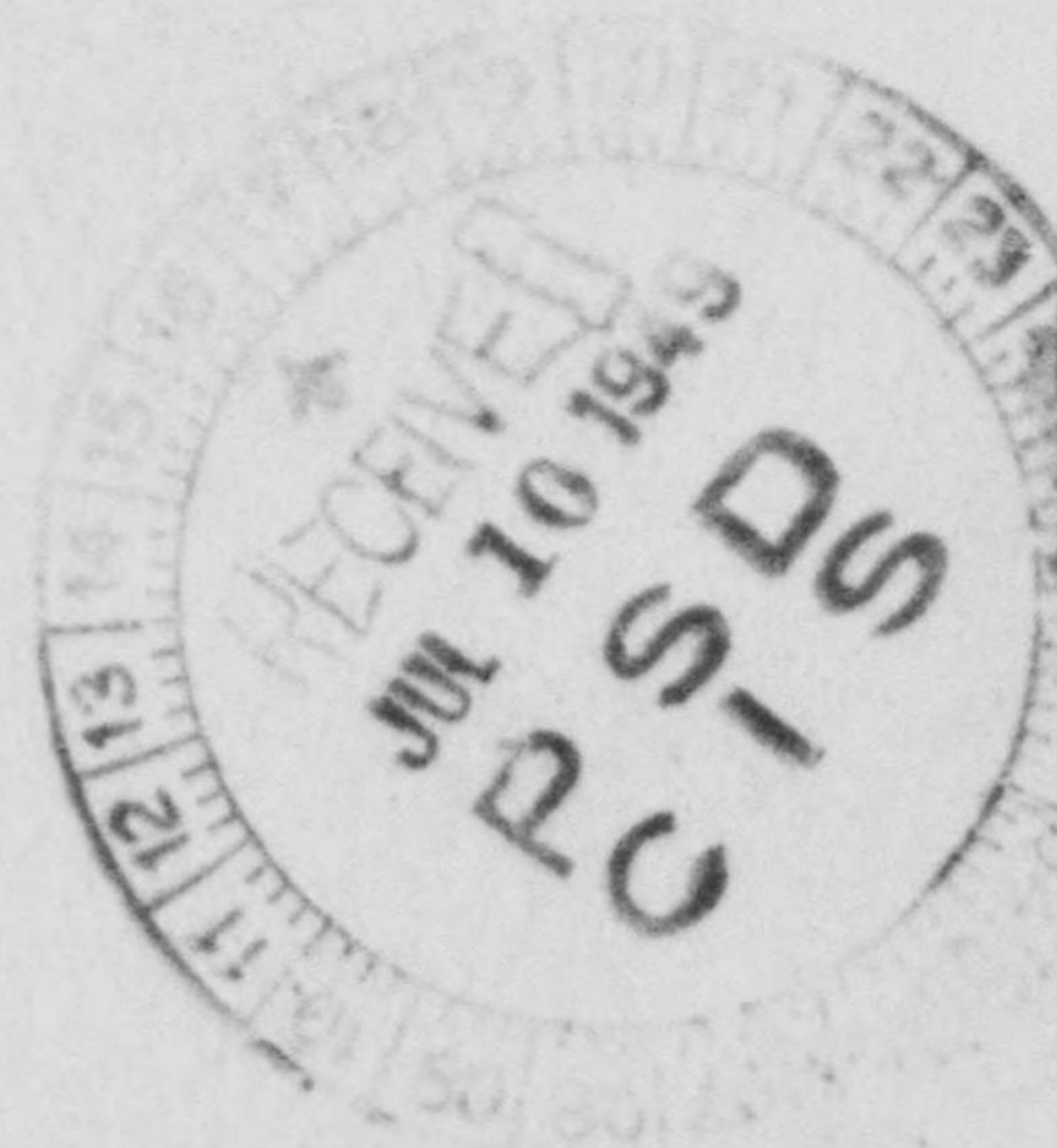
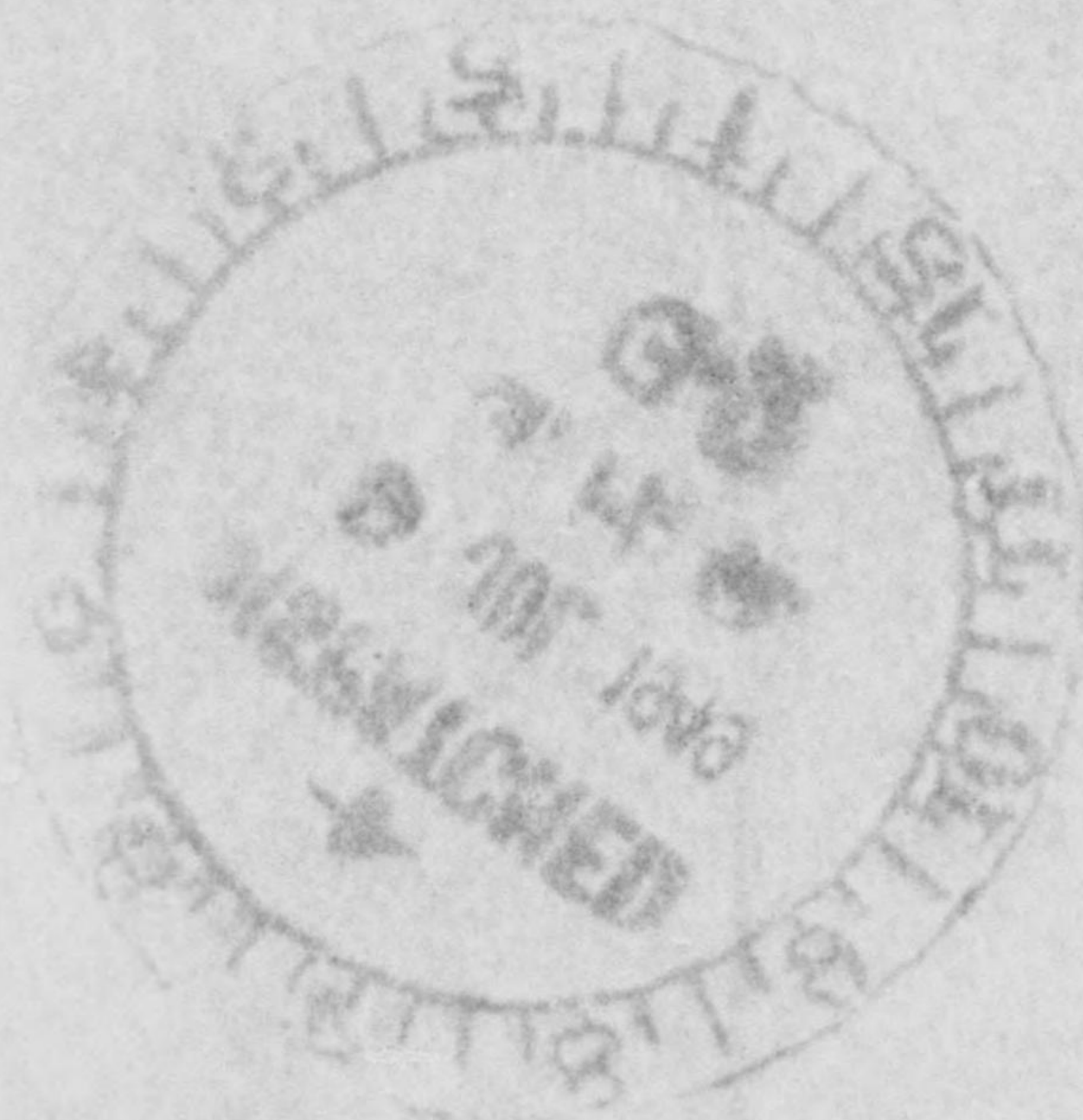

1. The handling of Classification Summary 1778 has indicated:
    - a. Chief, PSD or Executive Group were not informed.
    - b. Prison Branch personnel were not informed of approval by you and implementation by Japanese Government.
    - c. Prison Branch personnel became aware of lb, above, only through field surveillance.
    - d. Unilateral action in principle does not conform to established PSD or SCAP policies.
    - e. Merits of Classification Summary 1778 are beyond question.
  2. Ability to handle men -- work together, esprit and morale in the Prison Branch continues to be the lowest in the Division, i.e.:
    - a. Inability to foster and maintain a harmonious Prison Branch team.
    - b. Lack of decisive and understandable courses of action and responsibility given to subordinates.
    - c. Initiative on the part of Branch personnel deviating the slightest from your preconceived, but not definitized, scope of their activity is immediately curbed.

d. Recent memo re Mr. White points toward the beginning of another McCorkle-Fitzgibbon fiasco.

3. Conditions as outlined in pars 1 and 2 above, are undesirable and fail to enhance the best interests of the Prison Branch and of the Occupation. Loyalty, understanding and morale go hand-in-hand and operate two ways, up and down. I have confidence in your ability and desire to get the job done but, you in turn must inspire and have confidence in subordinates. It is my upmost desire to be fair, just and tolerant in all matters, but I believe it is better to have a mediocre team, with high morale and team play, than to have a team with a few stars not "pulling together." And not "pulling together" has been a Prison Branch trend since late 1946.

4. In event the above conditions are beyond your ability to rectify or desire to work toward the ultimate and harmonious accomplishment thereof, the only alternative left to me, which I do not desire to do, is the assignment of a new Prison Branch Chief.

Upon reaching my office this morning, after unlocking the door myself, I at once found that my brief case, with its contents of private papers and a book, "Toynbee's: "Civilization On Trial", privately owned was missing. Immediate inquiry of the Duty Officer revealed that he had not picked it up. Search of all desks and my safe failed to reveal its whereabouts. Administrative Officer made inquiry of the Building Security forces, and the cleaners, who state that they have no knowledge of the matter.

With the exception of one letter and a tentative unsigned reply, which was being held pending a proper time for submitting this private matter for clearance, and a formal letter, in French from the former Chief of the Iranian Delegation to the first London Conference of UNESCO, all papers are copies of private memos, the originals of which are in storage in the States, and are replaceable.

As I had cleared the bag, this morning, of any official papers, either Japanese, or Occupation, this morning, it is fortunate indeed. For while no classified matter is ever carried by me in my bag, I have been careful to keep the brief case, as a matter of habit under firm control.

A new unused bank<sup>check</sup> book was inside as was a book of addresses which is valuable to me.

I had put the bag away in the filing case before leaving for Radio Tokyo meeting at 1435, but decided to bring it back near my desk where I would not miss it upon return from the meeting before closing time. As the meeting closed at 1645, and there was no time to come back to the office, with some qualms about the brief case, I walked to the Teikoku corner for the Wash Heights Bus, and went home, in private car instead which kindly picked me up at that corner at 1710.

I would like leave for the period 10 April - 17 April, '48 and permission to travel for myself and two dependents by rail to Kyoto by way of Nagoya and Mie leaving Tokyo on Saturday Morning, 10 April '48 by day train, stopping at a rest hotel at Nagoya over night of the tenth, proceeding to Mie on the 11th, stopping that night at a rest hotel, and continuing on to Kyoto for the night of the 12th through the 17th April with two rooms for myself and wife, and grown daughter, respectively.

Since we are to travel by day it should not be so difficult to arrange train accommodation. The rest hotels for the one night at Nagoya and our getting to Kyoto on Monday night, 12th April, '48 should be easier to arrange after the week-end rush is over at the Kyoto Hotel.

Anything you may do to arrange the matter for us will be much appreciated by all concerned. If we cannot get the schedule as requested we, of course, will fit into any arrangement which may be made for us.

1. At 1241 hours, 22 Nov 47, Dr. Lewis, Duty Officer, PSD, was seen in the seventh floor latrine by Pfc. Letaw, Chief Clerk. Knowing that Dr. Lewis was Duty Officer, Pfc. Letaw immediately proceeded to the eighth floor to check on whether or not the C. Q. was on duty.

2. When Pfc. Letaw arrived at the eighth floor, he found that the office was void of military personnel and the following security violations were noted:

a. The administrative office was left unlocked and unattended as the C. Q. was on duty on the fourth floor and the Duty Officer had left the office for personal reasons.

b. The combination safe in Message Center was left unlocked and open; the Duty Officer's field safe was left unlocked and open.

c. Almost a complete set of keys to the PSD offices was left on the Administrative Officer's desk, providing easy access to all offices and to the security room. In the Administrative Officer's desk is a key providing access to a safe containing other secret, confidential, and restricted reports. The keys to the central files were also available.

d. At this time there were two Japanese nationals at work in the eighth floor corridor.

3. Dr. Lewis returned to the administrative office at 1245 hours, after an absence of at least four minutes, plus the time required for him to go from the administrative office to the seventh floor latrine.

4. These four minutes or more would have provided ample time for either of the Japanese nationals working on the eighth floor to take various keys which would have provided access to the security room and other offices. They would also have had time to steal classified papers, the disclosure of which might seriously hamper the Public Safety Division program.
