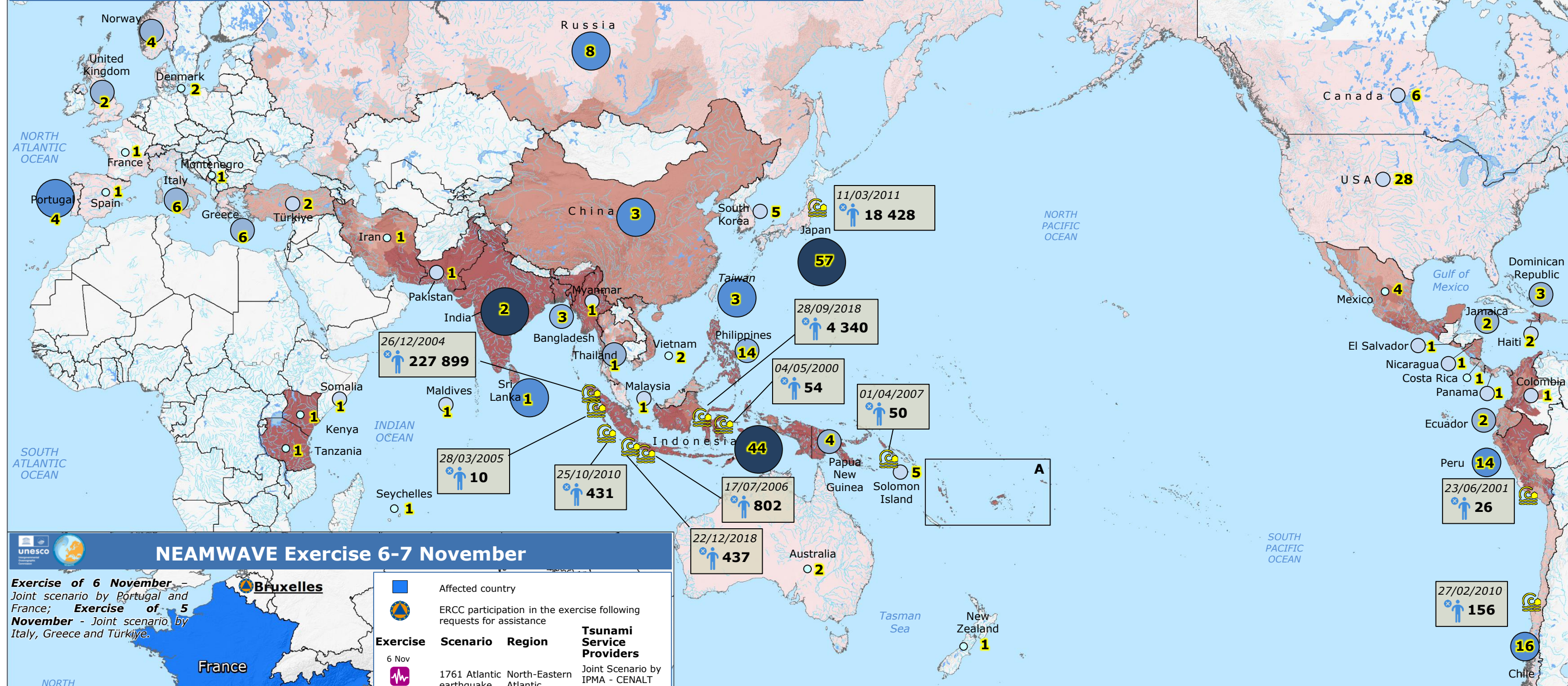


Tsunami Awareness
