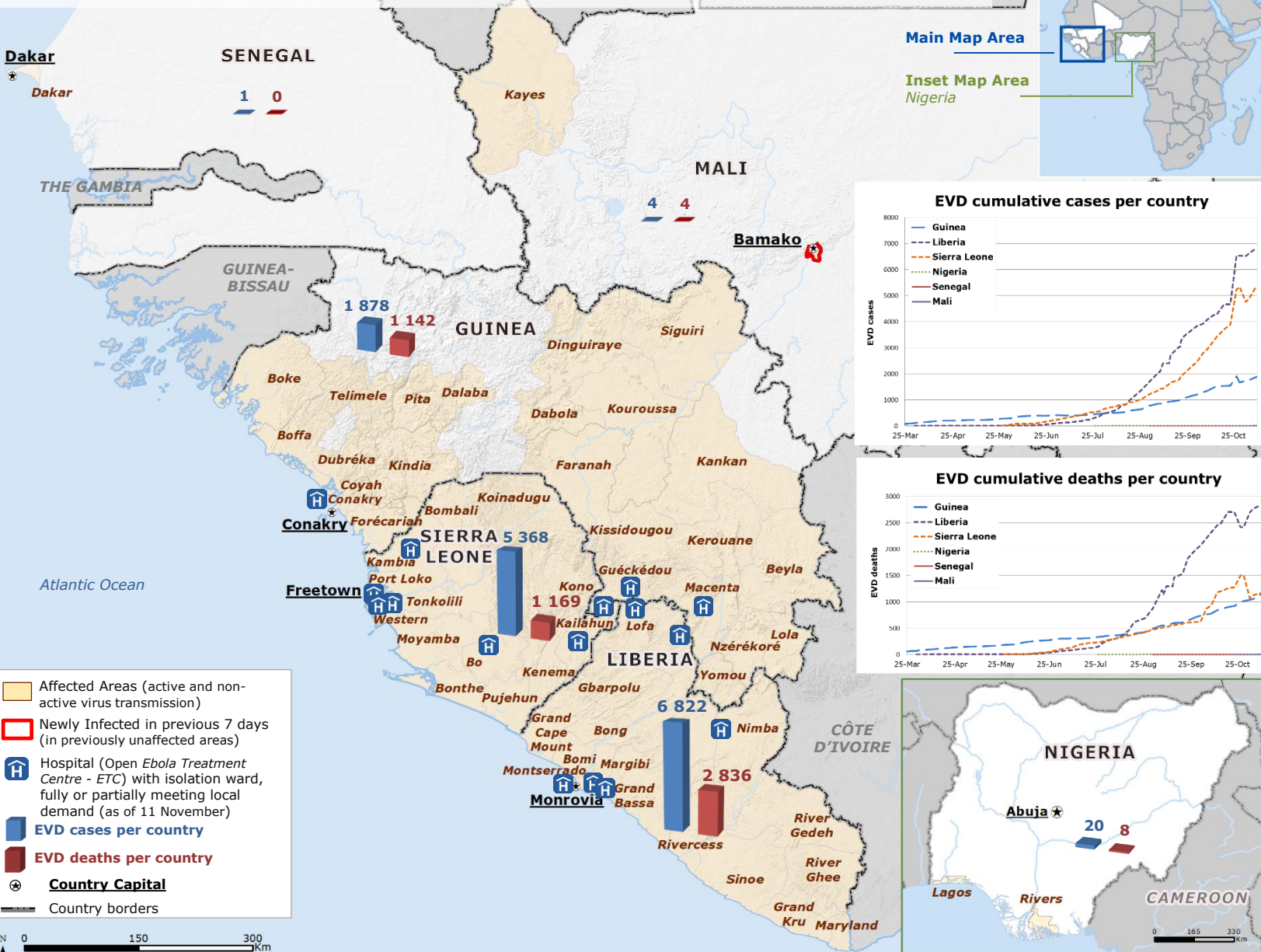


14 November 2014: West Africa - Ebola Virus Disease (EVD)

SITUATION

- According to the latest WHO Situation Report (as of 12 November), 5 160 deaths from EVD have been reported, including in Spain (one case confirmed) and the US (four cases confirmed and one dead).
- The general situation continues to worsen, affecting the economies as well as the public order of the countries, according to the World Health Organisation (WHO).
- There is some evidence that the number of new cases per week is no longer increasing in Guinea and Liberia.
- Four cases and four deaths have been reported from Mali. The new cases are unrelated to the first EVD-positive patient who died in Kayes, Mali, on 24 October.
- As of 13 Nov 2014, the European Union (EU Commission and Member States) pledged for more than EUR 1 billion to help fight the epidemic.
- EU humanitarian experts were deployed in the region for situation monitoring and liaising with partners and local authorities.
- The EU Civil Protection Mechanism (CPM) was activated to facilitate and support the rapid deployment of material assistance and experts to the region.
