

#### CONDITIONS OF SALE.

#### THE LATHAM COLLECTION.

No commendation is needed for this remarkable collection of gems of art—the productions speak for themselves! But it may be safely asserted, that, for high average value, no such collection has ever been offered to the American public. As a rule, the pictures have excellent subjects, and are important examples of the artists, many of whom are seldom represented in this country; they were chiefly painted to order, or purchased at the various art centres of Europe, Mr. Latham sparing no cost to procure choice specimens.

The eighty-three lots comprise the entire collection of Mr. Latham, without addition or reservation, and they are to be sold on accounof his breaking up his establishment in California, and intending to
reside in Europe for an indefinite period. The sale is made under
