The writer states that he was coaxed by his children into taking the whole family to the Kokusai Theater in ASAKUSA. When they entered the theater it was already filled to capacity. Soon the theater was so overcrowded that even those who had been seated had to stand on their seats. It was very dangerous for all concerned.

He states that something should be done about this over-crowding of theaters. The theater management's irresponsibility in endangering the safety of the audience should be made punishable.

He states that because of the extreme overcrowdedness, he lost two of his childrens' overcoats, which he held in one arm while holding his smallest child with his other in order to protect him from being hurt. His wife, who is not physically strong, was shoved so much that she fell ill from fatigue.

He states that he realizes that theaters have to make profits but he believes that more consideration should be given sanitation, fire hazards, and the prevention of accidents. This crowded condition also encourages pocket-picking.

The writer requests that GHQ advise theater managers to stop the overcrowding of theaters and to exercise more control over theater crowds in order to insure their safety.
