Nov. 4, 1947

We were requested to clean out the destroyed buildings
(NO. 53) near Mikakino by Major Keysey on the spot.

Nov. 6, 1947

Before the start of the work, the negotiations were
made by telephone among Mr. Hall, civilian in the military
service, Major Geiser of the Gifu Military Government Team,
Major Keysey and Mr. Mascola, civilian in the military ser-
vice and the gate-passes were granted for two trucks.

Nov. 8, 1947

When Orido, non-official, called on Mr. Mascola at
the Military Government Team, he was warned that a proper
procedure should have been taken.

Nov. 10, 1947

On this warning, Orido, non-official, called on Major
Keysey and told him that he would stop carrying out.
Tanaka, chief of the Building Dep't was ordered by ^{Mr.} Mascola
to return the articles already carried out.

Nov. 13, 1947

Orido, non-official, called on Major Keysey and after
the conversation by telephone between the major and Mr. Mascola,
Orido was directed that it was not necessarily to return the
articles.

Nov. 14, 1947

On this account, Orido called on Mr. Mascola at the Military Government Team. But he was absent then and Orido asked Mr. Hiramatsu, interpreter, to give Mr. Mascola his message. Afterward Orido received the message of Mr. Mascola through Hiramatsu saying that the matter had been settled already.

Dec. 2, 1947

Orido, non-official staff called on Major Keysey at the 27th Regiment and asked for his reconfirmation.

After the conversation by telephone between the Major and a certain newly-appointed Captain, Orido received reply to the effect that it was not necessarily to return them. On the same day, he called on a certain Captain at the Military Gov't Team and received from him an instruction of the same kind.

Articles to be carried out

Only the piled articles and chips of wood in NO.53 destroyed building.

They are to be distributed among the schools in Gifu City listed on the annexed sheet and used as fuel for pupils.

Trusses were removed by one hundred and scores of workers. But none of them was carried out.

ACCOUNT:

1. The lumbers to be taken out are not available here for the reconstruction of schools. So they have been distributed among the various war-stricken schools as fuel and are being kept as they are. (See the annexed sheet for details).
2. As various useless lumbers are being piled up disorderly, we cannot account take a count of them exactly. But they are estimated to be about 22.5 "koku" ("koku" equals to 10 cu.ft.)
3. It seems that Orido, interpreter, did not make any profit personally. That is to say, he merely acted as an interpreter at the request of Gifu City Office, when they inspected the actual scene, intending to apply for the release of the buildings to use for reconstructing the war damaged schools and were told to take out all those buildings.
4. The detailed state is shown in the folling copy of the report by the chief of the Building Department of Gifu City.

2. As various useless lumbers are being piled up disorderly, we cannot account take a count of them exactly. But they are estimated to be about 22.5 "koku" ("koku" equals to 10 cu.ft.)
3. It seems that Orido, interpreter, did not make any profit personally. That is to say, he merely acted as an interpreter at the request of Gifu City Office, when they inspected the actual scene, intending to apply for the release of the buildings to use for reconstructing the war damaged schools and were told to take out all those buildings.
4. The detailed state is shown in the folling copy of the report by the chief of the Building Department of Gifu City.

Nov. 4, 1947

We were requested to clean out the destroyed buildings
(NO.53) near Mikakino by Major Keysey on the spot.

Nov. 6, 1947

Before the start of the work, the negotiations were
made by telephone among Mr. Hall, civilian in the military
service, Major Geiser of the Gifu Military Government Team,
Major Keysey and Mr. Mascola, civilian in the military ser-
vice and the gate-passes were granted for two trucks.

Nov. 8, 1947

When Orido, non-official, called on Mr. Mascola at
the Military Government Team, he was warned that a proper
procedure should have been taken.

Nov. 10, 1947

On this warning, Orido, non-official, called on Major
Keysey and told him that he would stop carrying out.
Tanaka, chief of the Building Dep't was ordered by Mascola
to return the articles already carried out.

Nov. 13, 1947

Orido, non-official, called on Major Keysey and after
the conversation by telephone between the major and Mr. Mascola,
Orido was directed that it was not necessarily to return the
articles.

Nov. 14, 1947

On this account, Orido called on Mr. Mascola at the Military Government Team. But he was absent then and Orido asked Mr. Hiramatsu, interpreter, to give Mr. Mascola his message. Afterward Orido received the message of Mr. Mascola through Hiramatsu saying that the matter had been settled already.

Dec. 2, 1947

Orido, non-official staff called on Major Keysey at the 27th Regiment and asked for his reconfirmation.

After the conversation by telephone between the Major and a certain newly-appointed, Captain, Orido received reply to the effect that it was not necessarily to return them. On the same day, he called on a certain Captain at the Military Gov't Team and received from him an instruction of the same kind.

Articles to be carried out

Only the piled articles and chips of wood in NO.53 destroyed building.

They are to be distributed among the schools in Gifu City listed on the annex sheet and used as fuel for pupils.

Trusses were removed by one hundred and scores of workers. But none of them was carried out.

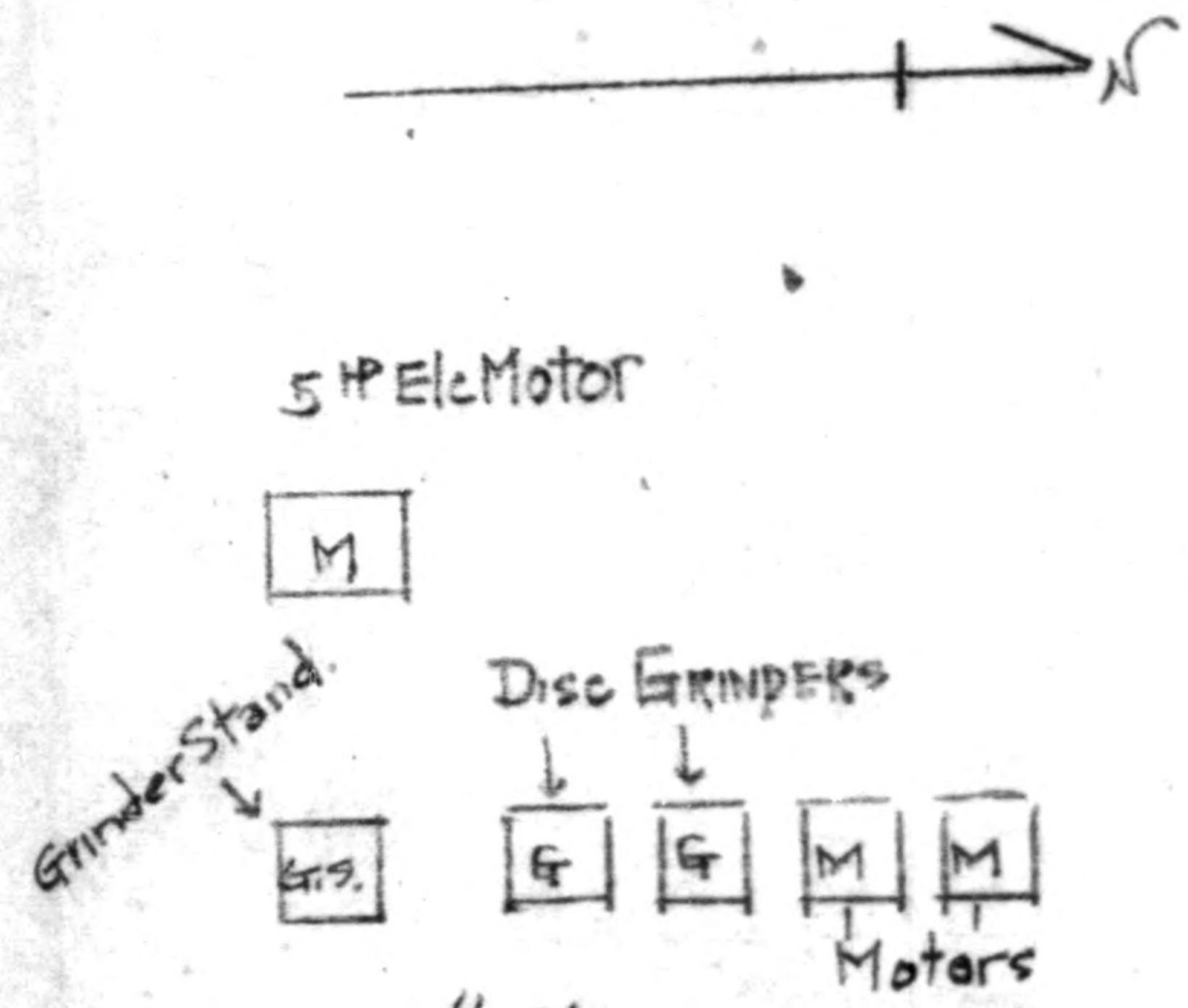
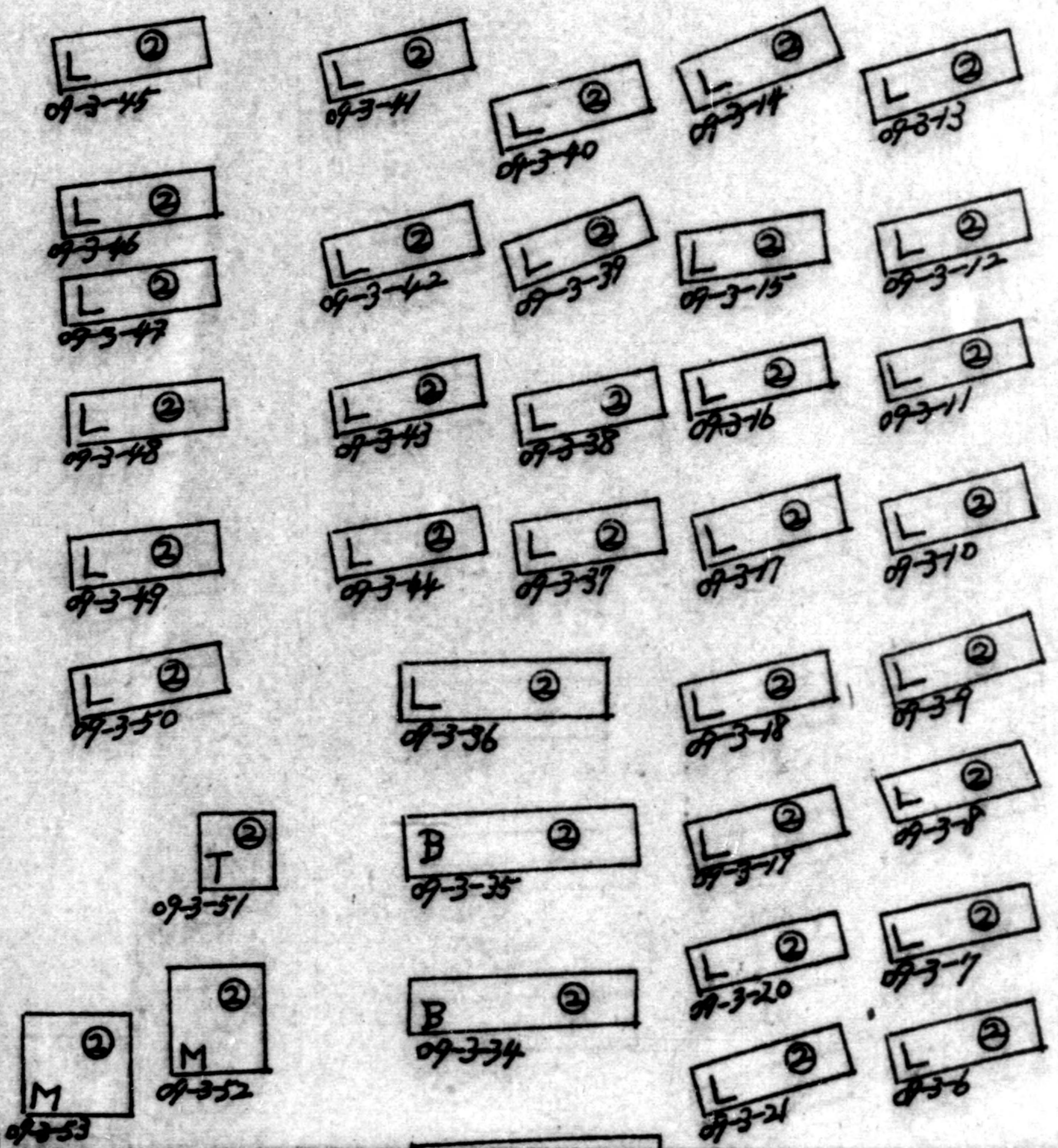

- a. The machinery was in fair condition. No protective measures were being taken to preserve the machinery, and the building was inadequate to protect the machinery. The following orders were given to the custodian of the plant:

- b. Close surveillance is being maintained over this plant, and at the present time directives are being complied with.

2. You will order the subject plant to take the following actions:

- a. Establish a 24 hour Japanese civilian guard at the establishment. It will be the responsibility of the company to furnish the guards. No one may be hired as a guard if he is in the categories listed by SCAP directives as being ineligible for hire. Particular care will be taken to avoid hiring of any demobilized Japanese Army or Navy officer personnel.
- b. Post prominently at all entrances to such establishments the following sign in both English and Japanese, "This Establishment Is Off Limits To All United States Troops and Japanese Personnel"
- c. Close and seal all but one gate and/or entrance way to the establishment, and deny access to all except specifically authorized personnel whose duties or work require entrance to the premises.
- d. Hire personnel adequate to prepare machinery for storage and to accomplish the maintenance work necessary to protect the machinery from deterioration.

3. Submit weekly through the Liaison Office to the 107th Military Government Company, a report on the progress of storage and maintenance activities, until preparations for adequate protective storage have been completed.

4. The machinery is rusty, you will hire personnel immediately to remove rust and apply adequate preservative lubricants to machinery.

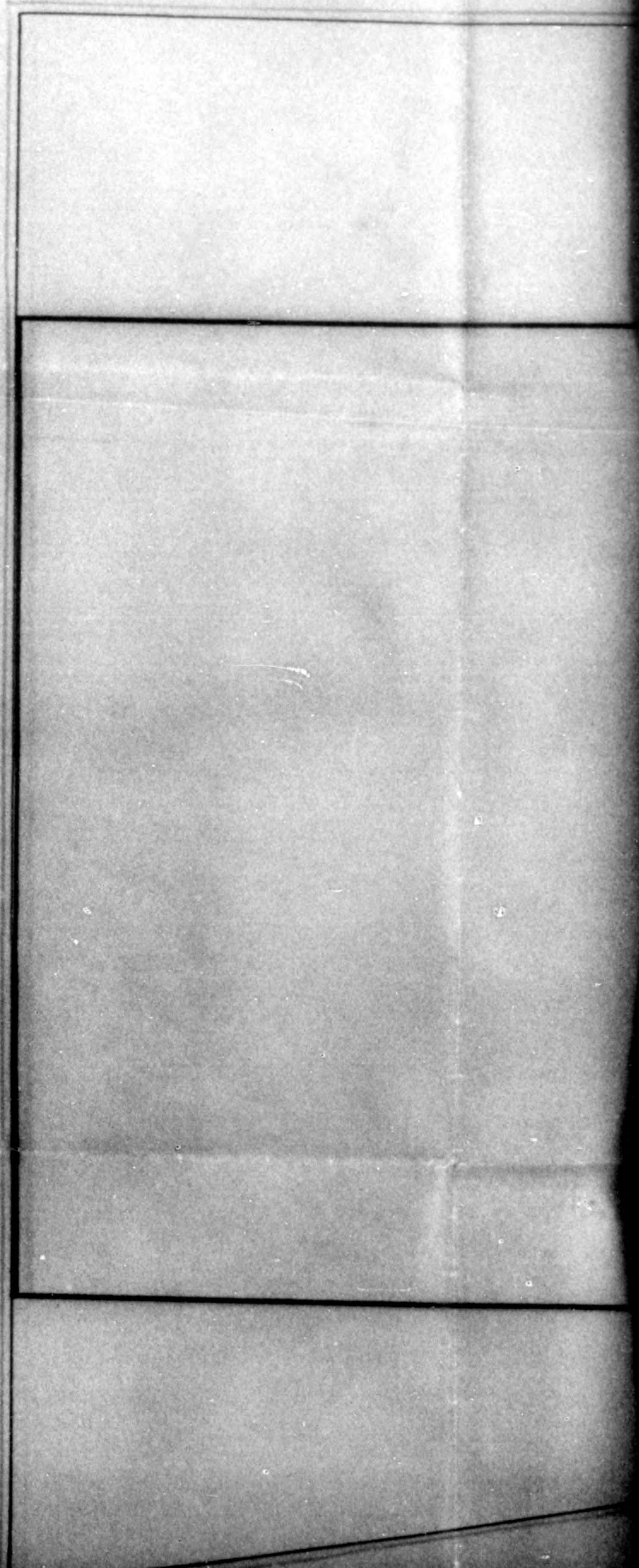

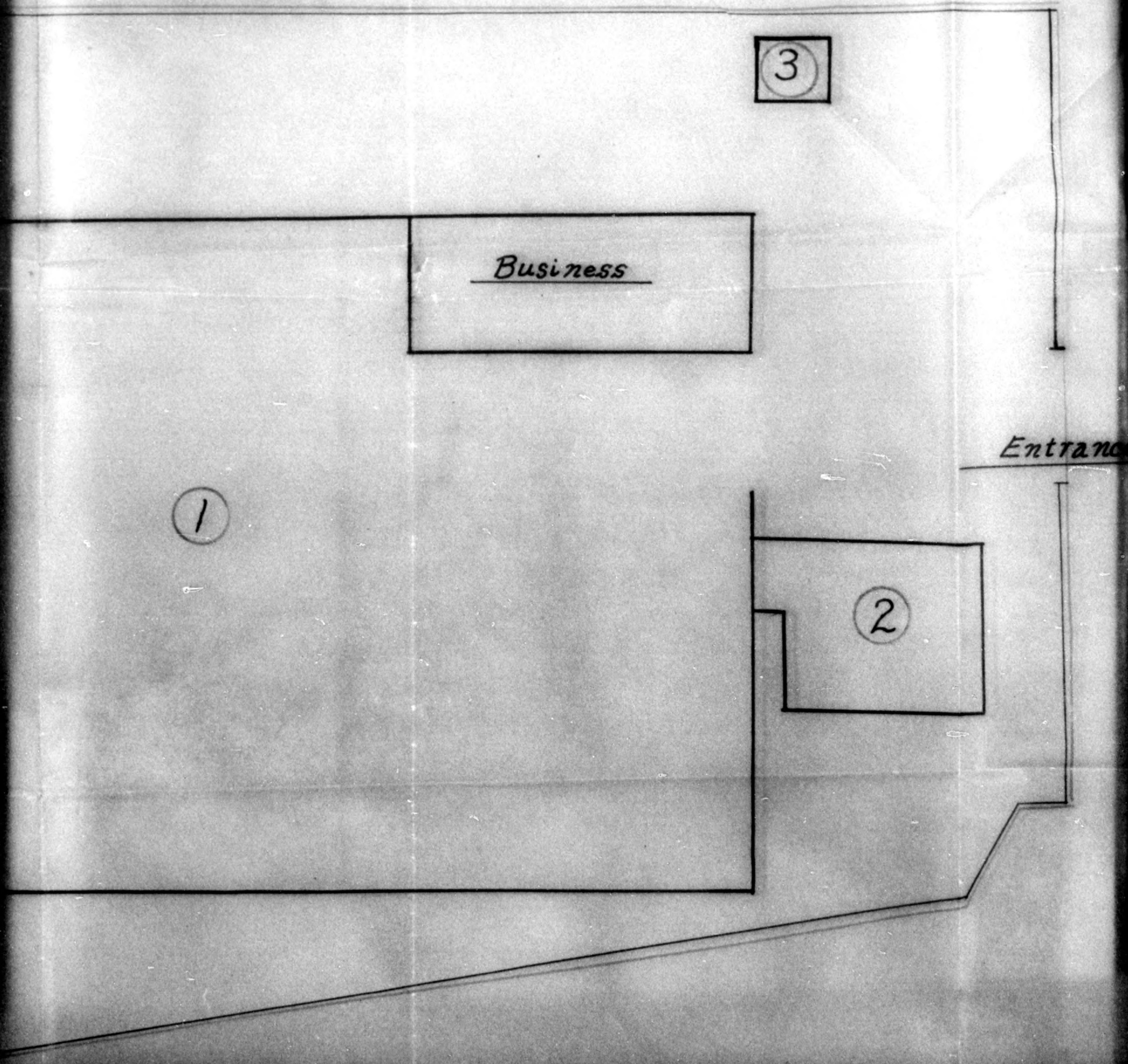


Plant Layout

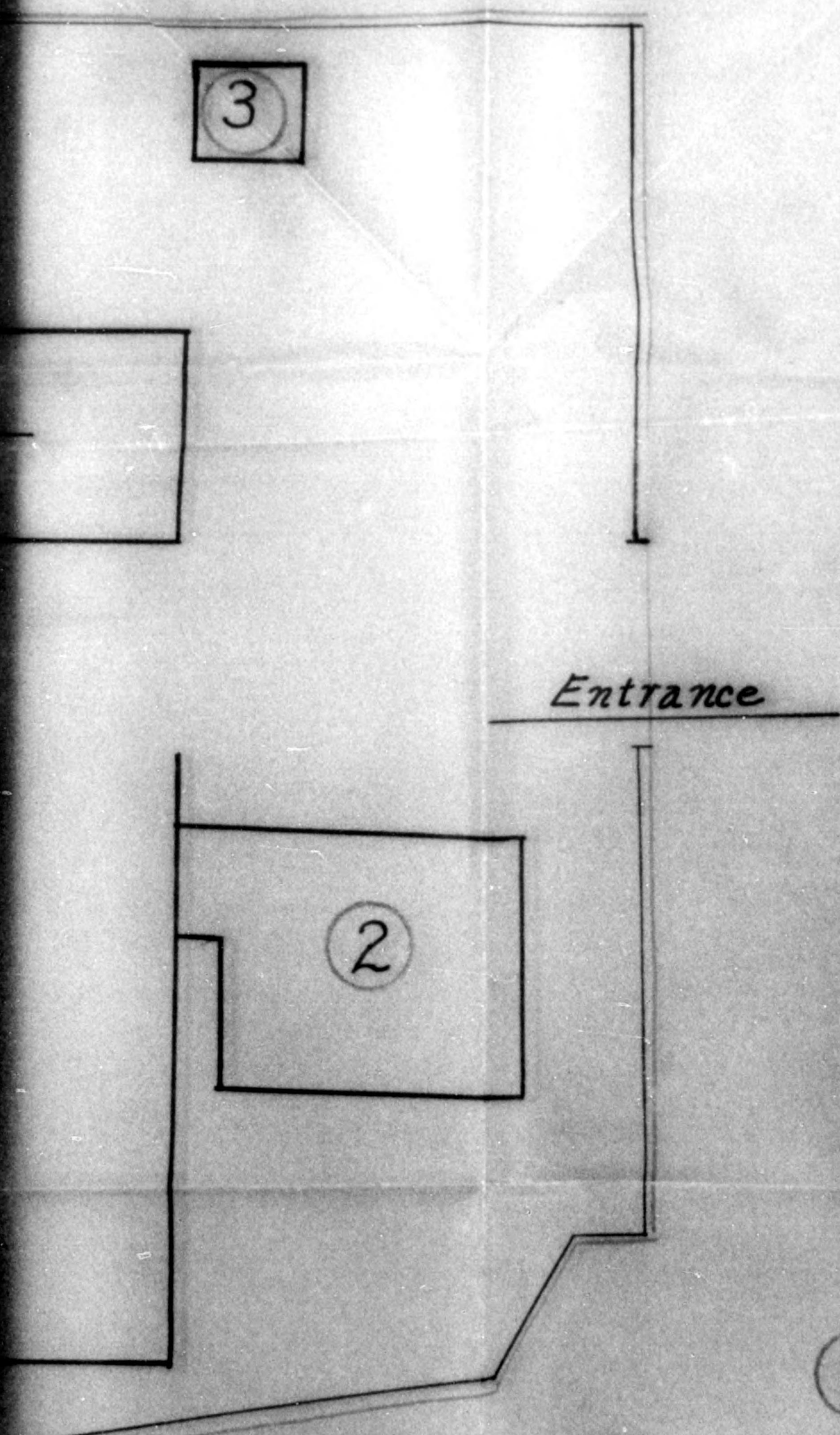
