She informed him that Miss Ho Shun Ying had been granted Theater clearance to enter Japan between August 20 and September 20, 1948 for a stay of 60 days after entry. Mrs. Mellor was authorized by Captain Chu to send a cablegram to the American Consulate General at Hong Kong to notify Miss Ying of her Theater clearance and in order that she might call at the Consulate General to be properly documented for her travel to Japan.

My dear Colonel Scott:

The Department of State is in receipt of a despatch dated August 18, 1948 from the American Embassy at Tehran communicating the application of Mr. Ahmad Alizadeh for permission to enter Japan for trade purposes.

The following is an excerpt from the Embassy's despatch communicating the aforementioned application:

"Mr. ALIZADEH did business with Japan before the war in textiles. He has had no preliminary correspondence since the war with any Japanese firms. He wishes to go to Japan as soon as possible as representative for the Kasra Trading Company, Tehran, Iran. He is primarily interested in textiles, chinaware and glassware.

"Mr. ALIZADEH possesses an Iranian passport. In addition to his own language he speaks English and one of the Indian dialects."

I have the honor to refer to the Department's Circular Airgram of July 22, 1947, concerning the reopening of private trade with Japan, and, in accordance with the Airgram's instructions to present for transmittal to SCAP the application of Messrs. Javad Safdari Ghandehari (WTD dated July 1, 1948) and Mohamad Sadegh Afshar (WTD in preparation) to enter Japan for trade purposes. The applicants are nationals of a non-FEC country which has no mission in Tokyo.

A previous application was submitted in the Embassy's Despatch No. 172 of June 17, 1948, and permission was received in Deptel 708 of July 26, 1948, for Messrs. Ghandehari and Afshar to enter Japan between August 15 and September 15. They are unwilling to go at this time, and instead request permission herewith to enter Japan in November or December.

Mr. Ghandehari was engaged in trade with Japan before the war, dealing mainly in cotton piecegoods, rubber goods and chinaware, and he is interested in establishing himself in these lines again. He has had preliminary correspondence since the war with some of his pre-war trade contacts in Japan. Mr. Afshar has also had pre-war trade experience with Japan, importing goods via Bombay through his uncle there and exporting asafetida to Japan. Mr. Afshar is interested in purchasing textiles, chinaware, and hardware. Mr. Afshar speaks English, while Mr. Ghandehari speaks only Persian. Both possess Iranian passports.

Messrs. Ghandehari and Afshar would like to travel together to Japan, if possible. However, they are agreeable to having their applications considered separately.

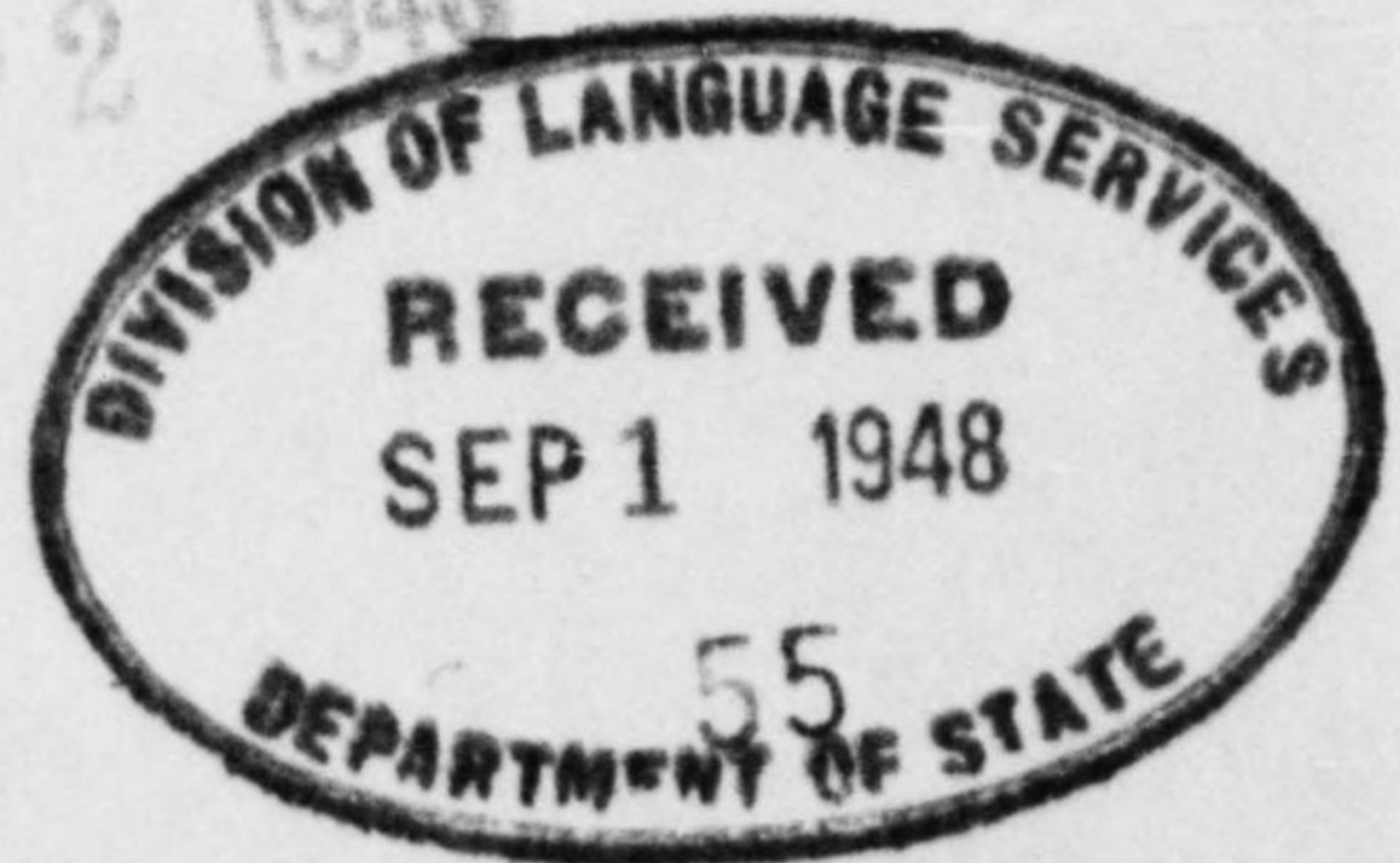

You state that these persons have been granted permission to enter Argentina.

You will recall from previous similar correspondence in this regard that the Department has been informed by its representatives in Japan that Argentine interests in that country are being represented at present by the Swedish Mission at Tokyo. As was stated in the Department's note of August 26, 1948 to you regarding Shinki Tokashiki and certain others in Japan desiring to enter Argentina, it is deemed desirable to postpone action on current requests of this nature until the Embassy is able to reply to the Department's

Mr. Spiro called Mrs. Mellor this afternoon and stated that his representative Mr. Jakob Szpiro who had a military permit to enter Japan between August 1 and August 31, 1948 was finding it difficult to arrange his affairs so that he could reach Japan by August 31. (Mr. Szpiro is presently in Shanghai and was notified there of his Theater clearance). Mr. Spiro requested that his representative's military permit be amended so as to permit him to enter Japan at a later date. Mrs. Mellor informed Mr. Spiro that the Department of State does not grant permits to enter Japan; that it is solely the jurisdiction of the Army Department; that the policy of the Military Permit Section of the Department of the Army is that any one who has been granted a military permit to enter Japan and is not able to use it within the allotted time must file a new application with the Regional Office of the Department of Commerce. Mr. Spiro then said, "in other words, it is a new case"; to which Mrs. Mellor replied yes.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE FILES

RE: Theater clearance to enter Japan for Milos George Stejskal and Olga, his wife.

DS had no record of this application when the memorandum from the Military Permit Section, Army Department was received giving Theater clearance on compassionate grounds. Mrs. Mellor called Major Larson (MPS) and asked him to set the dates between which they could enter Japan. Major Larson said when a desired date of entry was not specified it was usual to give the 60-day period.

When the attached telegram (No. 1394 from Praha) was received Mrs. Mellor again called Major Larson and informed him the Embassy was requesting to be informed during what period the permission was valid. Major Larson said that when individuals requesting entry into Japan were not traders it wasn't customary to set the dates between which they could enter. However, he stipulated the date for entry to be between September 15 and November 15 (60 days) which he thought would simplify matters for the STEJSKALS. I told Major Larson the Embassy also requested that he be informed of the point of entry and in this regard quoted specific sections from SCAP Circular 8. He said there were twelve points of entry but the usual entry points were Tokyo and Kobe, and that they could enter at any of the twelve points. Mrs. Mellor asked him if that would be all right with SCAP and Major Larson said yes, that at the point they entered notification would be sent to SCAP Headquarters.

If the Department were to stipulate a point of entry it might be quite a distance from the Stejskals desired destination. Not having any correspondence on the case makes it difficult. I then asked Major Larson if it would be all right to say in the telegram "entry point optional". He said yes.

It is assumed that travel agencies do not sell tickets for travel to Japan either by air or boat except to one of the twelve entry points. The Stejskals should be able to find out in Praha what those entry points are and choose the one which will be nearest to their desired destination.

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This Consulate General has recently received from Dr. Joseph Wilhelm Wirtz, a medical doctor of German nationality, a request for assistance in obtaining a military permit to enter Japan for the purpose of setting up a private practice. Dr. Wirtz states that he has in storage in Japan valuable surgical equipment, concerning the recovery of which he is in communication with the office of the Civil Property Custodian at Tokyo. He hopes to regain possession of this equipment necessary in the building of a practice among the foreign community in Japan.

According to information available at this office, Dr. Wirtz is a graduate of Leipzig University, and practiced privately in Germany until the outbreak of war. He is reported to have served in the Polish campaign in the autumn of 1939 as a civilian doctor, either with the Army or with SS troops.

In December 1939 the doctor was sent to Japan by the German Medical Association as an "exchange" doctor, or, according to another source, to serve the German official group in Tokyo. He resigned from his position within a short time after his arrival in Japan, and opened a practice in conjunction with the Yokohama Hospital, an institution maintained by the foreign community for its own use. Until 1944 Dr. Wirtz continued this employment, but in that year was compelled, it is alleged, to flee to Tientsin, China, in order to avoid the Gestapo. It was in this hurried flight that the surgical equipment now in the hands of the Civil Property Custodian left the possession of Dr. Wirtz.

Dr. Wirtz alleges that in 1944 he left the Nazi party, which he joined in 1935. The reason for this action is alleged to be the increasing friction between himself and party leaders which resulted from his return to the Catholic Church in 1941.

In Tientsin Dr. Wirtz acted as surgeon-in-chief to the Catholic Mission Hospital, "Mater Misericordia" until May 1946, when he left for Taiyuan, Shansi, China. It might reasonably be assumed that he went to the interior province of Shansi to escape repatriation to Germany, as he was on the list of persons to be repatriated. At approximately the same time, several highly "obnoxious" Germans high in the Nazi party organization in China found refuge there from repatriation activities proceedings which commenced early in 1946.

While in Shansi Dr. Wirtz taught at the Shansi Provincial Medical College in Taiyuan. He was evacuated from that city to Peiping in July 1948, at the height of a Communist attack on Taiyuan which seriously threatened the city and occasioned the removal of the provincial university to Peiping.

It would appear that the applicant should not be considered for entry into Japan. However, it is requested that this application be referred to SCAP, as Dr. Wirtz is anxious to recover by the quickest means his surgical equipment, in order that he may resume private practice, preferably in Japan. He states that at present he has available no equipment whatsoever, and therefore is severely handicapped in his ability to earn a living for himself and his family.

The medical certificate required under the terms of the Department's airgram A-18, May 12, 1948, 10:40 a.m., has been presented to this office by Dr. Wirtz, and will be forwarded to the Department by OM.

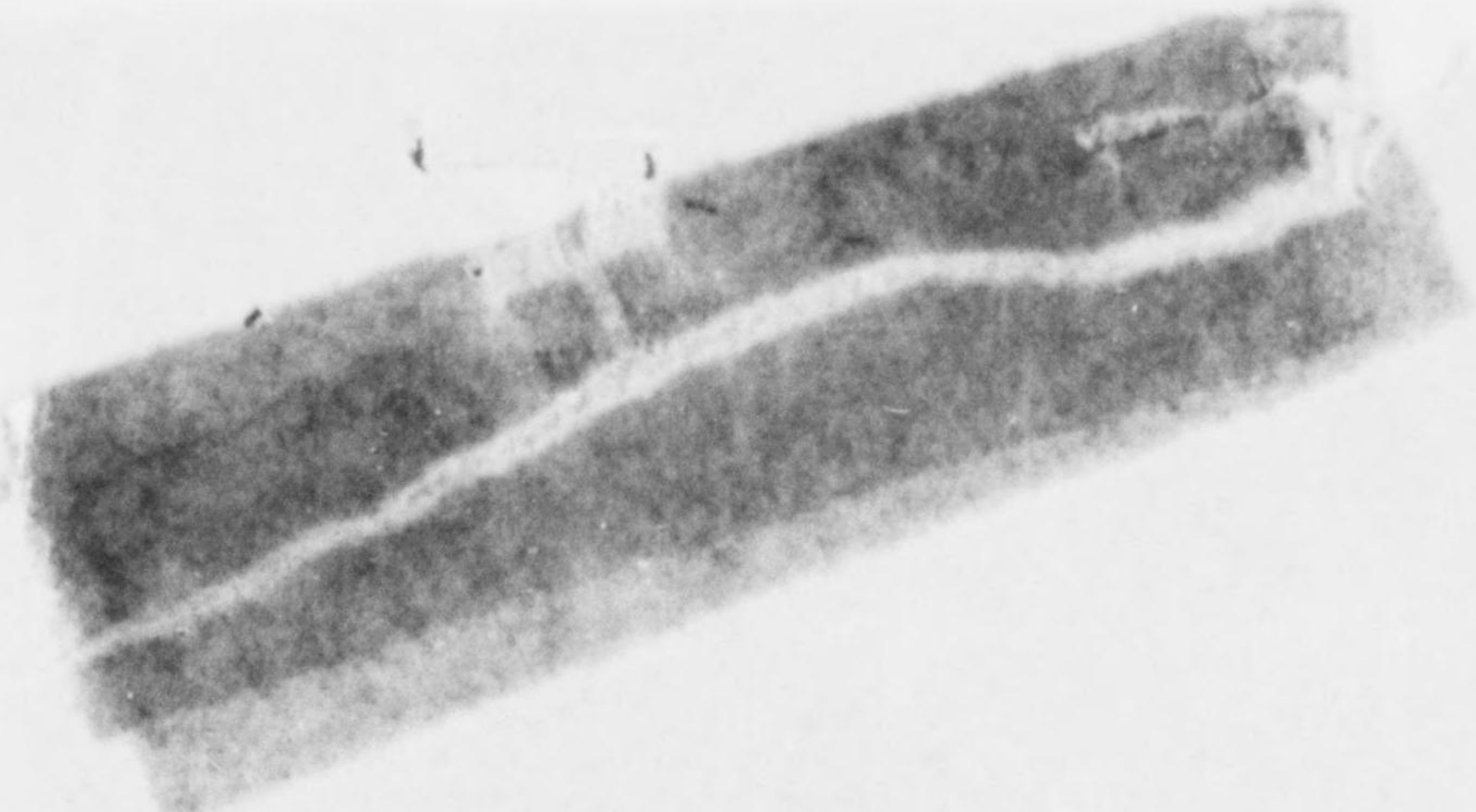
Decision of all consulted was that it is contrary to policy laid down to SCAP to release any property claimed by German nationals.
