

SITUATION

- Tropical cyclone MORA continued moving north toward the coastal district of Cox's Bazar (Chittagong division), strengthening. It made landfall early in the morning close to the city of Kutubdia (Chittagong division) with max. sustained winds between 100-120 km/h. After the landfall it continued moving north over Chittagong division and it reached north-eastern India weakening gradually. Strong winds, storm surge and heavy rainfall affected the coastal areas of Bangladesh and northern coastal areas of Myanmar/Burma.
- Over the next 24 h, it is forecast to continue moving north-eastern, continue weakening. Heavy rainfall is forecast to affect north-east India, Bangladesh and north-west Myanmar/Burma over 30 May - 1 June.
- According to local media, as of 30 May in the morning, at least five people died of which two in Cox's Bazar and three more in Rangamati. More than 200 000 people have been evacuated in Cox's Bazar districts and 20 000 houses damaged in Cox's Bazar town, St Martin's Island, Kutubdia and Teknaf.

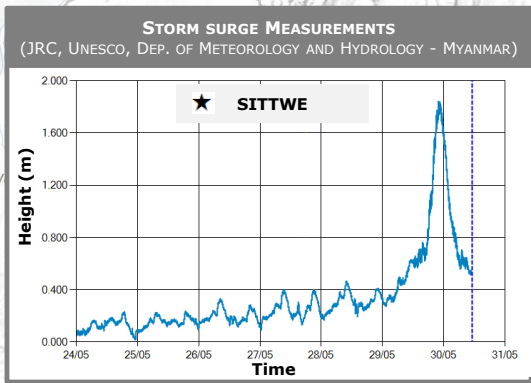
