## NOTICE TO CUSTOMERS

 E WOULD SAY to those unacquainted with our establishment that this is the 49th year of our Nursery. We have over one thousand acres devoted to the business, about three-fifths covered with Nursery Stock, and 44 Green and Propagating Houscs with a most complete assortment of Fruit and Ornamental Trees, Shrubs, Vines; Roses, Greenhouse Plants, etc. The largest and best equipped cold storage cellars and packing houses give us unsutpassed facilities for the prompt and accurate filling of orders. We solicit correspondence and personal inspection of our stock, confident that it will compare favorably with the best.
## THE PACKING SEASON

IN THE SPRING we usually commence digging from the 20th of March to the 1st of April, and continue into May; and in the fall from the 1st of October, continuing intil cold weather sets in. A large stock and nearly full assortment of everything but largest Ornamentals and Evergreens stored in frost proof cellars, which are connected by switch direct with main line L. S. \& M. S. R. R., from which shipments can be made at any time.

## TERMS OF SALE.

1st. The articles in this list will be furnished to nurserymen at prices named, without regard to size of order, except in cases of long lists of selected varieties, when such discount will be made from the retail prices as the character of the order will justify. Dealers' orders for stock in assortment must amount to $\$ 50$ or more to entitle them to the lowest rates quoted.

2d. We reserve the right to select the varieties, but will give the purchaser his choice as far as is consistent with our stock. In ordering, please state whether or not substituting will be permitted in case we should be short of any sort wanted.

3d. When dealers bill upon our grounds we heel in their entire stock by itself, and furnish free the necessary help, labels and tying material for billing up. Positively no stock will be allowed to be brought on our grounds for billing up from other growers, unless in case of stock wanted that we cannot supply, in which case written permission must be obtained from us. After deliveries are billed up help will be furnished free by us to pack in the boxes and mark for their destination, but the owner must superintend all, and assume all responsibility for any errors that may occur. No extra charge for delivering packages at Express Office or Railway Stations. No stock will be counted back from the heeling-in grounds unless error is made by us. Boxes and packages charged as follows: 8 to $91 / 2$ feet long, $30 \times 30$ inches, $\$ 2.50$; $28 \times 28$ inches, $\$ 2.25 ; 24 \times 24$ inches, $\$ 2.00 ; 20 \times 20$ inches, $\$ 1.50 ; 16 \times 16$ inches, $\$ 1.25 ; 12 \times 12$ inches, 75 c .; 12 feet boxes 50 c . extra. Bales, 25 c . to $\$ 2.00$, according to size. A charge to cover cost of labor and packing material will be made for all cars packed in bulk. Burlaps for wrapping the roots of evergreens, etc., ten cents per yard. All bales and boxes packed for shipping at billing-up sheds, or on any part of our grounds, will be subject to the same charges as if put up by us at the packing house. We cannot use second-hand boxes, will allow nothing for them; empties returned will not be accepted but left at station subject to shipper's order.

4 th. The terms of payment must invariably be cash before shipment. less five per cent., or satisfactory note payable at some bank for full amount of bill, unless with established nurserymen, when, if unknown to us, a satisfactory reference will be required before shipment.

5th. Those ordering will please give plain and explicit directions as to the route and manner in which goods are to be forwarded, as our responsibility ends on delivering at Railway Station or Express Office.

6th. While we exercise the greatest diligence and care to have all our trees, etc., true to label, and hold ourselves in readiness, on proper proof, to replace all trees, etc., that may prove untrue to label. free of charge, or refund the amount paid, it is mutually understood and agreed to, between the purchaser and ourselves, that our guarantee of genuineness shall in no case make us liable for any sum greater than that originally received for said trees, etc., that prove untrue.
