




PREFACE

This book is intended to meet the needs of high school courses in English. It has been prepared after consultation with English departments in various secondary schools and with the coöperation of the Department of English in Phillips Academy.

In order to assist the teacher in eradicating the worst faults as soon as possible, the most important rules for spelling and a short list of words commonly misspelled have been presented first. This short list has been compiled from statistics gathered from many sources, by members of the faculty of Phillips Academy. The longer list, "Words Often Misspelled," which has been alphabetically arranged for purposes of reference, contains two thousand words which pupils actually misspell. The short compilations of words grouped by subjects have been prepared or corrected by specialists in these various departments. This is followed by a list of words often confused.

RULES AND SUGGESTIONS FOR SPELLING

I. A monosyllable ending in a single consonant preceded by a single vowel doubles that final consonant before a suffix beginning with a vowel.

hopping	robbery	baggage	cutting
dragging	planned	plodding	putting

II. A polysyllable ending in a single consonant preceded by a single vowel usually doubles the final consonant before a suffix beginning with a vowel, if the accent falls on the syllable preceding the suffix.

beginner controlling omitting intermittent preferred occurrence compelled acquittal

If the accent does not fall on the syllable preceding the suffix, the final consonant is not doubled.

traveler benefited inference banqueting traveling summoning profited conquering

III. Words ending in silent e drop the e before a suffix beginning with a vowel, but retain it before a suffix beginning with a consonant.

amusing	lodging	movable	extremely
amusement	practicing	movement	rueful

Exceptions:

A. Words ending in **ge** or **ce** retain the **e** before a suffix beginning with **a** or **o** to preserve the soft sound of the consonant.

noticeable vengeance courageous advantageous

B. The following words retain the final e before a suffix beginning with a vowel:

toeing shoeing mileage dyeing tingeing agreeable hoeing singeing C. The following words drop the final e before a suffix beginning with a consonant:

truly awful argument duly judgment acknowledgment

IV. Words ending in ie drop the e and change the i to y before the suffix ing.

dying lying vying tying

V. Words ending in y preceded by a consonant change the y to i before a suffix.

business holiest greedier dutiful ordinarily accompaniment

Before the suffix ing the y is retained.

studying hurrying accompanying carrying

VI. When the sound of the digraph is e, i comes before e, except after c.

relieve chief receipt ceiling siege yield conceit deceive

Exceptions:

seize weird leisure neither

When the sound of the digraph is not e, the digraph is usually spelled ei.

freight sleight forfeit foreign heir sleigh

Exceptions:

friend sieve

VII. The final letter of a word or prefix is usually retained before the same letter in the suffix or root.

meanness unnecessary misstatement accidentally innumerable specially dissatisfy cruelly finally generally formally naturally

In cases of alternative adjective forms in ic and ical — e.g., satiric and satirical — the corresponding adverb is formed by adding ly to ical.

satirically historically tragically hysterically

VIII. The final s of mis and dis before a root is not doubled.

disagree misjudge mistake disappearance

IX. The plurals of nouns ending in s, sh, ch (soft), x, or z, and the third person singular indicative present of verbs with the same endings are formed by adding es to the root.

gases fishes buzzes matches foxes speeches boxes classes

X. A noun ending in y preceded by a vowel forms its plural by adding s.

holidays journeys valleys convoys

XI. A noun ending in y preceded by a consonant changes the y to i and adds es to form the plural.

cries libraries enemies countries territories allies

Proper names ending in y preceded by a consonant form their plural by adding s.

Henrys Marys

XII. A verb ending in y preceded by a consonant changes the y to i before the es of the third person singular indicative present and the ed of the third person indicative past.

tries tried cries cried

XIII. Nouns ending in o preceded by a consonant add es, preceded by a vowel add s, to form the plural.

negroes

Some words of foreign origin, ending in o preceded by a consonant, add only s to form the plural.

solos

XIV. The following rules should be observed in forming possessives:

A. A noun regularly adds 's to form the possessive singular and ' to form the possessive plural.

boy's boys'

B. Nouns forming their plural in any way except by adding s or es add 's to form the possessive plural.

THE fundamental aim of this volume is to enable pupils to express their thoughts freely, clearly, and forcibly. The work follows closely the requirements of the College Entrance Examination Board, and of the New York State Education Department.

¶ In Part One are given the elements of description, narration, exposition, and argument; also special chapters on letter-writing and poetry. A more complete and comprehensive treatment of the four forms of discourse already discussed is furnished in Part Two. In each part is presented a series of themes covering these subjects, the purpose being to give the pupil inspiration, and that confidence in himself which comes from the frequent repetition of an act. A single new principle is introduced into each theme, and this is developed in the text, and illustrated by carefully selected examples.

The pupils are taught how to correct their own errors, and also how to get the main thought in preparing their lessons. Careful coördination with the study of literature and with other school studies is made throughout the book.

The modern character of the illustrative extracts can not fail to interest every boy and girl. Concise summaries are given following the treatment of the various forms of discourse, and toward the end of the book there is a very comprehensive and compact summary of grammatical principles. More than usual attention is devoted to the treatment of argument.


