REMARKS.

The great number of new roses which have been recently produced, has rendered the task of selection a somewhat difficult one to the amateur, and the necessity of keeping up a full assortment a laborious and perplexing one to the cultivator. We have, therefore, in making up a new Catalogue, given a selection of the finest roses, from which a choice may be easily made, as there are few or none which are not well worthy a place in every garden.

No expense, however, will be spared in procuring all the rare and choice varieties; and to keep our catalogue within reasonable limits the least beautiful of the older sorts will be discarded to make room for the finest of the new ones.

In order to describe as fully as possible the different varieties in the limited space of a catalogue, the following abbreviations are used:-

GLOB. (globular.)—The outer petals encircling the flower until fully open. CUP. (eupped.)—The outer row of petals incurved, enclosing the interior smaller ones. Exp. (expanded.)—The petals rather flat, in some sorts showing the stamens. Comp. (compact.)—Petals rather stiff and close; the flower like a double ranunculus.

Those marked P, have long flexible shoots, well adapted for rose pillars, or for a trellis. Those marked f, are remarkable for their odor.

A few marked thus *, are highly approved kinds, desirable in every collection, large or small.

In a collection so extensive, it frequently occurs that some kinds cannot be furnished. Purchasers are therefore requested to say whether some other varieties may be substituted for those ordered.

Plants of the Hybrid Perpetual, Bourbon, Bengal, Tea, Noisette, and all the tender Roses, are kept in pots, and can be packed and sent with safety at any season of the

The best seasons for transplanting are March, April and May, and September, October and November. For the South and West, the most favorable period for transportation is the autumn, and orders should be received previous to November.

All packages of plants will be delivered in Boston free of expense, and will be shipped or forwarded by any route that may be directed.

All orders, to secure attention, should be accompanied with a remittance, or a draft, at thirty or sixty days, payable in Boston or New York.

Our Nurseries are very extensive, embracing upwards of thirty-five acres of land, the whole of which is devoted to Fruit and Ornamental Trees, Flowering Shrubs, Evergreeus, Grape Vines, Herbaceous Plants, Roses, Dahlias, Green-house Plants, Bulbous Roots, &c. &c. The Nurseries are situated on the Cambridge road to Mount Auburn, half a mile east of Harvard Colleges, and about two miles from Boston. Amateurs are invited to visit our collection, which is in full flower in June and continues till November.

Omnibus Coaches pass within a few rods of the Nurseries every fifteen minutes DURING THE DAY.

A liberal discount made to the trade, and to individuals purchasing large collections of plants.

THE CULTIVATION OF ROSES.

- 1. Roses require a rich and deep soil. The ground can scarcely be too rich. Where manure is convenient give a thorough dressing in the autumn upon the surface of the ground, and dig it in in the spring. If manure is not readily to be obtained, give a good top dressing of guano, in April, and dig it in around the plants.
- 2. Roses should be well headed in, especially the Provens, Provence, Moss, and Damask roses. It is the only way to produce large and fine flowers. Hybrid Chinas, and Bourbons should not be pruned so closely, merely topping the long shoots, and taking out the small wood. Prune early.
- 3. Hybrid perpetual Roses, though generally hardy, are finer, stronger and better with a slight protection; merely covering the shoots, which may be easily bent down to the ground, with any strawy manure or litter. Where there is a small collection we would advise protection in the New England States. They will well repay the trouble.
