1. This report has been prepared from a study of aerial photographs and a consideration of evaluated ground information supplied by the Joint Target Group.
2. FUNCTION:  
The SENJU Steam Power Station acts as a standby station.
3. LOCATION:  
Situating in TOKYO on the Eastern bank of the SUMIDA River, approximately 1 mile due West of the KITASENJU Railway Station and approximately 1 mile due S.W. of the SENJU SHIMBASHI road bridge over the ARA River.
4. SERVICES:  
Fuel is brought into the plant by barge and lighter on the river, no railway facilities enter the plant area.
5. IDENTIFICATION OF FACILITIES:

6. DISCUSSION:  
The quality and scale of the stereo air do not allow more definite statements to be made particularly regarding the area of stockyard. To the East of switch house the area there appears to be an outdoor storage area possibly for switch gear. To the north of generator hall there appears to be a building which may possibly be a pump house or storages.
7. ACTIVITY:  
At the time of photography no smoke can be seen emitting from any of the 4 stacks and it can, therefore, be assumed that the plant was probably inactive.
