## $\mathfrak{A}$ Skettly of ©ur Clubjouse

Shortly after the organization of the Woman's Club of Raleigh in 1904 it was felt that a home was a prime necessity, that without it the work was hampered and the members' interest desultory. How could it be done, without resources, or income save the small dues, was the problem the Executive Board faced in 1906. But they had the vision of pioneers, and, led by Miss Fannic Heck, a house and lot on Capitol Square was purchased for $\$ 7,000$. It was an old residence that required remodeling, and a canvass of the members raised the money for this, and in October, 1907, the Club took possession of its first home, the first woman's clubhouse in North Carolina. Here it grew and flourished, the debt was finally paid, but hardly before the Club felt the need of a modern, up-to-date building to house its increased membership. In the years that had elapsed the organization had found itself, and assumed this heavy undertaking with confidence. A building committee composed of Dr. Dixon-Carroll, chairman, Mrs. W. S. Primrose, Mrs. T. Palmer Jerman, Mrs. T. P. Harrison, and Mra. Clarence Johnson, was elected, the property on Capitol Square sold for $\$ 14,000$, and a lot on Hillsboro Street purchased for $\$ 11,000$. Step by step the Club passed on the work of the building committee and endorsed it. Plans were submitted and selected, the contract let and ground broken in September, 1915. Interesting exercises marked the laying of the corner-stone on Wednesday, Noveinber 3, 1915. The speakers on this occasion were the founder of the Club, Mrs. E. E. Moffitt, Mrs. R. R. Cotton, and Mrs. W. R. Hollowell, and it marked a galaday for Raleigh club women. In June, 1916, the building was completed and accepted in time for the last meeting of the season to be held in its auditorium June 1, 1916. It represents, lot and building, in round numbers, $\$ 36,000$.

This sketch would be incomplete without grateful acknowledgment of the invaluable aid the Club has had from the men of Raleigh. From the beginning, by word and deed, they have helped this home to completion, and it is dedicated for service to our city and State with the carnest hope that it prove itself a wortlyy factor in Ralcigh's life.

During the Teachers＇Assembly held in Raleigh in November the Club had the pleasure of entertaining the seventy－odd boys and girls who came as representatives from the Canning and Corn Clubs of Wake County to demonstrate to the Assembly the best methods of con－ servation of food on the farm．

The opening of the State Fair in October was cele－ brated by a beautiful parade gotten up by the Rotary Club of Raleigh．The parade was formed of lovely and unique floats representing nearly every business and or－ ganization in the city．The Woman＇s Club Better Babies Float won one of the four beautiful loving cups which were presented by the Fair Association as prizes．

The Better Babies contest during the last Fair was considered the most successful one ever held．There were about 200 babies entered．

During March a campaign was conducted in the city which resulted in the raising of funds amounting to $\$ 35,000$ ．This was mostly used in the furnishing and equipment of the building．

The expenses of two patients at the Sanatorium have been paid this year from the proceeds from the sale of Red Cross seals．

The War Relief Work resulted in the making of 822 articles of hospital supplies and the collection of a quan－ tity of old linen，which was shipped to the May Fair Relief of New York，and 1，259 baby garments，which were sent to the Belgian Relief Commission．

After the losses resulting from the floods in Western North Carolina became known，five large boxes of cloth－ ing were collected and shipped－to the sufferers．

The War Department having ordered mobilization of our North Carolina National Guard at Camp Glenn，pre－
paratory to going to the Mexican border if necessary, the Woman's Club took the initiative in calling together the women of Raleigh to plan a farewell celebration for our soldiers. As a result of a meeting of representative women in the Club Auditorium, invitations were issued to the officers and men of Company B, the Third Regiment Band, the officers of the Coast Artillery Corps, and the staff officers of the Third Regiment in Raleigh, to a barbecue to be given in the Club auditorium. On the appointed day, June 30, at 1 o'clock, dinner was served to one hundred and fifty men, the auditorium having been beautifully decorated by the young ladies of Manly's Battery. Music was furnished by the Third Regiment Band.

The Club had the pleasure of being hostess to the clubs in our district on Reciprocity Day，October last． Members of the Federated Clubs of Durham，Chapel Hill， Roxboro，Burlington，Elon and Smithfield，as well as of the Raleigh Club，attended the interesting session in the morning，hearing the reports from the different clubs and having luncheon together after the business meeting．

With the coming of war nearer to us，the need of Red Cross work became more pressing，and in order to help on the work the use of the Club was offered to the Raleigh Chapter．During the late winter and spring the Red Cross has met on Fridays and in the summer meet－ ings have been held each Thursday and Friday morn－ ings．A number of First Aid Classes have also been held in the building．

In July a meeting was called by the Social Service De－ partment to arouse interest in the need of a Travelers＇ Aid for Raleigh．This meeting was held at the Gover－ nor＇s Mansion and it is hoped that as a result this im－ portant safeguard for the traveling public may be estab－ lished in the near future．

During the summer canning was done for the benefit of the Associated Charities by a number of Club women at the High School，and a very good beginning was made for work of this kind on a larger scale if it should be neces－ sary next year．

Two very successful Flower Shows were held at the Club，one in November and one in May．These were managed by a committee from the Chamber of Com－ merce and the Civics Department．

A committee from the Club helped very efficiently in getting subscriptions for the Liberty Loan Bonds when the campaign was held in Raleigh in June, succeeding in having bonds to over the amount of $\$ 22,000$ taken.

At Christmas time 103,848 Red Cross Seals were sold. This is more than twice as many as sold previously, and Raleigh came second only to Greensboro in the number of seals disposed of. With the funds thus derived and by cooperation with the Tuberculosis Commission and other agencies, two Public Health nurses have been employed. They have been placed at the disposal of the City Physician.

During the winter the sum of $\$ 340$ was collected and sent to the Fund for the Belgian Children's Lunches.

In July a mecting was held at the Club at which were represented all the Women's Associations of the City and County, and at which Mrs. J. R. Chamberlain, who had been previously appointed Temporary Chairman of the Woman's Committee of the Council of National Defense for Wake County, was made permanent Chairman.

##  Actomplished in War=Time

The organized womanhood of America has been busy day by day in meeting the needs which have almost daily arisen. The Red Cross has been made welcome to anything of ours they could use-our building, our trained workers, and our unstinted aid in the campaigns for funds.

The Liberty Loan has also been served by the Woman's Club with all the earnestness of patriotism and the energy of well-directed endeavor. Other war work, the Victory Commission, the Y. W. C. A., the Y. M. C. A., the War Savings Campaign-all we have helped to put "over the top." A committee from the Woman's Club succeeded in getting 452 subscriptions amounting to $\$ 109,-$ 250.00 for the Third Liberty Loan.

The Woman's Committee of the Council of National Defense, as regards its specific demands on the entire womanhood of the city, has always had its fullest response from Club members, and its chairmanships have been regularly filled by our members.

In January, the "Save the Seventh Baby Campaign" was carried out with much assistance from the Club, and a health survey of the City of Raleigh, demonstrating the weaknesses as well as the advantages of the city, was published for distribution.

Besides all these things, all regular programs have taken turn as usual. The record is very incomplete without mention of the distinguished visitors entertained by the Club during the year.

Miss Jeanette Rankin was tendered a reception during Fair Week last October.

What the Woman's Club Has Accomplished-Con.

The ladies of the French High Commission, distinguished foreign guests, were given a luncheon in our Auditorium, which was an occasion and scene long to be remembered. This was not distinctively a Club function, but almost every representative of a patriotic or a National organization was also a Club member, altho representing another line of women's association that day.

The Social Service Department was responsible for a reception given to the Social Service Conference in the early spring, at which Mrs. Maude Ballington Booth was the guest of honor, and the speaker at a meeting in the Auditorium.

Finally, we must mention the meeting of the State Federation of Women's Clubs, which put the cap-stone of distinction on our year's work, and enabled us to receive the inspiration of the ideas of the whole State's enlisted womanhood. This convention will long be a redletter day in our history.

This Federation meeting was better attended than any one has ever been since the beginning, in spite of war conditions at this time. At this meeting, one of our own ex-presidents, Mrs. Clarence Johnson, now President of the State Federation, presided to our exquisite pride and delight.

We had with us as guests, Mrs. Josiah Evans Cowles, President of the General Federation of Women's Clubs; Mrs. Antionette Funk, Vice-Chairman of the Woman's National Liberty Loan Committee, and our own Mrs. Russell Langdon, of New York City, who was with us for the first time since she left us.

At this meeting of the State Federation of Women's Clubs of North Carolina was passed an almost unanimous and overwhelming vote in favor of equal suffrage for women.

The terrible epidemic of influenza found one of us with the ability and the desire to organize the volunreer mursing at school and camp, and there is another member of the board who was the faithful worker at the enrolling of rohmeer nurses for the U. S. Government needs.

Besides, there have been gracious women in high place who have giren us prestige. I mean Mrs. Bickett. who went to France on a Y. W. C. A. mission; Mrs. Daniels, Madame Secretary of the Nary, whose work for hostess houses has done so much for the need of the time and suggested so much for the direction of further work.

Mrs. Russell Langdon of New York, who is high in the commsels of the Red Cross, is still our member.

Our President, Mrs. B. H. Griffin, for whom we all feel such devotion, without whose gentle counsel nothins for good has been done in term or out.

We have been represented in France, and are but just now welcoming home a member whose service there has been inspiring to herself and to us.

Indeed, we are a Club whose deeds praise us in the gates, and we have much to live up to in the rear just begiming.

Dear Clum Members：
With the Get－together Dinner in October we propose not only to get－to－gether then but to stay together throughout the year，working shoulder to shoulder that our chub may continue to be a forco for good in our community．

The policy of one president，if in harmony with the general policy of the club，is little different from that of other presidents．Our constitution says that the object of the club is the intellectual，philanthropic， social，civic，and domestic betterment of the city．One may stress the social，recreational and good health features，another may urge even closer co－oper ation with the public schools and public libraries but all are working toward the same end；that of civic betterment senerally，more of neighborliness，more of community interest．The preservation of the home，the home in its broadest sense，which includes our neighbor as our responsibility，is woman＇s supreme obligation，it is claimed．To the club women of Raleigh，trained in a continual effort for the betterment of humanity，does the city look to promote whaterer tends to civic im＿ provement．

It is said，＂that the past quarter century during which the club movement has been gaining headway now looks as though it had been merely a time of preparation for a service to our country based on the study of her human needs and now crowned with the power of citizenship．＂This political change has affect－ ed the status，the potentiality of every club in the country．Our club，for instance，has been changed from a club of so many women members to a club of more than（ 600 ）six hundred voting women citizens－ more than six humdred women strong with a roice in the government of civic，state and national affairs． As Marjorie Shuler says，＂whether or not you ever＂ wanted to vote you are doing so now because you are a patriotic American and to rote is the most direct way you can serve your nation and its govermment．And you want to make yours the very best kind of a rote＂． Apply that locally．If you want to have a voice in naming the governing body of our city or in mmicipal affairs generally，study the situation and let sour rote be an expression of rour honest convictions．As a cluh，howerer，we must guard against letting local politics＂creep into the maks＂，as Mrs．C．C．Hook sars，for we are not a political ormanization．

ment of our clab women. Let us make our club in truth a training camp for citizenship, a training camp for every day life. I believe that the best way to elicit interest and support is by giving them some definite piece of work to do, whether it be the decoration of the club for a reception, the filling of a Christmas stocking, participation in an opera or a Shakespeare plas.

In our departmental programs we have tried to correlate the work as far as possible with the program of work as outlined by our state departments with concession, of course, to our own local needs. With state departments of education, public welfare, health. and civics though the fire prevention division, with the state home demonstration work and the library commission, we have unlimited opportunities for keeping in close touch with the work as studied and outlined by experts. It is our purpose to dovetail our club work with the great public aims.

A varied and instructive program has been arranged by the capable chairman you have named to head the departments but unless you uphold their hands and show your interest and co-operation by attending their meetings the program will not be a success. The departmental work is really the backbone of the club We want to stabilize the departments, organize them into smaller clubs, as it were, and have you register with the departments in which you desire to work during the year. Let the chairmen know that they can depend upon you to help them carry out the program. They have "united in one grand sweet conspiracy" to give you something that is truly wortin while and make you feel that you cannot afford to miss these meetings. From the woman who wants to learn how to make a hat or design a dress to the would-be Portia in the Shakespeare class something has been planned. We have the tastes of more than 600 women to consider and in view of that we are planning various study classes for various groups of women. It is for you to say which one or how many you desire to join. You will have classes in millinery, costume designing and cooking; you will be taught interior decoration and an appreciation of art in all its forms; you will have an opportunity $t$ study American music and at the same time, American literature; you will have a course in story-telling. and study classes in citizenship, you will be given a chance to study at close range your own conditions as to health and sauitation. social and industrial relations, city schools and ciric affairs generally.

As a club let us stand by our public institutions-the Olivia Raney Library, Rex Hospital, the public schools of our city. Let us interpret the library to the community as a vital element in their lives and a free institution established for the benefit of the men, women and children of this city. And let us continue our efforts until Raleigh children have been provided with a real "Children's Library". Rex Hospital which belongs to the city is an institution in which we should take the greatest pride and to which we should give our most loyal support. The public schools need our co-operation as never before and I urge you to uphold the hands of the new school administration in the great work that lies ahead. Through the big program of community service in which our club is a shareholder we want "to make our community an exten_ sion of our home where we people of all kinds and temperaments shall be friends with each other."

I count it a great privilege to have served my apprenticeship under Mrs. B. H. Griffin, first as your second vice president and later as your first vice president. It has prepared me in a large measure for the work ahead. Having caught glimpses of her vision of the big possibilities of the club's service to the community I hope that I have caught some of her enthusiasm and energy that fulfillment may be possible. I am deeply indebted to the nominating committee for naming so splendid a board to help me serve sou and I bespeak the gladness of every club member in having our own Mis. Josephus Daniels home again and a member of that board.

May I again express my grateful appreciation of this mark of your confidence. With your continued faith in me I will do my utmost to serve you to the best of my ability.

Mrs. Cotten was the pioneer Club woman of North Carolina. Before our State Federation was formeã (1902) she was chairman of the State Committee which co-operated with the General Federation in promoting the Club movement, organizing Clubs and urging the organization of a State Federation of Clubs.

Her membership in the Pioneer Workers attests this.

When the N. C. Federation was formed she was elected first vice-president and later served as Chairman of various Departments of work, therein carrying into each line of work the enthusiasm which characterizes all her deeds.

She drafted our Constitution and By Laws and wrote our Federation Song, which expresses her patriotism and her faith in women. She was elected President in 1911. This larger opportunity redoubled her activity. She at once started a movement for an Endowment Fund, incorporated the N. C. Federation, designed and had made the Federation Seal, induced the women to purchase a stereopticon to promote the civic and educational work. She started the Federation Scrap Book and many other activities the influence of which is felt even today. In co-operation with the N. C. Teachers' Assembly, as President, she led the Club women in the successful struggle to

make women eligible to the School Boards. All this was long before women were enfranchised and when such progressive action was not popular. She always put into her activities an unselfish devotion and an unfailing fidelity which brought her the devotion of our women, and brought to the Federation the respect of men and women.

When she retired from the office of President the women sought to honor her and she was made our only Honorary President. At the same time the Federation started an Educational Loan Fund which fund was named in her honor-Sallie Southall Cotten Loan Fund. The education of girls has ever been her favorite activity and this Loan Fund grows and continues to bless worthy girls as the years go on. She was made and is yet a Trustee of the Endowment and Loan Fund. Later she was made Director for North Carolina on the General Federation Board of Directors, where she served four years-the limit of her eligibility.

No place of honor has ever lessened her interest in the smallest Club nor the humblest woman. She loves her sex and continues to work for the advancement of womanhood.

Wherever she serves North Carolina women love and trust her.

## flessage yrom the 3 Bresiont

Dear Club Members:
In dedicating the 1922-1923 Year Book to North Carolina's pioneer Club woman-Mirs. Robert R. Cotten, a woman beloved of us all-let us not forget our own Club women whose big vision, courage, yea, daring, nearly a score of years ago made possible our splendid organization of today. It's easy enough to "Carry On" when once the way has been opened up and we must never cease to be grateful to those who made the first beginnings. As Mrs. Cotten says, "There is a wide difference now and long ago in the valuation of a Club woman. Years ago she was eyed with a veiled but very evident suspicion as being too advanced for safety, but now it is a mark of distinction to be a Club woman." It took courage and quite a bit of pluck, too, to finance a Club house in days when Club homes were rather looked upon with disfavor, and women as financiers, with distrust. The possession of a Club home has meant that our efficiency has been increased tenfold for we now have the tools with which to work. "More and more it becomes clear that the Woman's Club is the servant of the community, at least potentially" writes a well known Club woman, "and for its full efficiency it must have competent facilities." Therefore, I ask you who are now reaping the harvest of those early efforts to pay tribute with a grateful heart to our own pioneer Club women.

We are just across the threshold of a new era for Raleigh-an era of progress and growth. There is much that we Club women can do and the city looks to us for co-operation in the general plan of expansion and improvement. With the knowledge that the interests of Raleigh school children have ever been near to our hearts it is with a glow of pride in the vision of our people that we mark the improvements in our public schools, made possible by the
passage of the million dollar bond issue; and that we note the increased appropriation the city now makes the Olivia Raney Library which means the establishment of a Children's Library the first of the year. Better schools for our children and hand-in-hand with it a real Children's Library has been a dream of our Club women for many years. We note also the work of the City Planning Commission whose first constructive step was to bring to Raleigh a city planning and city zoning expert to assist the citizens in correcting some of the errors which attended the laying out of the city a hundred years ago, and in making our capital city a more beautiful place in which to live. This, too, is a movement in which the Club women have long been interested. There are other major needs of our city I ask you to consider, that we may be of the greatest possible service to our community.

There will be many calls on you for service this year for legislative winters are usually full. You'll have an opportunity at the December business meeting of hearing Mrs. Palmer Jerman, Chairman of the Committee on Legislation of the State Federation of Women's Clubs, discuss "Our Legislative Program." This is a program upon which the organized womanhood of North Carolina has agreed through the Legislative Council of Women and it is most important that you be informed along these lines. The Council needs your help for it is upon the Raleigh Club women that much of the work will devolve.

In regard to the Club work this year our policy of stressing the development of the individual Club woman and of correlating the departmental programs with the program as outlined by our state agencies remains unchanged. The program is before you and you will agree with us, we believe, that it is worth while. The Chairmen of Departments desire most of all that you register for work so that they may know the Club members affiliating with their departments.

We are mailing this year a Year Book to every member. Please use it as you would use a hand-book-every day. Read the programs carefully and see if there isn't some meeting you would like to
attend or some committee on which you would like to serve. Don't let the year pass and at its close say: "I haven't been to the Club this year'; I don't get anything out of it." Just remenber that the more of yourself you put into the Club the more you will get out of it and the more it will mean to you. Remember what the Woman's Club means to the community and take pride in the fact that as a member you are contributing your share in making it a civic asset.

In closing my message to you may I ask for your heartiest support during the coming year. I am serving you that you, in turn, may serve the public for that, after all, is the real reason for our corporate existence.

## Allessage from the 猃resident

This year we enter upon a biennial period that holds much of promise for the Raleigh Woman's Club, and for the community which it is our privilege to serve. We are within sight of the day when debt shall be lifted from this organization, and a day when we may begin to plan for the expansion of our material equipment commensurate with the measure of service that we should perform.

Our indebtedness has been reduced to about five thousand dollars. Although we may not discharge this obligation entirely within the time of my tenure of office, and that of the splendid Board of Directors, with whom it will be my privilege to be associated, yet we shall be enabled to look forward to this in our future development.

In any plans that it undertakes to consummate for the upbuilding of the community, the Woman's Club is peculiarly and particularly fortunate in that its membership is the most democratic and representative organization in the city. We are fortunate in that among us there is no conflict of interest, no confusion of aim; that we are not disturbed by circumstance that is founded upon factionalism.

Personally, the selection of the directors with whom I shall be associated in the formation of policies for the Club, during the coming two years, are of that splendid type of womanhood from whom will come the finest type of co-operation. I think that no organization could be more adeqately represented on
such a board as is our Club, and I look forward with appreciation and confidence for the fruition of our efforts.

The inadequacy of our auditorium space must have long since become apparent to the membership of the Club. If we are to be able to offer the community a place of assembly for the discussion of civic questions, and for the more purely social demands that are made upon us, we must make provision for enlarging our auditorium. During these two years I hope that we may be able to work out plans for the extension of our facilities, and that we may be fortunate enough to bring about their materialization.

In the field of larger service to the community, I feel that if we can lay the foundation for a more adequate expression of the community's artistic impulses that we shall have rendered a service in which the city stands in great need. We have in Raleigh a citizenship trained for the appreciation of the finer things, men and women who are able to supply that need, and little means for bringing them together.

My dream is that we may be able to install in the City Auditorium a great organ, an instrument that will be a thing of pride in the city, a memorial worthy of the sacrifices that Wake County offered in the time of our Nation's travail. I think that with $\$ 20,000$, or at the most, $\$ 25,000$, we will be able to erect this memorial to sacrifice.

With this instrument the community could have weekly concerts, with the program, from week to week, in charge of the music department of one of

our schools. We have seen in recent years the deep interest with which Raleigh entered into community gatherings there, and with this organ we may lay the foundation for deeper and finer interest in the finer things of life, and about it we may rally the best that is in the community.

Our Club has been most fortunate in the recognition it has received at the hands of the State Federation of Women's Clubs in the past. This year we are doubly fortunate in that we have a beloved past president, Mrs. T. Palmer Jerman, as President of the State Federation of Clubs, and in May we are to have the pleasure of entertaining in our city this organization for its annual meeting.

It would be, I feel, almost discourteous, for me to appeal to you for your co-operation and support. You have always given that in generous measure to the officers and directors of your choosing. I know, in my heart, that you will continue to give it in that fine spirit in which you have always accorded it, and without which the best efforts of any would fail.

# Cunstitution 

Article I-Name
This Club shall be called "The Woman's Club or Raleigif."

## Anticle II—Object

The object shall be the intellectual, philanthropic, social, civic, and domestic betterment of the city.

## Article III-Membership

Section 1. Membership in this Club shall be of four classes-active, associate, honorary, and life.

Sec. 2. The application of a candidate for membership, signed by herself and recommended by two members of the Club, shall be presented to the Board of Directors, and if approved, shall be submitted to the Club at its regular meeting.

SEc. 3. The vote of the majority of members present shall be necessary to admit to membership.

Sec. 4. Each member shall pay an initiation fee and such dues as may be prescribed by the By-Laws.

SEc. 5. After election a candidate becomes a member only upon paying the initiation fee and the dues for the year, at the same time agreeing to abide by the Constitution. She will then be entitled to a membership ticket, and shall be admitted to all the privileges of the Club for that year.

Sec. 6. A member may withdraw from the Club only through written communication with the Board of Directors.

SEc. 7. Any woman wishing to advance the interests for which the Club stands, but unable to take active part in the same, may become an associate member by election as such and by the payment of five dollars initiation fee and three dollars annual dues. Such members may be entitled to all the privileges of the Club.

Sec. 8. Honorary membership is left to the discretion of the Club.

Sec. 9. Life membership is left to the discretion of the Club.

Sec. 10. Nonpayment of dues, continued and unexcused absence from the Club, and continued failure to take part in the Club's work, shall operate as a forfeiture of membership.

Sec. 11. Any member of the Club may be expelled by a two-thirds vote, name having been presented with charges, in writing, at two consecutive meetings of the Club, and the member having had opportunity to defend herself.

Sec. 12. Members shall not invite, as guests, residents of the county to any meeting, but may invite nonresidents. Residents may be permitted to attend any regular meeting upon payment of 25 cents at the door.

Sec. 13. Members moving away may retain membership in this Club by the payment of the regular dues.

## Article IV-Officers

Section 1. The officers of this Club shall consist of President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, and Auditor.

Sec. 2. All officers shall present yearly reports of the work at the last Business Meeting, and said reports shall be filed in the archives of the Club.

SEc. 3. No member shall hold more than one office at the same time, and no officer, except the President, shall be eligible to the same office for more than two consecutive years, unless she has filled out the unexpired term of her predecessor.

## Article V-Departments

The work of this Club shall be conducted through eight departments, namely: Art, Civic, Education, Health, Household Economics, Literature, Music and Social Service.

## Article VI-Committees

There shall be four standing committees: Finance, Ways and Means, Social, and House.

## Article VII-Management

SEction 1. The officers of the Club, chairmen of the eight departments, Chairman of the Committee on Ways and Means and Chairman of the House Committee shall constitute a Board of Directors.

SEc. 2. Ex-Presidents of the Club shall constitute an Advisory Board.

## Article ViII-Meetings

SECTION 1. Business meetings of the Club shall be held on the first Thursday of each month, exclusive of July, August, and September.

Sec. 2. The April business meeting shall be the Annual Meeting.

SEc. 3. Twenty-five members shall constitute a quorum.

## Article IX-Nominations and Elections

Section 1. At the January meeting a committee of five shall be elected from the floor who shall constitute a nominating board. This board shall post before the February business meeting a list of candidates for election, and shall present their report at the Annual Meeting. They shall prepare blank ballots. All nominations must be made from the corrected list furnished by the Corresponding Secretary. Lists of members of departments may be obtained from the Secretaries of the various departments.

Sec. 2. The Board of Directors shall be elected at the Annual Meeting by ballot, and shall assume their duties at the close of the June meeting.

Sec. 3. Delegates and alternates to the State Federation of Women's Clubs shall be elected at the March meeting, upon nomination from the floor.

## Article X—Dues

Section 1. The initiation fee shall be three dollars, the annual membership dues shall be three dollars.

Sec. 2. Members joining in January shall, upon payment of dues, receive a membership ticket up to April of the following year.

Sec. 3. The annual dues shall be paid at the Annual Meeting. Any member who fails to do this, after having received two notices from the Treasurer, shall be considered as having voluntarily withdrawn from the Club, and her name shall be dropped from the roll.

Sec. 4. Members failing to pay dues may be reinstated after one year on payment of dues for ensuing year; after two years' failure to pay dues, a former member can only be readmitted to the Club as prescribed by Article III.

## Article XI-Amendments

The Constitution of the Club may be amended at any business meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present, notice of the proposed amendments having been made in writing at a previous meeting.

## TR A - Titafus

1. The Board of Directors shall transact all business of the Club, subject to its direction. During the summer interim it shall transact all business, submitting a written report of same at the October meeting.
2. All vacancies occurring during the year shall be filled by the Board of Directors.
3. The Board of Directors is empowered to employ a House Secretary and such other help as may be necessary.
4. The proceedings of the Board, especially in the admission or rejection of a candidate, shall be confidential. Any member violating this regulation shall be expelled from the Board as unworthy of the confidence of the Club.
5. Any officer leaving the city for a time shall place her books in charge of the Board of Directors. One intending to be absent from a meeting shall send her report.
6. The minutes of the Board of Directors shall be read at any business meeting on call from the floor.
7. The Advisory Board shall meet with the Board of Directors upon invitation of the President, and each member shall have a vote in such meeting.
8. The President shall preside over all meetings, and shall be ex officio Chairman of the Board of Directors. She shall appoint the members of the standing committees other than chairmen and such temporary committees as may be necessary to conduct the business of the Club. She is empowered to call meetings of the Board or of the Club at her discretion.
9. The Vice-Presidents, in the order of their election, shall perform the duties of the President in her absence. The Second Vice-President shall be Chairman of the Social Committee. In the absence of the

President and both the Vice-Presidents, the Recording Secretary shall call the meeting to order and ask for a nomination for President pro tem., such officer to be chosen from the Board of Directors.
10. The Recording Secretary shall make correct records of all meetings of the Club and Execuitve Board, and shall be prepared to report at each regular meeting. She shall see that ballots are furnished for elections, and shall make a written report of the transactions of the Club at the last business meeting.
11. The Corresponding Secretary shall keep a roll of the members with full names and addresses, a copy of which, to January 1st of each year, she shall furnish to the Nominating Committee at the regular business meeting in each January; she shall give notice of the meetings, conduct the correspondence of the Club, preserve all Club papers, keep a record of all applications for membership, and shall notify candidates of their election, enclosing a copy of the Constitution and By-Laws. She shall make a written report at the last business meeting of the Club.
12. The Recording and Corresponding Secretaries shall make up and issue the year-book, submitting it to the President for approval, and have it ready for distribution by first meeting in October.
13. The Treasurer shall collect all dues, hold and pay out all Club moneys. She shall be Chairman of the Finance Committee. She shall issue all membership tickets, and serve notice on all delinquents at the proper time. She shall make a statement of her accounts at each regular meeting of the Club, and at the last business meeting shall render a written report properly audited.
14. The Auditor shall examine the books of the Treasurer and report on them annually, and shall audit the books of the House Secretary monthly.
15. The Chairman of each department shall appoint a Vice-Chairman and Secretary and announce such appointments at the June meeting. The Secretary shall act as Press Reporter for the department. The

Secretary must keep a roll of the members of the department, and must furnish the Nominating Committee with a list of the members of her department upon application. The Secretary of each department shall keep in permanent form a record of the work done by her department, such record to be kept for the archives of the Club.
16. Each department shall be responsible for three or four presentations to the entire Club of the work in its charge. Each department shall also hold such other meetings from time to time, and form such plans as the interest under its charge demand.
17. Departments shall be permitted to hold courses of instruction or separate meetings open to the general public, provided that permission be received from the Board of Directors, and that such meetings be of no expense to the Club at large.
18. Each member shall be expected, upon the payment of dues to indicate in writing the department or departmęnts of the Club with which she wishes to be identified.
19. All chairmen of departments shall present yearly reports of the work at the last business meeting of the year, and said reports shall be filed in the archives of the Club.
20. No member shall be eligible to more than one departmental office at the same time, and no member may hold any position in a department for more than two consecutive years.
21. The Finance Committee shall consist of three members, the Club Treasurer serving as Chairman, the Chairman of Ways and Means Committee, and the other member appointed by the President. This committee shall have entire management of the Club's finances, the borrowing and lending of money, the payment of all bills, interest and bonds.
22. All requests for money or appropriations shall be made to this committee, and by it presented to the Club for action. This committee shall have

charge of the special funds, but the expenditure of these funds must be passed upon by the Club.
23. It shall be the duty of the Committee on Ways and Means to devise ways and means, further than the dues of the Club, for supplying funds to promote the work undertaken by the Club.
24. The Social Committee shall plan and be responsible for all social functions given by the Club.
25. The House Committee shall have entire supervision of the Club building and grounds, and shall outline the duties of the House Secretary and formulate rules governing the apartments and lower floor.
26. No bills shall be made for current expenses except by the House Secretary, and said bills approved by House Committee. All such bills shall be settled by the House Secretary, and net proceeds turned over to the Treasurer. Her other duties shall be prescribed by the House Committee.
27. Delegates to the State Federation shall represent the various departments of the Club as far as practicable.
28. Mrs. Fox's book on Parliamentary Usage for Women's Clubs shall be the authority for the conduct of all meetings of the Club.
29. These By-Laws may be amended at any business meeting of the Club by a two-thirds vote, notice of the proposed amendment having been given at the previous meeting.
30. These By-Laws may be amended at any business meeting by a unanimous vote.
