








Water Lilies are Easily Grown Everywhere!

Everyone Can Grow Them Successfully



Water gardens large or small are always the center of interest in a garden.

ID you know that water lilies succeed almost equally well in every state in the Union? Few garden plants thrive East or West, North or South in every type of soil or climate as do these gorgeous blossoms that everyone may easily grow in their pool.

Water lilies are so easily grown, even by those who have had no previous experience, that following these simple directions will make your pool a most interesting part of your garden. In fact, water lilies are easier to grow than the commoner garden plants. The actual care of the pool may be stated in a single line. (Keep the water level fairly constant and the pool clean.) It is not necessary to drain the pool at all during the growing season, simply adding water to replace evaporation. evaporation.

New Pools. The most important thing is to have the pool about 24 inches deep. This will allow for one foot of water and one foot of soil giving the best average results. However, the plants will thrive luxuriantly where the water is only 6 inches deep or up to 24 inches.

Soil. Any garden loam is all right. They particularly enjoy a heavy loam such as roses thrive in. Do not use leaf mold, swamp muck or sand.

of soil. Commercial fertilizers or sheep manure are particularly recommended. Their use will insure a thrifty, luxuriant growth. Use one pound to each bushel and a half of soil. Mix all fertilizer well with the soil.

Boxes. We recommend the use of boxes. They should be at least 15 inches square and 12 inches deep. Boxes 18 to 24 inches square give better flowers. Make them of pine wood and they will last 20 years. Remember, the larger the box the more and finer the flowers.

How Far Apart? A pool 4 by 6 feet will accommodate three or four lilies as well as Water Poppies, Water Hawthorne, Airowheads, Water Hyacinths or equivalent plants. A pool 10 feet in diameter will accommodate six to ten lilies and also a number of other aquatic plants.

Planting. It is well to fill the pool before planting. After planting, the boxes or pails may be easily set in the water. If the boxes are too large to move it is easy to set the plants beneath the water. In planting simply scoop a small hole out and plant the roots horizontally and not upright, with the growing end just flush with the surface. It is not necessary to cover the box with gravel unless there are large goldfish present. Large goldfish are a nuisance as they eat the roots of lilies and keep the water riled and dirty.

Tropical Water Lilies. These should be planted upright as they are shipped as growing, potted plants Just cover the ball with soil. Do not allow the leaves to wither or the plant will be severely checked. Fil pool before planting.

When to Plant. Hardy water lilies may be planted from February on in the Southern and Pacific Coast States. In the Middle West and East April is early enough. In the Northern States April 15th gives plenty of time. Planting may be continued throughout the late spring and summer with great success. In mild climates Hardy Lilies may be planted almost the year around. Tropical Lilies should not be planted until the weather is settled and warm with an average temperature of 70°. May in warm regions and late May or early June farther north or early June farther north.

Winter Care. Hardy Lilies grow wild in cold northern regions and need no protection other than from direct freezing of the roots. Where the water is deep enough not to freeze below the roots they will come through unharmed. Since dry rot is the worst enemy of stored plants in the winter it is best to leave them in the pool under natural conditions. Cover the pool well with boards then apply a thick covering of leaves or straw and the water will not freeze deeply or crack the cement. This is the ideal way to winter hardy aquatics and goldfish. If the pool must be drained the lilies should be removed to a cold cellar or placed in a deep trench and well covered, keeping moist at all times. Tropical Lilies are hardy only where oranges may be grown.

Winter Care of the Tub Garden. Empty the water out, then fill the tub full of leaves or straw, covering the tub closely with boards to keep out the rain. Cover all over thoroughly with litter for further protection.

Winter Care of Goldfish. Common goldfish are hardy in natural pools or where the pool is covered. Be sure and break the ice frequently to keep the water fresh. It is best in small pools to remove fish to basement, keeping them in tubs.

Pests. Plant lice or aphis which sometimes attack the leaves should be immediately hosed off, when the fish will eat them. Mosquitos are always kept completely in check by goldfish or any other fish. (There will be no mosquitos where there are goldfish.)

SOME EASY WAYS OF MAKING A POOL

So many of our customers have built their own pools and have had such gratifying success that we are sure every one can do so. It is really a simple thing and surprisingly inexpensive particularly when one does his own work.

The Formal Pool. In constructing the formal pool first dig out to a depth of 30 inches, carefully shaving the walls straight and smooth. The inner wooden form should allow for a wall 6 inches thick. The floor should be flat 4 to 6 inches thick with a slight dip to the drain. Steel reinforcing rods % inches in diameter should be laid in when the wall is three-quarters full. This will prevent cracking of the walls. It is always best to pour the concrete continuously so the pool will be without joints which are liable to leak. are liable to leak.

During the pouring of the concrete be sure to tamp it well so there will be no porous spots or

sand joints. Be sure and always tamp concrete thoroughly when laying. Thorough tamping is the trick in making water-tight pools. Remember that keeping concrete moist by frequent sprinkling allows it to cure slowly and very hard.


After the concrete has set firmly, about 48 hours, the forms may be removed and rough places smoothed down. To complete the water-proofing paint the surface with a mixture of pure cement and water the consistency of cream. This may be applied with an old brush or broom. It should be sprinkled several times a day or covered with soil, burlap or straw. After 4 or 5 days the pool may be filled with water.

The Irregular Pool. First mark on the

The Irregular Pool. First mark on the surface with sticks the exact shape of the pool, then excavate to a depth of 30 inches. The walls should be as perpendicular as possible (about 45°) and the floor flat. The bowl-shaped floor is hard to plant and not as desirable as the flat floor. Smooth the floor and walls and wet down thoroughly. Reinforcing, using heavy wire fencing, is desirable for permanent pools. Lay the fencing on the floor, lapping the edges. As the concrete is poured pull the fencing up to the middle. Tamp the concrete thoroughly and smooth out with a wooden float. After it has set a day, water-proof by painting with pure cement. cement.

Where heavy freezing is expected a wall 6 to 8 inches is recommended though the floor may be much less. In mild climates a 4 or 5 inch wall and three inch floor is ample.

Mixing and Laying Concrete. A simple and satisfactory concrete mixture for pools is 1 shovelful of cement, 2 of sand. 3 of quarter or half-inch crushed rock or pea gravel. Mix it together thoroughly two or three times while dry and then add water to make a pasty mixture that will spread easily.

Throughout America the Throughout America the Sacred Lotus grows luxuriantly, being perfectly hardy everywhere. This queen of aquatic flowers, with its stately beauty, thrives abundantly during our warm summer months, conding up its great shield our warm summer months, sending up its great shield shaped leaves sometimes to a height of five or six feet. Its gigantic flowers overtop the leaves.

They require the same general treatment as water lilies growing in water from 2 to 12 inches deep. Unless the pool is given over to them entirely they should be confined in boxes or their rampant growth should be confined in boxes or their rampant growth will cover the pool. The dormant tubers as they are shipped look like bananas strung end to end and should be handled with care. As the plant starts growth it sends out runners which root at the nodes, sending up a flower and a leaf at each joint. They like a rich, heavy loam and should not be planted too early as the tubers start best when the weather is warm. weather is warm.

For those who care to experiment with raising water lilies from seed we offer a selection of the best Tropical kinds, as very few Hardy Lilies bear seed. They will flower the first year.

In choosing a soil use a heavy loam. Do not add either cow manure or leaf mold, as the decaying matter will bubble and ferment, causing the young plants to damp off. They may be planted in a box, pan or pot, firming the earth down well, scattering the seeds thinly and covering lightly not more than the thickness of the seeds. Fine sand is a good covering. Stand the pot in water till thoroughly soaked, then submerge gently to a depth of 6 inches. of 6 inches.

The seed may be sown outdoors in June or, if sown early, in a pail in a warm, sunny window, planting out in June. Seed should be germinated at a temperature of 70 to 78 degrees.

I planted the lily seed on April 28th and behold today (July 8th) found a fine bloom, a most beautiful blue. I think that is a fine record, blooms from seed in 70 days.







HOW TO GROW STAR LILIES

Star Lilies are shipped to you as sprouted tubers which quickly come into flower. The tubers when shipped are a year old having bloomed profusely the previous summer. Each tuber will give rise to from 1 to 3 crowns, each of which will flower freely. In planting keep the sprouted end uppermost and cover lightly with a half inch of soil. Do not cover too deeply. Sink the box so it will be covered with 6 to 12 inches of water. See that they are not crowded out by the hardy lilies which start into growth before them. They will come to the surface when the water averages 68 degrees.


To carry them over the winter the old tuber should be broken off from under the new plant during the fall and stored in a box of moist sand in a frost free cellar. Next year it will sprout again.

To winter the new plants raise the box in which they are growing to the surface about September 1st to check growth and force them to form a hard dormant tuber. With the first light frosts remove to basement later washing out the tubers and store in sand.
