GENERAL ORDERS, No. 11.

I. Examining Boards for Conscripts will, when practicable, be composed of two medical officers, and one employed surgeon.

They will hold continuous sessions in the several counties of their respective districts, to facilitate the execution of the duties prescribed by General Orders, No. 141, 1863, from this office.

II. Paragraph III, General Orders, No. 141, last series, from this office, is amended, to provide, that in all cases when there are two medical officers on the boards for the examination of conscripts, recommendations and certificates must be concurred ln, and signed by both medical officers.
