

Seeds post-paid by mail. In considering our prices both of new and standard Vegetable and Flower Seeds, please bear in mind that we pay postage on all Flower and Vegetable Seeds, by the packet or ounce. In ordering, state distinctly how seeds are to be sent, by mail, express or by freight, otherwise we will use our own judgement as we think best. When large quantities of Seeds are wanted it is always best to order early, so as they can be sent by freight, as the charges are much cheaper than by express. Small orders, can be sent as cheap by express.
