The funeral will be at his late residence Saturday at twelve thirty o'clock after which Old Colony Lodge F. & A. M. of which he was a member will take the body to the First Unitarian church at Hingham.

PERSONAL MENTION.

HORSE HISTORY.

FOR PUZZLED HOUSEKEEPERS.

Sharpen all kinds of fish knives with lemon juice.

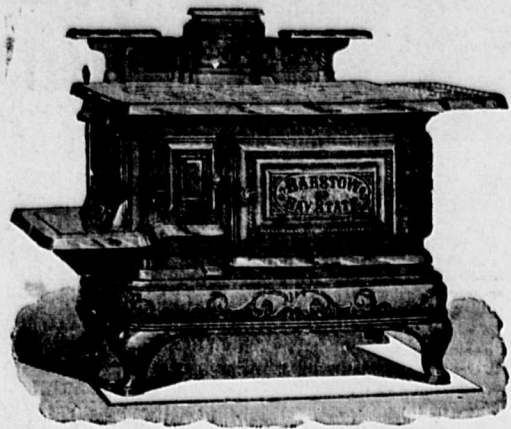

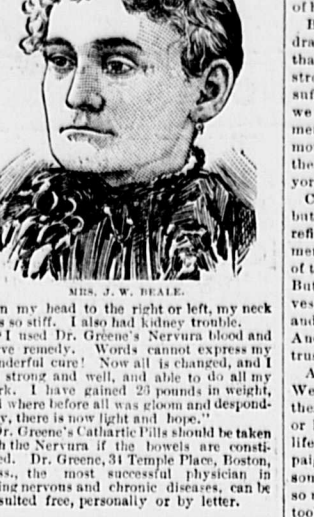
