1. By C/N 1, 4 Dec 50, subject above, TI&E O to CofS thru G-3, G-4, G-1, COM, proposal is made that TI&E Section, GHQ, FEC assume operational control of Armed Forces Radio Service in Japan. JLCOM presently operates this service with TI&E being charged with policy control, technical supervision and geographical placement of stations.

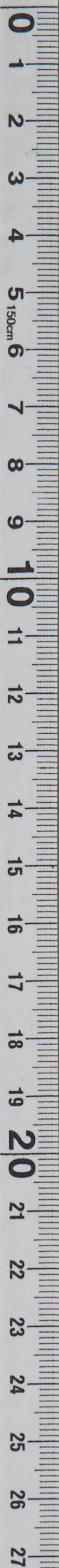
2. By C/N 2, 9 Dec 50, Subject above, G-3 who has staff responsibility for TI&E, returns C/N 1 to TI&E thru G-4, G-1 & ^{Compt} and states that G-3 does not concur in TI&E proposal for following reasons:

- a. GHQ is primarily a policy and not an implementing agency.
- b. Since JLCOM will continue to be responsible for the logistic support of AFRS under the subject proposal, it is felt that transfer of its operational control could lead to a split responsibility of effort.
- c. There is no indicated criticism of JLCOM effort in the TI&E C/N 1.
- d. Eighth Army did not concur in this plan when it was first present in November 1949.
- e. The recommended change will actually result in two major headquarters responsible for operational control and logistic support.
- f. It is believed that this action should be referred to JLCOM for comment prior to final decision.

3. While this TI&E proposal is of primary interest to G-3, there is a G-4 interest due to the logistic implications in duplicating and transferring headquarters and real estate to effect the change over. The TI&E proposal was disapproved under normal conditions and the existing emergency conditions give additional reasons for disapproval. Since JLCOM is the prime logistical and operational agency for GHQ within Japan and no fault has been expressed over JLCOM operation of AFRS by TI&E the transfer of operational responsibility is not considered warranted.

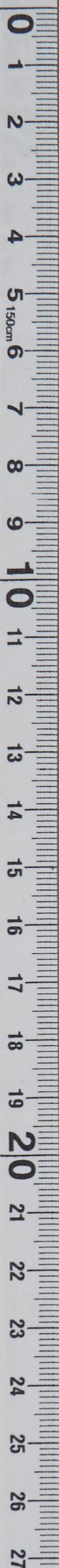

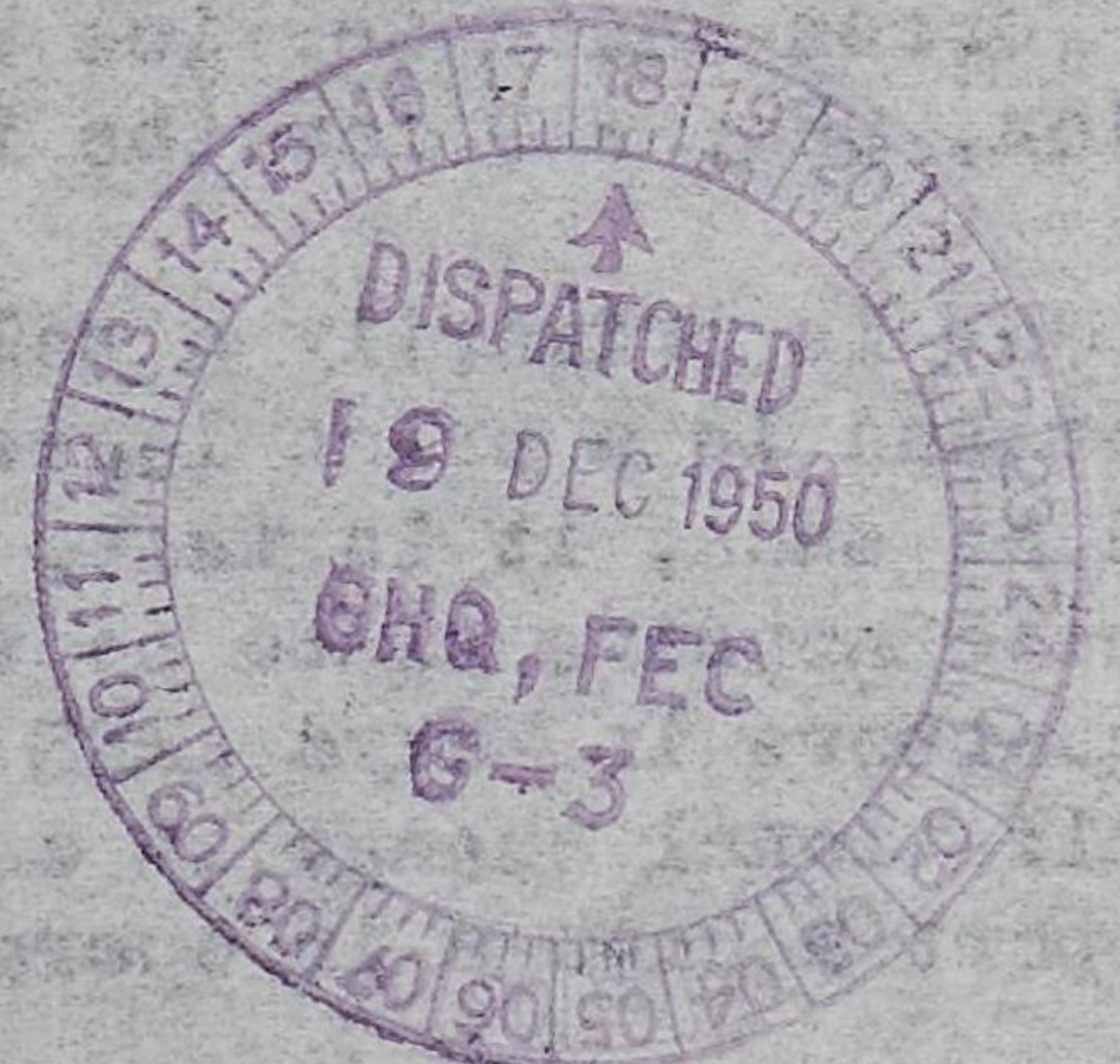

to still another dual policy subject to all the inherent dissatisfactions of such a program. It follows that if some of the subordinate commands are to continue their AFPS operational responsibilities, that the program should be consistent in having all AFPS under subordinate operational control unless it is shown that the subordinate element currently charged with such responsibility is either incompetent or otherwise unable to fulfill the assigned mission. There is no indicated criticism of the JLCOM effort in the TI&E paper.

d. All of the reasons that originally led to Eighth Army's non-concurrence when this same request was presented in Nov of 49, currently obtain to a degree and will obtain in detail in the event of implementation of any redeployment plan. Since the objections as presented by Eighth Army in Nov of 49 were considered conclusive at that time, similar objections appear to be conclusive when considering the long range requirements. This should not be an interim solution.

e. Transfer of operational control to TI&E does not materially alter the fact that, within policy, one agency, namely JLCOM, is currently responsible for operation of AFPS. In fact, as pointed out in para b above, the recommended change will actually result in two major headquarters, rather than one as at present, responsible for the closely integrated missions of operational control and logistic support.

3. G-3 feels that closer liaison, perhaps to include liaison by physical representation by JLCOM within the GHQ TI&E structure, is definitely indicated and should satisfy all TI&E requirements for closer control over local AFPS agencies. It is felt such a solution will govern under any given set of circumstances, emergency or otherwise. There appears to be no reason why coordination of AFPS policy with that of Stars and Stripes cannot be adequately accomplished by this means.

4. It is believed this action should be referred to JLCOM for comment prior to final decision not only for reasons inherent to the action, but also because of the precedent established in reference of the similar action to Eighth Army in Nov of 49.

1. It is considered highly desirable for TI&E Section, GHQ, FEC, to assume operational control of the Armed Forces Radio Service in Japan. The Japan Logistical Command presently operates this service in Japan with the TI&E Section, GHQ, being "charged with policy control, technical supervision, and geographical placement of Armed Forces Radio Stations, Far East Command, and designation of the headquarters which shall exercise immediate supervision." (Sec III, para 2, Circular No. 3, GHQ, FEC).

2. If this section assumes operational control of AFRS, it is planned to set up a network headquarters in Tokyo AFRS (Radio Tokyo Building), thus providing a means of immediate central and supervision over dissemination of news and other information. Personnel now assigned to Radio Division, TI&E Sec, GHQ, FEC, and the military and civilian spaces presently authorized the Radio Division, Information Section, Headquarters, Japan Logistical Command, will be utilized to form this network headquarters. No additional military or civilian spaces will be required.

3. The advantages of this proposed action are:

a. It will provide the necessary close coordination of information in Japan. TI&E Sec, GHQ, is responsible for the publication of Stars and Stripes. Under the present organization, radio, which is a complementary medium, is controlled by a subordinate headquarters. This arrangement does not lend itself to immediate and uniform application of policy to the two major news outlets.

b. It will make one agency (TI&E, GHQ) completely responsible for the operation of AFRS Japan and provide it with a commensurate degree of control. The present method of control, through a subordinate command, is not completely satisfactory, particularly with respect to news releases. TI&E Sec, GHQ, has the ultimate responsibility for AFRS, but its control is in an indirect manner, which in practice is frequently ineffective in dealing with situations which develop unexpectedly.

c. The concept of Joint Operation of radio, as adopted in the Far East Command by letter "Joint Operation of Armed Forces Radio Service and Stars and Stripes (Tab "A")", will be more fully realized with control in a joint headquarters than in a unilateral one. TI&E Sec, GHQ, is now a unified staff section with Navy and Air Force taking an active part. Certain

Navy and Air Force personnel are now on duty with AFRS. It is believed that maximum support by the Navy and Air Force of the joint operation of AFRS will be obtained if control is effected by GHQ.

4. TI&E Section submitted a plan in November 1949 for GHQ Operational Control of AFRS (Tab "B"). This plan received concurrence of COMNAVFE and CG, FEAF. It was referred to CG, Eighth Army, who did not concur. Because of this non-concurrence action on the plan was suspended. It is being re-submitted at this time because the conditions which caused non-concurrence by Eighth Army no longer exist and actual integration of Navy and Air Force personnel into AFRS has been effected subsequently.

5. In present circumstances it is believed advisable for operational control of AFRS stations in PHILCOM, RYCOM, and Korea to be retained by the local commands, with TI&E Sec, GHQ, responsible for staff supervision as prescribed by Circular 3, GHQ. AFRS Japan will continue to give these stations full support.

6. To accomplish the proposed change of operational control from Japan Logistical Command to General Headquarters, it is planned:

a. To transfer "Japan Armed Forces Radio Service Detachments," 8049th Army Unit, from Japan Logistical Command to Headquarters and Service Command. These detachments were organized under an approved Table of Distribution Number 301-1243, 20 March 1950, and designated as "Eighth Army Armed Forces Radio Service Detachments." They were redesignated "Japan Armed Forces Radio Service Detachments, 8049th Army Unit" by para 2, General Order No. 135, Headquarters Japan Logistical Command, dated 6 November 50. (See TD attached as Tab "C"). It is planned to retain this TD. This arrangement has been coordinated with G-1, G-3, and Mil Pers Br of Headquarters and Service Command.

b. Transfer and movement of military and civilian personnel from Radio Division, Information Section, Japan Logistical Command, to TI&E Sec, GHQ. This transfer will involve one officer, one civilian, and one enlisted man for whom additional spaces in the manning level of TI&E Sec, GHQ, are requested.

c. Move the Radio Division, TIAE Sec, GHQ, from Mitsubishi-Sheji Building, to Radio Tokyo Building. This will require an allocation of approximately 900 sq. ft. of office space in Radio Tokyo Building in addition to that already authorized for Tokyo AFRS.

d. Transfer twenty (20) Department of Army civilians and their personnel spaces from Japan Logistical Command to General Headquarters. These civilians are now employed by AFRS stations in Japan and will be continued in this capacity.

e. The plan for budgeting and monetary support of the jointly operated AFRS in Japan is attached as Tab "D".

7. Request approval of:

a. The proposed plan for assumption of operational control of AFRS in Japan by TIAE Sec, GHQ, FEC, to include:

- (1) The transfer of "Japan Armed Forces Radio Detachments, 8049th Army Unit" from JLCOM to Headquarters and Service Command.
- (2) The transfer and movement of military and civilian personnel from Radio Division, Information Section, Headquarters, JLCOM, to TIAE Sec, GHQ.
- (3) Movement of Radio Division, TIAE Sec, GHQ, to Radio Tokyo Building, and allocation of approximately 900 sq. ft. of office space in Radio Tokyo Building in addition to that presently authorized Tokyo AFRS.
- (4) Transfer of twenty (20) Department of Army Civilians from JLCOM to GHQ.
- (5) The plan of budgeting and monetary support.

1. On 21 November 1950, CG X Corps requested that three C-47 aircraft, in addition to three C-47s currently furnished by FEAF, COCARCOM, be stationed at Yongpo airfield to support Corps operations. Request was also made that all six of these planes be assigned to X Corps for operational control. (Tab A)

2. G-4 presented matter to CG FEAF for consideration and forwarded interim reply to X Corps. (Tab B)

3. On 22 November 1950, CG FEAF presented the requirement for six planes to CG COCARCOM and requested every effort be made to meet X Corps requirements, consistent with 8th Army and 5th Air Force requirements. CG X Corps was info addressee. (Tab C)

4. On 22 November 1950, FEAF Operations (Colonel Price) presented a draft message to G-3 (Tab D) stating that FEAF desired this draft to become a part, or all, of CINCPAC's reply to X Corp's request. This message stated that operational control of all cargo aircraft must remain in COCARCOM to insure maximum utilization of airlift to meet requirements of all organizations in Korea, that X Corps requests were well recognized and every effort would be made to meet them, but that decision on method used rested with CG COCARCOM. G-4 concurred in G-3's recommendation that CINCPAC reply, incorporating this draft, be prepared for approval by CofS.

5. G-4 recommends approval of proposed message to CG X Corps stating FEAF views on operational control of aircraft, and return to G-4 for action.

Cannot agree with the implications or demands made in Para 2 of your cite AX 3591 B CG for the following reasons.

A. CG FEAF does not hold op control now and therefore cannot retain it. Existing agreement only gives op control to FEAF of "all aircraft operating in execution of Far East Air Force missions as assigned by CINCFE". MAG is an integral component of an amphibious team scheduled for post Korea retention in Japan. Mission of Marine Air is primarily to support operation of US Marine Forces in exactly the same manner as any other component of a combat team such as artillery or tanks. Marine combat team liable to be moved to any trouble point in the Far East and should not be considered as an integral part of Japan's air defense.

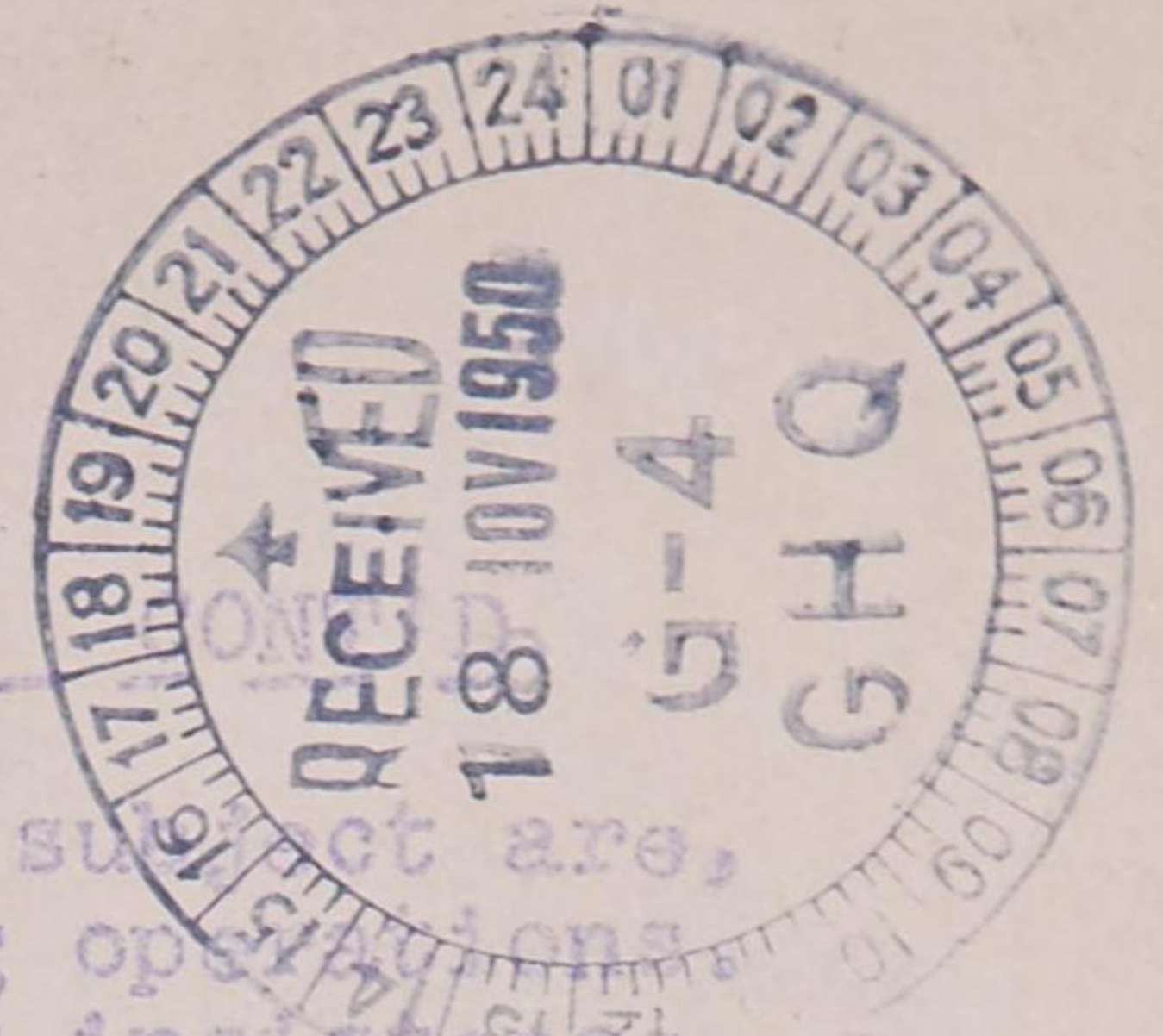
B. COMNAVFE sees no objection to op control of Marine Air being delegated to FEAF by COMNAVFE for those exercises directed by CINCFE that call for air defense operations and obviously has no objection to FEAF assuming op control in emergencies as directed by CINCFE. These periods however would normally be a very small portion of the total time and such control by USAF, which is common practice in other areas, offers no problem or difficulty. Operational control as interpreted by COMNAVFE is essential in this case to the service concerned for the person holding it has the authority to change operating schedules, operating procedures, and operating techniques. Since all components of the team must work as a team all operational factors must be under the control of a single service, that is, the Naval Service.

1. ECA by letter referred to in instant letter affirms their intention to provide 30,000 metric tons of cereal grains for Korean relief and state their understanding they have no further responsibility.
2. During period ECA had responsibility for financing Korean relief requirements they had made arrangement to borrow from Japanese economy, thru ESS, 30,000 metric tons cereal grains for September, October and November. The President has now relieved ECA of financial responsibility in re Korean relief.
3. Instant letter acknowledges to ECA, Tokyo office that they no longer have responsibility of Korean relief and that they need provide no other grain requirements.
4. Arrangements made by G-4 to take over from ECA their arrangements with ESS to borrow from Japanese economy relief requirements not furnished by UN donations.



1. There is enclosed herewith copy of a letter from this office to Major General W. F. Marquat, Chief of the Economic and Scientific Section, GHQ, SCAP, dated 21 September 1950.

2. The attached letter relates to the loan of 15,000 metric tons of polished rice and 20,548 metric tons of rough barley by the Food Agency of the Minister of Agriculture and Forestry of the Japanese Government to ECA. The 20,548 metric tons of rough barley after processing will produce 15,000 metric tons of polished barley. ECA will deliver this quantity of cereal to Korea for relief purposes as the September requirement for food.

3. It is understood from the meeting of representatives of this Mission with members of your staff on 19 September 1950 that the Public Health and Welfare Section of CINC UNC will assume responsibility for the food need of Korea beyond the 30,000 metric tons to be furnished by ECA as the September requirement.

Dear General Marquat:

The invasion of South Korea resulted in such heavy losses of essential food stocks that early imports of cereal grains were imperative. To expedite the timely delivery of emergency food stuffs required for the relief and support of the people of South Korea, this Mission undertook on several occasions in late July and early August to discuss with members of your staff, arrangements for the temporary borrowing of limited quantities of rice and barley from Japanese stocks.

The agreement which this Mission reached with members of your staff provided for the maximum delivery from Japanese stocks of 15,000 metric tons of polished rice and 15,000 metric tons of barley during the month of September 1950. The barley to be delivered was to be of fair, average quality weighing an average of 48 pounds per bushel with not to exceed 12 per cent moisture content, and not over 5 per cent admixture and impurities. It was agreed that the Economic Cooperation Administration Mission to Korea would guarantee to replace actually borrowed Japanese stocks within a period of 90 days from the date such stocks were delivered to the Federal Supply Service. Replacement was to be made either from United Nations contributions or from normal ECA sources, and was to be equal in kind, quantity and quality to the commodities borrowed. This Mission also agreed to pay, or reimburse the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry, for necessary costs in connection with the movement, handling and warehousing of the borrowed cereals.

Under contemplated changes in responsibility for procurement of civilian relief supplies for South Korea it is expected that any agency subsequently charged with this responsibility may wish to assume the obligations remaining to ECA under the agreement at the time of such transfer. However, whatever arrangements may be undertaken by the agency succeeding to this responsibility, the Mission wishes to reaffirm their definite intention to carry out fully their obligations to replace all actual borrowings, and to pay all necessary handling and storage costs incurred incident thereto up to the date of the actual transfer of procurement responsibility.

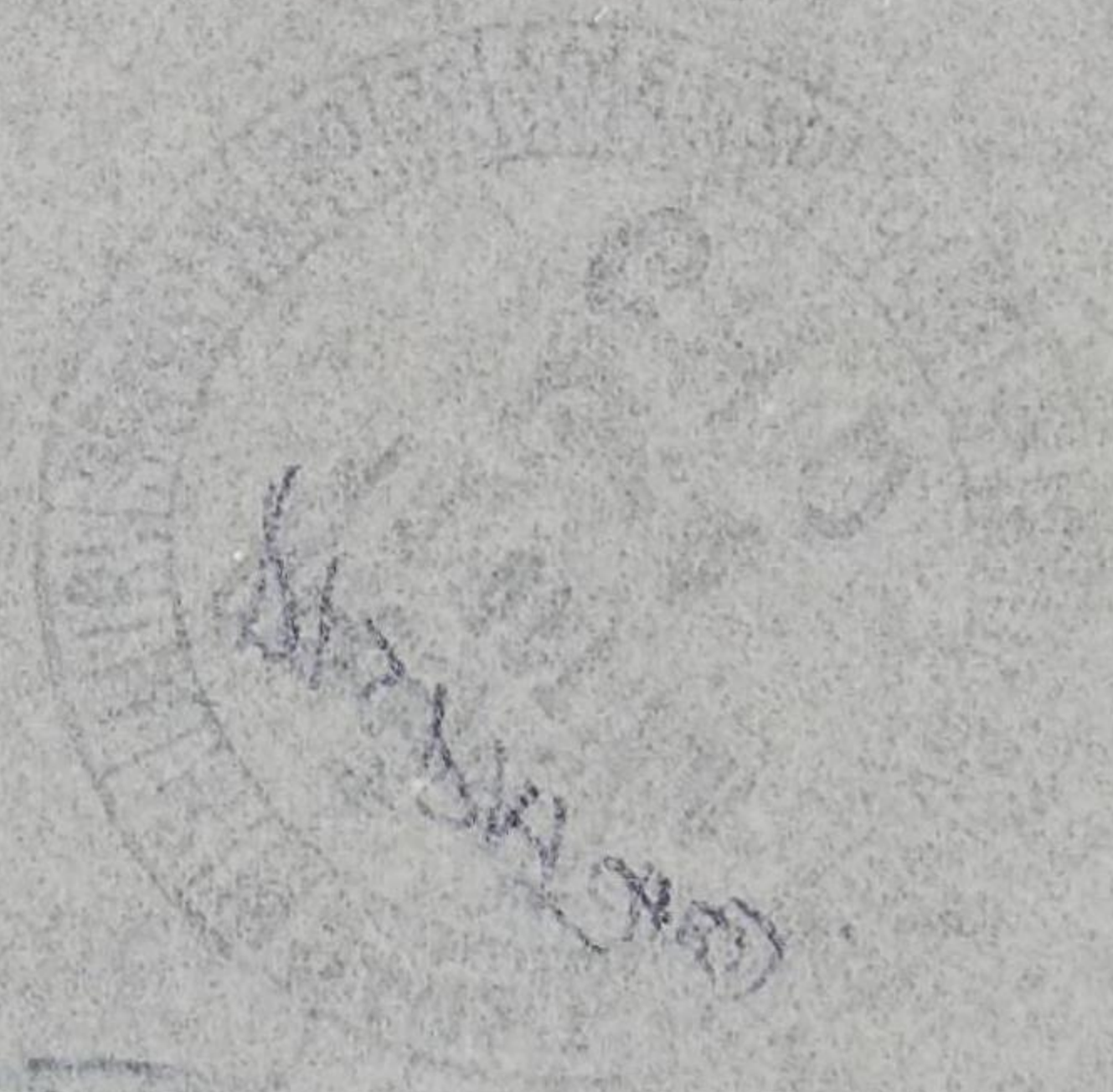

1. The CG, 3rd Logistical Command is charged with the Logistical Support of X Corps. He will execute his various duties in conformance with policies and directives issued by X Corps Headquarters. - (1) Determines requirements for the establishment and maintenance of levels of supply, as prescribed.
- (2) Initiates timely requisitioning action on such supply agencies as may be designated.
- (3) Receives, stores and issues all classes and types of supplies and conducts in-storage maintenance.
- (4) Receives and processes requisitions from units assigned for logistic support and submits reports and informational media as directed.

b. Evacuation:

- (1) Receives from Divisions and other units of X Corps, sick and wounded; salvage; POW's; personal effects, and un-serviceable, repairable material beyond the repair capabilities of forward maintenance units.
- (2) Arranges for shipment to Japan or US of personnel, salvage and personal effects.

c. Operations:

- (1) Base Depots.
- (2) Base Shops.
- (3) Hospitals in 3rd Logistical Command Area.
- (4) Miscellaneous facilities such as bakeries, laundries, etc in the 3rd Logistical Command Area.
- (5) Port of Inchon.
- (6) All railways within X Corps Area.
- (7) POW inclosures in 3rd Logistical Command Area.
- (8) Staging Area.
- (9) Replacement Centers.
- (10) Post Exchanges in X Corps Area, Except PX Facilities provided by 1st Marine Division.

1. It is requested that Far East Air Forces Headquarters be relieved of the requirement to maintain capability of dropping one airborne RCT as directed in UNC Operations Order #1, dated 30 August 1950. The 187th Airborne RCT is now being air-landed into Kimpo Airfield. This operation will be completed 30 September 1950.

2. This requirement has made it necessary to remove approximately 52 C-47 aircraft from normal operations. It has been further necessary to withhold C-119 aircraft from flying commitments to assure that sufficient number are in commission for a drop of the Airborne RCT in one wave. Airlift of freight and personnel intra-Japan and Japan to Korea has consequently been reduced.

3. The C-47 aircraft are urgently needed to provide logistical support for FEAF tactical units. If FEAF is relieved of the responsibility referred to above, these aircraft can be returned to their organizations. Further, C-119 aircraft can be more effectively utilized for cargo operations.
