REMARKS.

THE increasing interest manifested in the cultivation of flowers, and the demand for new varieties of flower seeds, has induced us to give particular attention to this branch of our business; and no pains have been spared to render our collection the most extensive and varied to be found in this country. All the new and choice kinds that have been introduced to notice in Europe, and also many improved varieties of favorite old sorts, have been added to the assortment. The double German Aster, double Balsams, double Rocket Larkspurs and many other choice varieties, which require so much care to keep them perfect, have been as usual raised by ourselves, and are of the finest description. The varieties of large Pansies, Carnations, Picotees, Cinerarias, Calceolarias, German Stocks, &c., have been imported from the same sources in London and Germany, as those we have usually sold, and which have been so much admired.

The value of descriptive Catalogue in the selection of flower seeds will at once be perceived. We keep constantly for sale a very extensive collection of the choicest plants for the Green-house, Hot-house and Flower Garden, embracing the finest Roses, Camellias, Geraniums, Ericas, Azaleas, Cactuses, Verbenas, Fuchsias, Carnations, Picotees, Ixias, Gladioluses, Hardy perennial flowering Plants, Dahlias, Bulbous flower roots, &c., &c.; also, Ornamental Trees and Shrubs and an immense variety of Fruit Trees.

Purchasers of Trees, Plants, &c., will find at our Nurseries the newest and finest varieties which have been introduced to notice, and they are invited to call before making their selections. In the Conservatory, the Camellias will be in flower in January and February—the Azaleas in February—the Roses in March and April—the Geraniums in April and May—the splendid Japan Lilies in June—and the Fuchsias in July and September.

EXPLANATIONS.

The number under which each species or variety of seeds is sold—the Scientific Name—the Common Name—the Period of Duration of the Plant—Color of the Flowers—Height of the Plant—Period of Blooming—and Price per Packet, are all given in the eight columns of the Catalogue, as follows:—

1st Column.—Number under which each variety is sold—and under which orders are executed; the detail of the names being unnecessary.

2d Column.—Scientific or common name of the plants, agreeably to the remarks at the head of each alphabetic list.

3d Column.—The same.

4th Column.—Hardiness and duration of each plant, viz:—h, *hardy*; hh, *half hardy*; t, *tender*; F, *frame*; G, *green-house*; a, *annual* (1 year); b, *biennial* (lasts 2 years); p, *perennial* (lasts many years). They are thus applied in the Catalogue:—ha, *hardy annual*; hba, *half hardy annual*; ta, *tender annual*; hb, *hardy biennial*; hhb, *half hardy biennial*; hp, *hardy perennial*; hhp, *half hardy perennial*, &c.

5th Column.—Color of the Flower. The abbreviations are as follows:—var., *various*; sc., *scarlet*; cr., *crimson*; pur., *purple*; str., *striped*; yel., *yellow*; va., *variegated*; or., *orange*; b. & w, *blue and white*; vio., *violet*, &c., &c.

6th Column.—Usual height in feet the plants usually attain under good cultivation.

7th Column.—Usual months of flowering.

8th Column.—Price of the seeds per single packet.

A star, *, added to the letters of the fourth column, denotes that the biennial and perennial plants flower the first year as well as the second.

A double star, **, following the scientific name, signifies that the plants are climbing, and suitable for an arbor or trellis work.

Dots, . . ., in the fourth column, indicate a repetition.

TIME OF SOWING.—Hardy annuals from April to June, and many of the kinds in the autumn. Half hardy annuals in May, or earlier, in a *green-house* or a *hat-bed*. Tender annuals in a *hat-bed*, and transplanted to the border in June. Biennials and perennials from April to July.
