THIERSCH (Ludwig) . . . Munich

A Sculptor and Painter. Born April 12th, 1825. Studied first as Sculptor and then as Painter. Went, 1852, to Athens and painted their the St. Nicodemus Church in Fresco. 1855 he returned to Munich, when shortly after he was summoned to Vienna to paint the Greek Church. Then he went to Rome to paint three Cartoons for Baron Sina. 1860 he was called to St. Petersburg by the Czar to paint some pictures from the life of Jesus and St. Mary and the last Judgment in the Chapel of the Grand Dukes.
