

Questions and Answers in the Constituent Assembly of India (Legislation) regarding protest against execution of Marshal Tojo and others in view of Justice Pal's judgement.

All these files have to be placed before the Justice Mukherjee Commission. The file at S.No. (3) is not available with National Archives and they have requested that this be transferred to them for permanent preservation and use.

2. Another letter has been received from the Policy Planning & Research Division stating that Shri Arun Shouri, Hon'ble Minister of State for Planning & Programme Implementation has sought permission to consult the two files at Sl.No.(1) & (2) of MEA for a research scholar. Justice Mukherjee Commission of Enquiry – Request for Files

The National Archives have made a reference to the Ministry of External Affairs regarding 3 files that are to be placed before the Justice Mukherjee Commission of Enquiry into the disappearance of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. Of these two files – 27-W/46 – Indian Representation on Courts to try Far Eastern War Criminals and 489-CJK/49 – Justice Pal's Judgement at the International Military Tribunal, Tokyo, were referred to this Ministry with the request that the the Top Secret classification be down-graded so that they can be placed before J?

I have been through both the above mentioned files. There is no reference to the alleged disappearance of *Netaji* in either file, which would make it relevant to the Justice Mukherjee Commission of Enquiry. Before these files are placed before the Commission, we may request NGO Section (which is handling the matter) to enquire whether Government is required to place files that have no apparent bearing on the case before the Commission if so directed.

Justice Mukherjee Commission of Enquiry - Request for Files

JS(EA) may kindly see notes from page 4 ante.

The two files contain no reference to the circumstances of the alleged disappearance of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. It appears that certain individuals / organizations who have filed affadavits before the Commission have made some reference to the dissenting judgement of Justice R.B.Pal and the appearance of Netaji in the list of war criminals. The dissenting judgement is already with the Commission. The Commission, however, wishes to see all files in connection with Justice Pal's judgement.

2. There are two questions involved:

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(a) The question of principle; whether Government needs to provide classified files relating to Justice R.B.Pal (who had no connection to the disapperance of Netaji) and his dissenting judgement to the Commission, simply because there is an indirect reference to Justice R.B.Pal's judgement (which is already with the Commission) in some of the affadavits given by individuals before the Commission on Enquiry.

(b) The question of national interest: Whether the submission of these papers, which may result in them becoming public documents, is in the national interest. Japan is an important country from our foreign policy perspective. Many Japanese believe that the Tokyo Trials of 1946-48 were not conducted according to the principles of natural justice, but were intended to enforce the supremacy of the victors over the vanquished. Till today, many Japanese, including at the highest political levels, consider Justice Pal's dissenting judgement as a vindication that justice was not served. They also associate Justice Pal's views with that of India and its Government of the time. The papers on the files, however, present a somewhat different picture. Justice Pal's dissenting judgement was not viewed as balanced by Government of India. For instance, Prime Minister Nehru said in his CCB telegram to the Governor General of India that: "...any such move on our part would associate us with Justice Pal's dissenting judgement in the Tokyo trials. In this judgement wild and sweeping statements have been made with many of which we do not agree at all." There are other notings of file by the then Foreign Secretary such as " ... Not content with holding that Tojo and Co. are not guilty, the learned Judge has chosen to justify Japan's actions and to condemn those who, after all, were our wartime allies. In fact from a casual reading of his judgement, I felt that it was a monumental justification of Japan's conduct during the last three decades." Publication / disclosure of such information may not serve the interests of India-Japan relations, especially when the files do not contain any relevant information on Netaji.

3. Three options are available to Ministry:

(a) We claim privilege of withholding the files on grounds of national interest.

(b) We send the files to the Chairman of the Commission with the request that this not be treated as a submission, but only be seen for information so that the Chairman can satisfy himself that nothing of any relevance to the disappearance of Netaji is contained in the files. (c) We declassify the files and submit them to the Commission.

4. The matter contained in the files is not of a magnitude that compels us to claim privilege of withholding the files. Option 3(b) is therefore recommended for consideration and approval.

I am unable to agree with the logic advanced that we withhold these files on the grounds of national interest. The main ground for doing so is that this would show that the Government of India did not agree with Justice Radha Vinod Pal's judgement. To that extent, this may affect our image in Japan where some Japanese may associate Justice Pal's view with that of India.

In my view, both Justice Pal's dissenting judgement, the circumstances which caused it and the institutions and individuals who disagreed with it in the Government of India have passed into history. No great public or national interest is damaged by these files being declassified.

1. In general, all the FRs basically pertain to the issue of the alleged presence of documents in various archives of Russia relating to the stay of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose in Russia in 1945 and subsequent years as mentioned by Shri Samar Guha, former M.P., in his various communications. This issue has been taken up by the Govt. of India with the Russian Government from time to time. The Commission now desires to know the outcome of the efforts made by this Ministry in this direction.

2. Considering each FR separately, the issues raised and our comments thereon are as under.

3. FRI: The Commission has asked for a report on the outcome of the inquiries made by the Russian authorities into the documents relating to Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose stated to be in their possession, pursuant to the letters received by them on this issue from Shri Samar Guha, former M.P. The Russian Foreign Office vide their Note Verbale of 8th January, 1992 had informed that "according to the data in the Central and Republican Archives, no information whatsoever is available on the stay of ... Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose in the Soveit Union in 1945 and thereafter".

4. FRII: This is again regarding the response of the Russian Government to the letters received from Shri Samar Guha. The position is the same as explained in para 3 above.

The Commission has also asked for a copy of the CCPA's 5. decision in March, 1991 which is mentioned in the enclosure to the FR. It is observed that a note for the CCPA was prepared by MHA on the controversy regarding the ashes of Netaji and also his death. MHA vide their letter of 4.4.91 had informed this Ministry of CCPA's approval of the proposal contained in para 11 of the note. We may, therefore, forward to the Commission a copy of MHA's letter alongwith the extract of para 11 of the note.

6. FRIII: The Commission has asked for copies of the secret documents and report of outcome of the high-level investigation into the secret documents relating to Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose as mentioned in the reply dated 26.3.91 of former DM, Shri Digvijay Singh, to Shri Samar Guha, former M.P. In the first instance, it may be mentioned that these 'secret documents' mentioned in Shri Samar Guha's letter of 26th February, 1991 are supposed to be lying in the archives of countries like Russia, UK and USA. As regards the availability of these documents, the Commission has already been informed of the position country-wise. The only documents

that were received from Russia were forwarded to the Commission and, as it is understood, are under its examination. We have, therefore, no other documents to be sent to the Commission.

7. Also, the former DM's reply to Shri Samar Guha was mistakenly interpreted by Shri Guha as an indication of a high-level inquiry having been constituted by the then Government to look into the 'secret documents' relating to Netaji. This is borne out by notings in EA Divisions's file No. C/551/12/93-JP-Vol.II. The fact of the matter is that the issues raised by Shri Samar Guha from time to time had been taken up by our Mission in Moscow through démarches made with the Russian Foreign Office. From our files, it is seen that the former EAM, Shri Dinesh Singh, had also responded to Shri Samar Guha through his letter of 25.5.93 about the Russian response in the matter. This letter mentions documents received from the Russians which had no bearing on the scope of enquiry of Shri Samar Guha's letters, i.e., regarding the alleged stay of Netaji in USSR in the year 1945 or later.

8. FRIV : This is the same as FRII.

9. It may be mentioned here that the then Ambassador in Russia had in July, 1995, taken up with the Foreign Office the question of examination of all available material in the archives of Russia to finally determine whether Netaji had entered or stayed in the territory of the former Soviet Union in 1945 and in subsequent years. The Foreign Office's reply of 27th October, 1995 is very categorical in that it asserts that "we can be sure that Netaji has never set foot on Russian soil" and that "extensive research can hardly leave any doubts to this effect".

10. In view of the above, we may send a consolidated reply to the Commission enclosing copies of the information/clarification received from the Russian Foreign Office.

In response to our letter of 16th July, 2002 on the subject, the Commission has now sent a tentative programme for the proposed visit and also enumerated their revised requirements during the visit. Accordingly, the visiting team will comprise the Chairman and the Secretary of the Commission. As per the tentative itinerary, the team will be staying for five days each in Japan (14.9.02 to 18.9.02) and Taiwan (19.9.02 to 23.9.02).

2. As regards the Commission's stay in Japan, our Mission in Tokyo will have to make **hotel arrangements** as per the itinerary. For **transport**, it is felt that hiring of one car would be sufficient since only two members are going in the team.

3. As for the **space** requirements for conducting the hearing, considering that there is only one witness to be examined by the Commission, either a hall or room could be provided in the Chancery or an additional hotel room could be booked by the Mission.

4. Among the requests made earlier by the Commission, a senior and competent officer of the Mission was to be earmarked as the Liaison officer for the Commission.

5. The Commission has proposed that a **stenographer** could be spared by our Mission. This seems to be logical since there is only one witness who has agreed to depose formally before the Commission, and, therefore, the requirement of secretarial assistance for the Commission would be minimal. The Commission had earlier asked for the services of an **Interpreter** for its interactions with the local public. This could also be arranged by the Mission.

6. Regarding the request for **video recording** of the informal meeting of the Commission with some of the witnesses at the Renkoji Temple, we may request our Mission to make necessary arrangements. They could similarly arrange for a **photographer** to take photographs at the Renkoji Temple as requested by the Commission.

7. As regards the proposed visit to Taiwan, since there is no representative of the Govt. of India in Taiwan, we will not be able to make the desired arrangements through such channels as proposed by the Commission. A decision will, therefore, have to be taken as to how the visit of the Commission to Taiwan is to be arranged and necessary facilities provided to them. In this connection, a background of the visit of the Khosla Commission to Taiwan in 1973 as available in the files of EA Division will be revealing. At that time, the MHA was informed that the Commission could not be extended any facilities through official channels and that they were to use ordinary travel channels to arrange for visas, accommodation, etc. in Taiwan (S.No. 83-A/corr of F.No.C/551/5/72-JP-Vol.I refers). MHA's sanction for the visit of the Justice Khosla Commission may also be seen at S.No.11/corr of F.No. C/551/5/72-JP-Vol.II.

8. In view of the above, it is proposed to write to the Justice Mukherjee Commission and our Mission in Tokyo as per the draft letters placed below. Also the decision regarding modalities of the visit of the Commission to Taiwan needs to be taken in view of para 7 above.

Reference: above note by US (NGO) regarding the visit to Japan and Taiwan of the Commission enquiring into the alleged disappearance of Netaji.

2. Arrangements required in Tokyo (paras 2-6 of US (NGO)'s note) will be made by our Mission. Expenditure will be raised against a sanction issued by MHA.

3. With regard to the proposed visit to Taiwan there are two issues to be considered:

(a) The Commission has requested the "representative of the Government of India in Taiwan" to make necessary arrangements. Government has no such representative in Taiwan. Although Government has a non-official representation – the India-Taipei Association – this is not officially acknowledged by Government. Funds for ITA are entirely paid through DG. No accounts are rendered to CCOA.

ITA could assist in making arrangements only, but will <u>not</u> be in a position to make any payments against MHA or Government sanction. ITA Taipei will also be advised not to be associated with the Commission's visit to Taiwan, and if contacted, to state that they are a non-Governmental organisation. We may also have to discreetly brief Justice Mukherjee before his visit on the sensitivities involved, in order to avoid misunderstanding, and also public mention in his report of the status of ITA. Payment for all services in Taipei will have to be made by the Commission delegation themselves. (nHA will also need to be advised according?) (b) The second issue is regarding their programme in Taipei. So far they have **not** been able to locate any witnesses. Although ITA Taipei has made more than one effort (the Commission is not aware of this fact) the leads given by the Commission have been found inadequate by Taiwanese authorities. Likewise, we have no information whether the site of the alleged plane crash, the site of the Japanese Military Field Hospital, etc. still remain. This may not be likely given the phenomenal economic development that Taiwan has seen in the past half century. We could therefore suggest to the Commission for its consideration that a five-day visit to Taipei may not be justified in the light of the above.

We may, therefore, request PMO to send us the rest of the relevant material from the concerned file to facilitate our reply to the Commission. A U.O. note is placed below for signature please.

2. FRII (S.No. 58/c) : The Commission has asked for the address, phone numbers, etc., of the National Archives of USA and "Records Administration, Maryland, USA." A fax to our Mission in Washington is placed on the file for signature please.

3. **FRIII (S.No. 59/c)**: This refers to a previous letter dated 28.1.02 of the Commission which does not seem to have been received by us. In this letter, the Commission has referred to PMO's note of 23.5.1990 and a few communications which were endorsed therewith to JS(EA) and has desired to know MEA's action thereon. Since the Commission has mentioned that the concerned notes and letters are available in PMO's file No.n 800/6/C/I/90-Pol, we may write to PMO to obtain these documents to enable us take further necessary action in the matter.

4. **FRIV (S.No. 60/c)** : L&T Division has responded to our note of 27th July (S.No. 20/c) seeking to know whether India had signed any treaty in 1971 by which the limitations of time bar regarding arrest and trial of war criminals was withdrawn. Our reference to L&T Division was in response to the Commission's request for the details of war criminals of India or of Indian origin for whose arrest and trial India had signed the treaty.

5. L&T Division has now clarified that inter alia India's accession to the Convention on the non-Applicability of the Statutory Limitations to War Crimes and Crimes Against Humanity on 12th January, 1971 was not linked to the trial of any specific accused persons (since no Indian nationals were accused of war crimes) but was an affirmation of India's support for the principle that persons accused of war crimes should not escape punishment through applicable statutory limitations. We may, therefore, reply to the Commission as per the letter placed below.

6. **FRV (S.No. 68/c)**: This is regarding the address of various archives in Russia. We have already sought the desired information from our Mission in Moscow vide our letter of 5.7.02 at S.No.13/c. 

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The Justice Mukherjee Commission enquiring into the alleged disappearance of Subhas Chandra Bose had desired to visit the following sites in Taipei in connection with the enquiry:

- 30 -

- (a) Taihoku Airport, site of the alleged plane crash on 18.8.1945.
- (b) Nam Mong (Nam Mon) Military Hospital, Taihoku, where Netaji allegedly died.
- (c) Municipal Crematorium, Taipei, where the alleged body of Netaji was allegedly cremated. (To access records)
- (d) Bureau of Health & Hygiene, Taipei Municiapl Hospital the cremation certificate was issued by them.
- (e) Hokutu Military Hospital where Col. H. Rehman and others in the alleged plane crash were transferred.

2. ITA was requested to let us know the present status of the above sites and feasibility of the proposed visit to these places by the Commission. ITA was also requested to indicate what 'new developments' have come up at the location of the former Japanese Military Hospital and whether its records have been transferred elsewhere.

3. ITA has given their response to the above points, para-wise, as under:

- (a) Taihoku Airport is the operational domestic airport in Taipei. A visit is possible with permission from the authorities. However, no records pertaining to the period (August 1945) is available with the airport authorities. The physical layout of the airport has changed and no one knows where exactly the air crash had taken place.
- (b) Nam Mong Military Hospital does not exist. No one could say where exactly it was located earlier. It is presumed that this hospital might have been located at the same place as the former Weixu Hospital. Even this latter hospital ceased to exist since the late 1940s and its previous records are not available. According to the National Archives, these were possibly burnt.
- (c) The erstwhile Municipal Crematorium does not exist anymore. It has been converted into a green park. There is no clue as to its previous records.
- (d) The Taipei Municipal authorities are not even aware of any organisation by name Bureau of Health & Hygiene. They have no records of any such office.
- (e) Hokutu Military Hospital is now known as the National Force Beitou Military Hospital, Taipei. Its authorities have no record older than 1992. All the earlier records have already been destroyed.

4. The ITA also checked up with the National Archives of Taiwan, the National Central Library and two newspapers of the period (one in Chinese and the other in the Japanese language) to find any reference to the incident of August 1945. No news report on Netaji could be located. The National Archives also has no record of the air crash in which Netaji was allegedly killed.

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1. **S.No. 122(FRI):** The Commission has raised certain queries on the source and authenticity of some messages of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose apparently broadcast after the alleged plane crash of 18th August, 1945. Copies of these messages are available in a PMO file as enclosure to a letter dated 11.2.92 of former MP, Shri Chitta Basu. The PMO, in its reply to the Commission has stated that these papers were sent to the then MOS(EA) for action. On examining the files available in the Section, including those received from East Asia Division, it is seen that there is a copy of the aforesaid letter (without the enclosures) of Shri Chitta Basu in EA Division's file No. C/551/14/90-JP. However, the file does not give any evidence of any action which might have been taken on the letter.

2. There is a possibility, however, that the matter might have been dealt with in EA Division's file No. C/551/7/92-JP (Subject: Disappearance of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose) since the file belongs to the same period as the letter in question. It may be mentioned here, that this file has been requisitioned by the Justice Mukherjee Commission. We had, therefore, on 16th July, 2002 requested EA Division to send us this file. There have been subsequent correspondence on this issue with EA Division. They have now confirmed that the file is not traceable. It is necessary to mention here that the file in question appears to be important not only from the point of view of the subject matter of the FR under examination, but, as will be seen in the following paras, for getting relevant material to respond to the other communications from the Commission.

3. We will, therefore, have no alternative but to inform the Commission that documents available with us do not shed any light on the follow-up action taken on Shri Chitta Basu's letter. But, since the Commission has requisitioned file No. C/551/7/92-JP, we will have to give them a factually correct response that despite a thorough search the file is not traceable. This, however, might invite adverse comments from the Commission.

4. **S.No. 124(FRII):** The Commission has asked for copies of notes dated 13.9.1993 of Shri A.K.Sinha, the then US(AP). A part of these notes was located by the Commission in one of PMO's file. PMO has mentioned in its reply to the Commission that these notes were from an MEA file which was returned to the Ministry. We have not been able to locate this note in our records. Apparently, going by the date of the note, it could also have been a part of EA Division's file No. C/551/7/92-JP which is untraceable as already mentioned in the preceding paras. It is, therefore, submitted for instructions/orders as to what reply should be sent to the Commission in this case.

5. S.No. 129(FRIII): This is regarding submission of counter-affidavit or affidavit-in-opposition in respect of averments/contentions/allegations contained in the affidavits of different deponents filed before the Commission. Vide the Commission's letter of 30th May, 2001 forwarded with MHA's letter of 4th July, 2001 (S.No. 108/c of Vol. VI of this file), it was sought to submit an affidavit in respect of documents mentioned in the petition of one Nandalal Chakrabarti. In the list of important documents mentioned in this petition, only one document - a record of the interview of the then Ambassador of India in Moscow, Shri K.P.S.Menon with Stalin in February, 1953 - was found to be relevant to our Ministry. This document was shared in original with the Chairman of the Commission and an affidavit, as desired by the Commission, was also filed in this connection on 1.4.2002 (S.No. 105/c of F.No. 25/4/NGO - Vol.VII). The Commission has, however, been asking us to submit a counter-affidavit or affidavit-in-opposition in respect of the affidavits of different deponents filed before the Commission.

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6. We have, till now, on the basis of the affidavit of 1.4.2002, been informing the Commission that no action is pending on our side. Our letters of 21.2.02, 2.4.02, 28.5.02 and the last one of 19.8.02 refer in this connection. On further examination of the petition of Shri Nandalal Chakrabarti, it is observed that there is a reference to several documents which were indicated in earlier affidavits (of which Shri Nandalal Chakrabarti was a copetitioner) filed before the Commission. These documents have been listed at Annexure –01 to the petition of Shri Chakrabarti. The Commission has asked us to submit our counter-affidavits in respect of the documents listed in this annexure which are relevant to this Ministry.

7. It is observed that the following documents are relevant to MEA from amongst the entire list at Annexure-01:-

- (a) reply of Lord Mountbatten dated 10.3.1978 to Shri N.G.Goray, the then High Commission in London.
- (b) Cremation Certificate supposedly of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose.
- (c) Report dated 28.10.1949 of "Interpress" a German intelligence magazine.
- (d) Declassified CIA documents of February, 1964 (relating a story regarding the possible return of one Subhas Chandra Bose).
- (e) Resolution of the UN General Assembly and India's ratification in 1971 of the Convention on the Non-Applicability of the Statutory Limitations to War Crimes

Out of the above, we have located copies of (a)(F.No. 25/4/NGO-Vol.III) and (b)(S.No.8/c of F.No.25/4/NGO-Vol.IV). We also have a copy of (c) – though of unverified authenticity- as an enclosure to a Resolution of All India Forward Bloc dated 24.8.1990 (F.No.C/551/14/90-JP). As regard declassified and other US documents, the position regarding their availability and accessibility has already been intimated to the Commission separately. Regarding (e), copies of relevant documents have been forwarded to the Commission. The documents available with us do not seem to contain any contentions/allegations which need to be countered by the Ministry. It is, therefore, felt that, under these circumstances, there is a no need for submitting any counter-affidavit to the Commission.

8. The Commission in its letter(FR) has stated that it presumes that the Ministry does not have anything to enable it to say anything to say anything contrary to or rebut on oath the averments and contentions in the affidavits. From the letter, it is also obvious that no concerned Ministry/Department of the Govt. of India has submitted any counter-affidavit.

9. **S.No. 130(FRIV):** This is regarding the judgement of the Rajasthan High Court and its follow-up by this Ministry. The first reference to this issue was received by us from MHA and, as desired by them, our reply was sent to them as at S.No. 23/c. We may inform the Commission accordingly.

10. **S.No. 131(FRV):** The Commission has sought our response to the letter dated 15.10.1970 of Shri M.L.Sondhi, former MP, to then President, Shri V.V.Giri. We have already replied to the Commission on this issue vide our letter of 19.8.02 at S.No. 54/c. We may inform the Commission as per the letter placed below.

11. **S.No.132(FRVI):**This refers to a radio speech made by a student in the name of Subhas Chandra Bose from Radio Moscow after signing of the Tashkent Agreement. The Commission has asked for the full text, full particulars of the student who made the speech, and true copy of the report sent by Radio Moscow.

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12. In EA Division's file No. C/551/8/70-JP (Vol.I), we find a list of files of MEA which were sent to MHA in 1970 in connection with the Justice Khosla Commission of Inquiry. Among these files, file No. C/125/11/69-JP is found to bear the subject – Parliament Question regarding broadcast by Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose on Radio Moscow. 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Subject: Justice Mukherjee Commission of Inquiry - request for documents relating to Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose in various foreign countries.

The Justice Mukherjee Commission has from time to time asked the Ministry to approach various foreign Governments to make available all documents, whether classified or unclassified, relating to Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose.

2. Till the receipt of the letter of the Commission under consideration, we had been asked to approach only the Governments of USA, Russia and other States of the former Soviet Union, U.K., Japan, Taiwan and Vietnam for obtaining the documents. It may be mentioned here that, as a matter of rule, the Commission has not provided specific details of the documents required by them from these countries. The requests have been very general in nature. We had, accordingly, taken up the matter through our concerned Missions. The outcome of our effort in this regard has been tabulated in the chart placed below.

The Commission has now asked us to also approach the 3. Governments of Thailand, Malaysia, Singapore, Germany and Ireland for making available all documents whether classified, de-classified or unclassified, containing material relevant to the points of inquiry of the Commission. It has also asked us to further persuade the Governments already approached for the said documents. While in the former case, we could write to our concerned Missions for the requisite information or material, in the latter case, it is not clear as to how effective it will be to take up the issue again with the respective Governments who have already been approached and have given their response as indicated in the chart. A few specific cases may help to elucidate the point.

(A) USA: We have been told that documents once de-classified are no longer retained by the US Govt. These would be available in various archives in the USA. To access these, one will require the services of a researcher. In this background, it would be futile to request the US Govt. for such documents. As regards classified documents, it has been made clear that specific details are required to be provided to requisition these documents. Requests of a general nature will not suffice.

(B) Russia: Some documents which were forwarded by the Russian Foreign Office through our Mission in Moscow have been sent to the Commission. It is necessary to mention here that efforts to procure information and material on Netaji from Russia had been made at the official level in the past also. A brief chronology of events in this regard is given below:

(i) In January 8, 1992, the Russian Ministry of Foreign Affairs had informed that "according to the data in the Central and Republican Archives, no information whatsoever is available on the stay of ... Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose in the Soviet Union in 1945 and in subsequent years".

(ii) Thereafter, in response to the then Ambassador's reference on the issue, the Russian Foreign Office informed on October 27, 1995, that "as a result of the investigations carried out at the Central Archival Collection of the Federal Security Service of Russia and the Russian Centre for Retention and Perusal of documents on Modern History, no information whatsoever has come to light on the stay of Subhas Chandra Bose on the territory of the former USSR in 1945 and in subsequent years".

(iii) The Chief of Central Archives of the Ministry of Defence in response to a query from one Shri L.Joychandra Singh of Imphal had vide his letter of October 15, 1996, mentioned that "there are no records with the Central Archives of the Ministry of Defence ... about the catastrophe in August, 1945 and death of ... Mr. Subhas Chandra Bose". The Directorate of Foreign Relations, Ministry of Defence had on March 20, 1997 forwarded a copy of the letter of October 15, 1996 and further pointed out that "there is no other data relating to the fate of Subhas Chandra Bose ... ".

(iv) The State Archive Service of the Russian Federation informed on August 4, 1997 that "the Centre for Preservation of Historical Documental Collection does not have any information on Subhas Chandra Bose".

Given this background, further persuasion with the Russian authorities 4. may seem undesirable.

In view of the above, it is proposed to request the Governments for the 5. requisite documents where either no request has gone or we have not received any response till date. As regards further persuasion with the foreign Governments (like those of USA, Russia and U.K.), it is submitted for consideration/orders as to what course of action is to be taken.

Para 3: The Commission desires to have a copy of the note dated 30.9.93 of Shri A.K.Sinha, the then US(AP). The concerned file has not yet been located and the Commission was informed of this in our letter of 5.12.2002 (S.No. 219/c).

Para 4(a): This is regarding the Rajasthan High Court judgement of 4.3.87 a copy of which has since been sent to the Commission vide our letter of 1.1.2003.(S. No. 231/c)

Para 4(b)(ii): This is regarding the action taken on the letter dated 15.10.70 of Shri M.L.Sondhi, MP. We had responded to the Commission in this matter vide our letters dated 19.4.02 (S.No. 119/c) and 15.5.02 (S.No. 140/c).[vol.vi]]

Para 4(d): This is regarding the speech made over Radio Moscow by a student in the name of Subhas Chandra. A full report in the case was sent to the Commission vide our letter of 5.12.2002 (S.No. 218/c).

Para 11(a): The commission had raised certain queries with regard to some messages of Netaji. Since these messages could not be located in our records, we had, accordingly, replied to the Commission vide our letter of 5.12.2002 (S.No. 219/c).

Para 12: This is regarding the list of archives in the countries constituting the erstwhile Soviet Union. We are receiving the desired information from the concerned Missions. We may inform the Commission accordingly.

Para 13: The Commission has mentioned various documents and also referred to various communications which are likely to be available in different institutions/archives in the USA. We may, therefore, write to our Mission in Washington and inform the Commission of this.

Para 15: The Commission has sought to know our response to the letter of 13.3.93 of the then President of India, Dr. Shankar Dayal Sharma. We have already replied in the matter vide our letter of 1.1.2003.(S.No.231/c)

Para 16: The Commission desires to know of further developments in the matter of release of classified documents by the Govt. of U.K. As our Mission in London has not informed us of further developments in the matter, we may inform the Commission accordingly and send a reminder to the Mission.

Para 18: This para is essentially a report of the visit of the Commission to Japan and its aftermath, including the matter of examination of the ashes kept in the Renkoji Temple by DNA test. No action is expected of this Ministry at this stage.

Para 19: This is regarding the request to the Commission by a deponent for visiting the USA, U.K. and Germany for examining various documents pertaining to Netaji which are supposedly lying in these countries. Since it is the prerogative of the Commission to decide on the utility of any such visit, and the Ministry can only render necessary assistance in this regard, we may inform the Commission accordingly.

Para 24: The Commission has sought certain original documents relating to the alleged death/cremation of Netaji. The matter is under reference to our Mission in Tokyo whose response is awaited. We may apprise the Commission of this.

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
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

This has reference to the fax message of August 23, 2002 from Shri Vijay Gokhale and our interim reply of August (23) 2002 regarding the alleged disappearance of Netaji.

We have checked up with the National Archives of Taiwan and National Central Library, Taiwan Branch to find any reference to the above incident. We checked up two newspapers (these are the only available newspapers for the period in question with the library) - Taiwan Xinbao (in Japanese) and Chungyang Ribao (in Chinese) for the entire month of August, 1945 at the Library but failed to find any news-report on Netaji in either of them. The National Archives does not have any record of the crash of military aircraft which allegedly carried Netaii aboard it. As earlier intimated the Ministry of Foreign Affairs here has also been unsuccessful in locating any relevant material.

Point wise response to the queries raised in the paragraph 3 of the above message are as follows:

a. Taihoku (Sung Shan) airport is the operational domestic airport in Taipei. Visit to the airport is feasible after obtaining necessary permissions from the local government agencies. But it is not at all likely that any new piece of information will be forthcoming as there are no records of that period available with the airport authorities. The physical layout of the airport has changed so much over the years that no body even knows where exactly the air-crash took place (Dr. Krishna Bose had recently visited Taipei. With the assistance from the local

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authorities, she visited SungShan airport but could not see anything of relevance.).

- b. Nam Mong Military Hospital does not exist any more. No one here has any clear idea of where this hospital existed. However, the officials at the National Archives and the Department of Health guess that this hospital might have been at the same place as the former Weixu hospital. The erstwhile Weixu hospital was located at the intersection of Chunghua Road Section-1 and Guangzhou Street. The previous records of Weixu hospital are not available anywhere in Taiwan since this hospital also has ceased to exist since the late 1940s. The authorities at the National Archives guess that they were burnt.
- c. The Municipal Crematorium in Taipei where the body of Netaji was allegedly cremated does not exist any more and no clues to the location of its past records could be found. The Crematorium has been converted into a green park (Nos.14 and 15) at the intersection of Chung Shan North Road Section-2 and Nanjing East Road Section-1.
- d. On checking up with the Taipei Municipal authorities, we have been told that they are not aware of any organisation with such a nomenclature. They do not have any records of any such office.
- e. Hokutu Military Hospital is currently known as National Force Beitou Military Hospital at plot no. 60, Xin Miu Road in Beitou, Taipei. We checked up with the authorities there only to find that they do not have any records older than 1992. All the earlier records have already been destroyed.

Given that no one in the National Archives, National Central Library, Department of Health, Ministry of National Defence, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Taipei Municipal Government, Airport authorities – all of whom we have contacted, has been able to indicate anything regarding the availability of records in Taiwan, rest of information is not forthcoming.
