East longitude from London, and in its greatest length, from 35° 55' to 71° 20' N. latitude, and contains these Countries, Germany, Sweden, Denmark, Netherlands, Italy, Muscovy, Hungary, France, Spain, Portugal, Poland, Norway and Greece, the most eminent Islands are these: Great-Britain, Ireland, Sicily, Sardinia, Candia, Negropont and Corsica. The greatest length of this part of the World is 3000 miles, the breadth 900.

**A S I A**, extends in its greatest breadth, from 61 degree East, to 163 E. longitude, from London, and in its greatest length, from 10 South, to 75 N. latitude, and is the first known part of the World, it contains these principal Regions and Islands, viz. Armenia, Anatolia, Persia, Assyria, China, Syria, Arabia, Mesopotamia, India, Japan, Parthia, Media, Palestine, Chaldea, and Tartary.

**AFRICA**, extends in its greatest breadth, from 15 degree West to 50 East longitude, from London and in its greatest length from 35 West to 40 south latitude, in it are these Countries, viz. Egypt, Barbary, Biledulgerid, Ethiopia, Nubia, Congo, Abyssinia, Monomotopa, Guinea, &c. The Islands, Madagascar, St. Thomas, Islands of Cape Verde, Canary Islands, Madeira.

**AMERICA.** This great Western Continent, frequently denominated the New World, extends from the 80th Degree North to the 56th of south latitude; and, where its breadth is known, from the 56th to the 136th degree of W. Long. from London, stretching from between 8 and 9000 miles in length, and its greatest breadth 3690. It sees both Hemispheres, has two summers and a double winter, and enjoys all the variety of climates which the Earth affords. It is wash'd by the two great Oceans; to the Eastward it has the Atlantic, which devides it from Europe and Africa; to the West the Pacific, or great South Sea, by which it is separated from Asia: by these seas it may, and does carry a direct commerce with the other three parts of the World.

This great Continent is divided into two parts, one on the North, the other on the South; which are joined by the Kingdom of Mexico, forming a sort of Isthmus 1500 miles long, and in one part, at Darien, so extremely narrow, as to make the communication between the two Oceans by no means difficult, being only 60 miles. In the great Gulph which is formed between the Isthmus and the northern and southern grand Divisions of this Continent, lie an infinite multitude of Islands, many of them large, most of them fertile, and denominated, the West-Indies, in contradistinction to the Countries and Islands of Asia, beyond the Cape of Good Hope, which are call'd, the East-Indies.

**UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT-BRITAIN  
AND IRELAND.**

This kingdom formerly England, Wales, Scotland and Ireland is situated between  $49^{\circ} 50'$  and  $50^{\circ} 25'$  of North latitude, and between  $7^{\circ} 40'$  West, and  $1^{\circ} 50'$  of East longitude and contains about 15,000,000 inhabitants, according to the last Census.

The United Kingdom is a limited monarchy, and hereditary to both sexes. The King must be of the Protestant religion, as established. The King possesses the executive power of government, and, with the Parliament, shares in the legislative. Parliament is composed of the three estates, the Sovereign, the House of Peers and the House of Commons.

The climate is mild, the soil for the most part naturally good, yielding every useful production, wine, oil and silk excepted. The genius and industry of the people, in the arts of agriculture and gardening, in the mode of feeding cattle, breeding horses and sheep, have placed this beyond every other European country in this point.—The woollen manufactures of England, and the produce of their mines, &c. are inexhaustible sources of riches.

The persevering industry and great mechanical ingenuity of its inhabitants, have given Great-Britain decidedly the first place in Europe as a commercial and manufacturing country. The advantage of her insular situation, many excellent harbours, and vast extent of sea line, have highly contributed to her superiority; but her prodigious improvements in every manufacture and mechanical art, joined to her wise laws for the protection of trade, and the high respect in which her mercantile character is held, have advanced her yet more. Next to manufactures, the fisheries are of the greatest importance. The total of the commerce, import and export, employs above two millions of tons of shipping; and the balance in favour of Great-Britain is above three millions on the average.

## CANADA.

JACQUES Cartier, a Frenchman, in the year 1534, under a commission from his master Francis I. explored the Gulf of Saint Lawrence, and the next year ascended the river, and wintered at Sainte Croix ---here he erected a wooden Cross, inscribed, "*Franciscus Dei Gratia Francorum Rex Regnat*"—In 1603, a Patent was granted to Sieur de Monts, for an exclusive trade, and he employed Champlain to make further discoveries in Canada. Champlain arrived at a strait called by the Indians, Quebec, where he began to build huts, on the 3d July 1608, and here he passed the winter.—A company of rich merchants, composed of 107 persons, was established by Patent, in 1628, for an exclusive trade, at first, and in 1642 acquired a right of soil—Quebec was taken by sir David Keith and his brother in 1629, but surrendered to France by the treaty of saint Germain en Laye. The charter of this company was revoked 1663, and Canada was put under the Government of the Company "*des Indes Occidentales*" in 1664—The King, was however to govern, till they were able.

Sir Wm. Phipps, with an armament from Boston in New England, summoned Quebec in 1690—The town was canonaded and 1500 English troops were landed at *la Canardiere*—Sir William finding the place too strong and his ammunition expended, sailed on the 23 October for Boston--General Hill and Admiral Sir Hovenden Walker, with a large body of troops from England for the attack of Quebec, entered the river st. Lawrence in Sept. 1711—Unfortunately, however, by the mismanagement of the Pilot and a violent storm, many of the

vessels were wrecked on the Egg Islands, near the Seven Islands, and 880 men perished.

General Wolfe on the 13 Sept. 1759, at the head of an intrepid handful of British troops, after combating every difficulty of art and nature, with the most undaunted resolution, and the calmest perseverance, defeated the French army commanded by the Marquis de Montcalm, on the heights near Quebec; and by that memorable action, in which the English forces had 57 men killed and 607 wounded and the French 1500 killed wounded and Prisoners paved the way for the reduction of the City, which surrendered on the 18th to Admiral Saunders and Brigadier Townshend. Tho' the City was taken the Marquis de Vaudreuil, still held possession of Montreal until the 8th September 1760, when that city and the whole Province surrendered by capitulation to General Amherst, and which was confirmed to Great Britain by the treaty of 1763, under whose dominion it has since continued—Gen Montgomery in the winter 1775, besieged Quebec, and when re-inforced by General Arnold, attacked the City, by assault on the 31st December, when the General was defeated, himself killed and his two Aides de Camp. several of the Provincials were killed and wounded among the latter Arnold.—The blockade continued during the winter 1776, and on the arrival of troops from England, the siege was raised and the Provincials driven out of the Province.

The two Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada constituted by Act of Parliament in 1791, comprehend the territory heretofore called CANADA. Lower Canada lies on both sides of the river Saint Lawrence, between 61 and 71 West Longitude, from London: and 45 and 52 North Latitude and is bounded south, by New Brunswick, Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont and New York and West by Upper Canada.

The Line between Upper and Lower Canada commences at a stone boundary on the North Bank of La-

ke st. Francis in st. Lawrence river, at the cove West of Point au Boudet, thence Northerly to the Ottawas river and to its source in lake Tomiscaning, then due North, till it strikes the boundary of Hudson's bay or New Britain : Upper Canada to include all the territory to the westward and southward of the said line to the utmost extent of the country known by the name of Canada.

By the Act of Parliament passed in 1791 it is enacted that there shall be within each of the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, a Legislative Council and an Assembly, who with the consent of the Governor, appointed by the King, shall have power to make Laws. The Legislative Council is to consist of not fewer than seven Members for Upper and fifteen for Lower Canada; to be summoned by the Governor authorised by the King. Such Members to hold their seats for life: unless forfeited by four years continual absence or by swearing allegiance to some foreign Power. The House of Assembly is to consist of not less than sixteen Members for Upper and not less than fifty for Lower Canada, chosen by the Freeholders in the several Towns and Counties: the Council and Assembly are to be called together at least once in every year and every Assembly is to continue four years unless sooner dissolved.

By an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, in the 18th year of his present Majesty, intituled "An Act for removing all doubts and apprehensions concerning Taxations by the Parliament of Great-Britain in the Colonies, Provinces and Plantations in North-America and the West-Indies, &c." Parliament expressly restrained itself, for ever, imposing any Taxes or Duties in the Colonies except for the regulation of Trade, the produce of which Taxes or Duties to be disposed of by the Provincial Assemblies; Declaration, made by Parliament in so solemn and ef-

fectual a manner, gives the best security, the subjects in the Colonies can possibly wish.

The Province of Lower Canada contains about 200,000 inhabitants, nine tenths of which are Roman Catholics, who enjoy under the present Government, the same rights and privileges as were granted them in 1774 by the Quebec Act.

After the 1st June 1797 payments exceeding 5s. currency may be made in Gold by weight.

British, Portugal and American Gold to be weighed together and to pass at the rate of 89s. currency per ounce Troy.

Spanish and French Gold to be weighed together and to pass at the rate of 87s. currency per ounce Troy.

And  $\frac{2}{3}$  of a grain shall be deducted from each piece so weighed in bulk, as a compensation for the loss that may accrue in paying away the same by detail.

#### SILVER COIN.

The American Dollar shall be current at 5s. and every other piece of Silver coin heretofore current, at the former rate. No person is obliged to receive more than one shilling in Copper Coin at one payment.

To turn any given Currency into any Currency required.

Rule 1. Let the value of the Spanish Dollar be expressed in Shillings, or Pence, in each of the Currencies, writing them in form of a fraction, and making the { required } Currency the Numerator { of the Fraction. Denominator }

Reduce this Fraction to its  $\frac{1}{2}, \frac{1}{3}$  terms, and it will serve as a constant Multiplier, by which any sum of the given Currency being Multiplied, it will be converted into the Currency required.

N. B. When the Fraction is not an improper one the Multiplier will become a Divisor.

EXAMP. To form a rule for changing Sterling at  $4\frac{6}{9}$ . pr. Dollar into New-York at  $8\frac{1}{9}$ . pr. Dollar.

Here Sterling is given, and York required: The Dollar in { York is  $8\frac{1}{9}$ . or 96 Pence Numerator, in { Sterling  $4\frac{6}{9}$ . or 54 Pence Denominator.

Therefore  $\frac{96}{54}$  is the Multiplier sought, which reduced to its least terms becomes  $\frac{16}{9}$  or  $1\frac{7}{9}$ , therefore if Sterling be multiplied by 16 and divided by 9 the result will be York, thus.  $\frac{16}{9}$  is the same as 2 into  $\frac{8}{9}$ , but  $\frac{8}{9}$  is the same as 1 less  $\frac{1}{9}$ , therefore 2 into  $\frac{8}{9}$  is equal to 2 into 1 less  $\frac{1}{9}$ , which is that Rule, expressed shorter thus,  $\frac{16}{9} = 2 \times \frac{8}{9} = 2 \times 1\frac{7}{9}$ .


### THE ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE OF MAIIS.



AT the beginning of every month a Packet-Boat sails from Falmouth for North-America, having a Mail for Quebec on board—In the summer months she puts in at Halifax (in her way to New York) and there delivers the Mail for Canada—From Halifax they are forwarded by Post for Quebec—In the months of Nov. Dec. Jany. and Feby. the Packet-Boats pass Halifax and deliver the Mails for Canada to the Agent for British Packet-Boats at New York, who forwards them through the United States by the nearest post route for Montreal.

A Mail for England is dispatched from Quebec once every fortnight in summer and once a month in winter to be put on board the first Packet-Boat for Falmouth.


A Mail for Burlington in the United States is made up at Quebec every Thursday, and at Montreal every Saturday, by which conveyance Letters may be sent for Europe under cover to a friend at New York, on paying the Canadian Postage at the office at which the Letter is put in. Opportunities offer weekly at New York for England. The Post for Montreal leaves Quebec every Monday and Thursday at 4 o'clock in the evening, and the Post leaves Montreal for Quebec on the same days at the same hour. The Post arrives at those places on the morning of Wednesdays and Saturdays.

A monthly communication by Post between this Province and Upper-Canada, has lately been opened and will continue during the winter.






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## Bureau Général des Postes.

### L'ARRIVE'E et le DEPART des MALLEs.

**A**U commencement de chaque mois il part un Paquebot de Falmouth pour l'Amérique Septentrionale, avec une malle à bord pour Québec—Dans les mois de l'Été, le Paquebot arrête à Halifax, dans son chemin pour New York, et y délivre la malle pour le Canada. Les lettres sont envoyées d'Halifax par la Poste pour Québec—Dans les mois de Novembre, Décembre, Janvier et Février, les Paquebots patient Halifax, et délivrent les malles pour le Canada à l'Agent des Paquebots Britannique à New York, qui les envoie à Montréal à travers les É. unis par le chemin de poste le plus court.

Une malle pour l'Angleterre part de Québec une fois tous les quinze jours dans l'Été, et une fois par mois dans l'hiver, pour être mise à bord du premier Paquebot pour Falmouth.

Une malle pour Burlington, dans les États Unis, est fermée à Québec tous les Jeudis, et à Montréal tous les Samedis, par laquelle on peut envoyer des lettres pour l'Europe, adressées à quelque ami à New York, en payant le port Canadien au Bureau où la lettre est mise. Il s'offre des occasions pour l'Angleterre toutes les semaines à New York. La poste pour Montréal part de Québec tous les Lundis et Jeudis à 4 heures de l'après midi, et la Poste part de Montréal pour Québec les mêmes jours et à la même heure. La Poste arrive à ces places les Mercredis et Samedis au matin.

Il a été ouvert une communication par Poste entre cette Province et le Haut-Canada, qui aura lieu une fois par mois, et continuera tout l'hiver.
