SUBJECT: Application for Permission to Use Facilities of  
Takikawa Chemical Industry Co., Ltd. for Fertilizer  
Production

1. References are:

a. Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 464.6 (17 May 46) ESS/IN (SCAFIN 962), subject: Production, Distribution and Use of Fertilizers, dated 17 May 1946.

b. Letter, C.L.O. 3532(ECI) to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, subject: Request for Permission to Supply Mixed Gas Necessary for Production of Ammonium Sulfate at Sunagawa Works of Toyo Koatsu K.K, by Pipe Line to be Laid from Takigawa Plant of Nihon Jinzo Sekiyu, K.K., dated 19 July 1946.

c. Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 464.6 (9 Aug 46) ESS/IN (SCAFIN 1118), subject: Application for Permission to Supply Mixed Gas for the Production of Ammonium Sulfate at Sunagawa Works of Toyo Koatsu K.K. by pipeline from Takagawa Plant of Nihon Jinzo Sekiyu K.k.

d. Letter, C.L.O. 6816(ECI) to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, subject: Application for Permission to Use Facilities of Takikawa Chemical Industry Co., Ltd. for Fertilizer Production, dated 23 December 1946.

2. Application made in the memorandum referred to in paragraph 1d above is approved with the following restrictions:

a. That the additional equipment approved (see paragraph 3 below) be used only to cool gases which are produced by the Takikawa Chemical Industry Co., Ltd. and which are subsequently consumed by the Toyo Koatsu Company in the manufacture of ammonium sulfate fertilizer.

b. That the approval become void on 1 May 1947.

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3. The following additional equipment is added to the portion of the Takikawa Plant of the Takikawa Chemical Company (formerly the Nihon Jinzo Sekiyu K.K.) which was placed on the approved list of nitrogen fertilizer plants (reference 1a above) by references 1b and 1c above.
