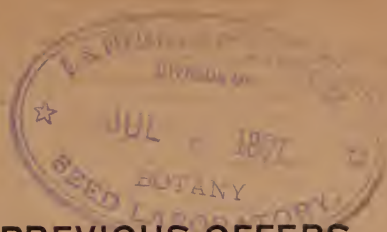

Terms of Sale. The Prices Quoted are those ruling at date. We expect to adhere to them throughout the Season, except where important changes in the market compel us to advance or reduce our prices. The price per pound will not apply to quantities less than $\frac{1}{4}$ lb. Less quantities can be had at ounce rates. Corn, Beans, Peas, etc. $\frac{1}{4}$ bu. at bushel rates, less quantities at quart rates.

Terms of Credit. — To regular customers and well known houses, Thirty days subject to Draft when due, or payable in exchange on Farmers, Bank of Mercersburg, Pa. The Cash or satisfactory reference, required from all other correspondents. For description see retail Catalogue.

Seeds post-paid by mail. In considering our prices both of new and standard Vegetable and Flower Seeds, please bear in mind that we pay postage on all Flower and Vegetable Seeds, by the packet or ounce. In ordering, state distinctly how seeds are to be sent, by mail, express or by freight, otherwise we will use our own judgement as we think best. When large quantities of Seeds are wanted it is always best to order early, so as they can be sent by freight, as the charges are much cheaper than by express. Small orders, can be sent as cheap by express.

How to order. We cannot to often reiterate, be very careful to always sign your name, post-office, county and State on each and every letter sent to us. Cash must always be sent with order. Money can be sent safely either by post-office order, bank draft, express or by registered letter. Every post-master is obliged by law to register a letter on payment of ten cents, then you will receive our receipt for letter by return mail.

We accept two cent postage-stamps the same as cash.
